

HENRY S. SAUNDERS

made his debut as a Violoncello Soloist in 1882, playing a Romance by G. Goltermann. Since that time he has been constantly adding to his repertory, which now includes a large number of the best works written for the instrument. Some of these are here appended:-

After a very successful tour in Canada (Nov.-Dec. 1899), Mr. R. Watkin Mills, the eminent English basso, expresses himself as follows, in regard to Mr. Saunders' Work.

LONDON, ONT., Jan. 1st, 1900.

Dear Mr. Saunders:

Before leaving for England I should like to tell you how much I have enjoyed your refined and most artistic 'cello playing throughout my Ca. .dian Tour, and how gratified I have been to know that your efforts were so much appreciated in every town in which we have appeared by the large and enthusiastic audiences that have greeted us. I trust we may again be associated in like manner.

Wishing you continued success and a bright and prosperous New Year. Believe me, very truly yours,

R. WATKIN MILLS.

Ottawa Evening Journal, December 28, 1899:

[&]quot;Mr. Henry S. Saunders, violoncellist, was the assisting artist. His tone is pure, and his playing is manly and direct in style, free from that painful exaggeration of the vibrato which is so common, and from such mannerisms as the swaying of the body, rolling of the eyes, and so forth, on which—with the addition of long hair—the average violoncellist depends for much of his effect."

RECENT PRESS NOTICES.

The Ottawa Citizen, November 8, 1899:

"Not for some time have the music-lovers of Ottawa been treated to a more inspiriting and satisfying recital than was offered by Mr. Henry S. Saunders, the violoncellist, at Orme's hall yesterday afternoon. Mr. Saunders played eight numbers, with rare skill, his interpretation in each instance being marked by refinement of conception, smoothness of execution and superb beauty of tone."

"Watkin Mills is a host in himself, but he is assisted in these recitals by Mr. Henry S. Saunders, violoncellist, whose reception last night was scarcely less enthusiastic than that of the great artist himself. "Mr. Henry S. Saunders is a violoncellist well equipped both in technique and temperament. His numbers included a 'Romance,' by Mr. W. H. Hewlett, of London, which proved a graceful and harmonious composition."

Ottawa Free Press, November 11, 1899:

"The violoncello recital given on Tuesday afternoon by Mr. Henry S. Saunders, under the auspices of the Ottawa Conservatory of Music, was quite an exceptional event. Though the recitel was not planned until the morning previous, the interest attracted by it was sufficient to bring together on a few hours' notice an audience that filled the hall and included very many of the leading patrons of musical art in Ottawa. Mr. Saunders played eight compositions in varied styles, showing himself to be an executant of unusual ability and an artist whose conception of nusic is both poetical and manly. The hearty and unstinted applause of the audience gave evidence of their keen enjoyment of the recital throughout."

St. John N.B. Globe, November 17, 1899:

"Of the 'cellist, Mr. Saunders, nothing but praise was heard, and Poppers' 'Spinning Song,' with its executive enormities, brought down the house."

St. John N.B. Daily Sun, November 17, 1899:

"Mr. Mills was ably assisted by Henry Saunders, whose superb manipulation of the 'cello delighted the audience, who insisted upon encores at his every appearance."

The Quebec Daily Telegraph, November 23, 1899:

"Mr. Henry S. Saunders contributed an instrumental treat by his solos on the violoncello, of which he has so full and perfect a mastery that his performance on it might almost be said to be a vocal one. He is a very clever artist, and one of whom the Dominion may be justly proud."

Ottawa Daily Free Press, November 8, 1899:

"Mr. Saunders' playing of the 'cello was marked by expression and feeling. The fortissimo passages, while having the full volume were entirely devoid of harshness or twang, while the softer measures were sweet and firm."

The Montreal Daily Witness, November 24, 1899:

"The first number on the programme was a 'cello solo, 'Hungarian Dance,' played by Mr. Henry S. Saunders, a most accomplished musician. In this and subsequent numbers his playing gave great pleasure, and was a decided gain to the evening's entertainment."

"Mr. R. Watkin Mills was assisted by Mr. Henry S. Saunders, a solo violon-cellist of sterling ability, with a good round tone and excellent technique."

"Henry S. Saunders, violoncellist, made a popular debut here, being encored twice. His technique was good and he added to a thorough knowledge of the instrument, deep feeling and expression."
