

The evidence for the crown showed that P. C. Wallace proceeded the continuous awarrant to search 54. Elizabeth-street for liquor, and that they proceeded to execute this warrant on Sunday, Aug. 14, at 1 a. m. P. C. Wallace proceeded through the different rooms, although Lyons protested, especially when he went to enter a bedroom where three or four small children were sleeping. The officer found in this room two bottles of beer. Mrs. Lyons grabbed one and struck the other in the officer's hand, breaking it. Lyons said, "Ill stop this," and ran into another room for a revolver. He returned with the weapon and aimed it at the officer. He was immediately placed under arrest, and it was found that the cartridge had been dented as though the prisoner had tried to discharge it. Mr. DuVernet contended that a law intended to raise revenue could not be enforced with the rigor of criminal law. The Liquor License Act had a penalty for any obstruction offered to the officer; but the offence was not indictable. He held that the warrant was irregular in that it was signed by an officer other than Col. Denison, so that the officers were trespassing and that at their peril. 
