MOTHER AND YOUNG SON SUFFOCATED BY COAL GAS

Robert Martin Held by Police Because of Suspicious Delay in Notifying Authorities.

HAMILTON, Ont., Feb. 14.—(Special.)—Robert Martin is occupying a cot at the City Hospital and is being watched by the police until the authorities make a full investigation into the death of his wife and children.

RECENT ARCHAEOLOGICAL PROGRESS MADE IN ROME

Interesting Lecture by Dr. Wilson of Baltimore Given Before Toronto Audience.

Dr. Henry Langford Wilson, professor of Roman Archaeology and Epigraphy in the Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, gave an illustrated lecture yesterday afternoon before a large and interested audience at the University of Toronto.

The lecturer, who spent last year in Italy as professor of the American School of Classical Studies in Rome, chose as his subject, "Recent Archaeological Progress in Rome," and used as illustrations many pictures taken by himself.

Then the latest changes in the Roman forum were pointed out and some account given of the reconstruction of this most interesting spot in Rome were shown on the screen.

After referring to some minor discoveries, particularly the removal of the exact site of the Temple of Jupiter, the lecturer referred to the discovery of a Greek statue of a wounded daughter of Niobe was particularly admired.
