ANNUAL MEETING.

ONTARIO HALL,
KINGSTON, JAN'Y 16TH, 1889. }

The Annual Meeting of the congregation was held at eight o'clock, Rev. Mr. Mackie was in the chair and opened the meeting with prayer.

Mr. T. D. Minnes was appointed Secretary.

The Session Report was read by Mr. Mackie.

The Manager's Report, read by Mr. Craig.

The Supplementary Revenue Report, read by Mr. Craig.

The Women's Home Association Report, read by Mrs. McIntyre.

The Sabbath School Reports, read by Mr. W. T. Minnes.

The Building Fund Report, read by Dr. Williamson.

The Organ Fund Report, read by Mr. Craig.

The above reports were duly received and adopted.

Votes of thanks were tendered to the Managers, Choir and Women's Home Association for their services during the year.

On motion, the four retiring Managers, Messrs. Gibson, Harold, Carrol and Clark were re-elected.

It was decided that on the first Sunday in May a special collection should be taken up for the funds of the Sunday School, and also that the Annual Reports which had not been printed for two years, should now be printed with the report for the past year.

It was moved by Mr. John McIntyre, seconded by Dr. Williamson, and resolved,

That full authority be given, so far as the congregation of St. Andrew's Church can give authority, to the Building Committee to raise money by the mortgage of the church property or the issue of bonds for the completion of the new church, subject of course to the approval of the Presbytery.

That the Trustees and the Presbytery be requested to grant such approval to mortgage or to issue bonds.

The Benediction was pronounced and the meeting adjourned.

KIRK-SESSION REPORT.

The Kirk Session have much pleasure in reporting that throughout the year now closed, there has been every sign that the spiritual life of the congregation is deepening and the true prosperity of the church advancing. This has been specially the case during the latter part of the year.

The destruction of St. Andrew's and the inconvenient distance of Ontario Hall from very many of the congregation have, instead of lossening or separating connection, only drawn the congregation more closely, invigorated and greatly increased it.

There has been a large addition of families during the year, raising the number from about 200 to close upon 300. There is every reason to believe that there has been a great increase of individual adherents, but it is not easy to ascertain the exact number of these.

Death as usual entered into the fold more than once. Six communicants, exemplary in their lives, loving their church and helping it as they could, esteemed by all, in the full assurance of a blessed immortality through Jesus Christ, yielded up the ghost. They were Mr. John Arnold, Mr. John Dodds, Mr. John Strachan, Mrs. John Gray, Miss Gray, and Miss Macdonald. Five communicants have removed from the city, and six have seceded from the congregation. This makes a *decrease of seventeen*.

On the other hand twenty-seven have been added to the church on profession of faith, and twenty have been received by certificate. This makes an *increase of forty-seven*.

The Communion Roll now numbers 367.

The Sacrament of Baptism was administered to 24 children. There were 14 marriages and 18 deaths including the 6 already mentioned.

Now we behold the seed time: the harvest will be by and by.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS.

ONTARIO HALL, 16TH JAN'Y, 1889.

The Managers have great pleasure in submitting the usual annual financial statement and report. The various schemes all show an encouraging state of affairs. For the first time in many years all the liabilities of the congregation have been paid.

The year under consideration has been an eventful one to the congregation. On Sunday, the 8th of April last, the old church, endeared to all members and adherents by many ties, was destroyed by fire. A reference to the report from the Building Committee will show what has been done towards the erection of a new and beautiful church, to be completed by October next.

Notwithstanding the inconvenience of worshipping in old St. Andrew's Hall for a time, and the temporary absence of our Pastor, the ordinary revenue has been equal to former years and the special collections have considerably increased.

We are fairly comfortable worshipping in Ontario Hall, and the large and increasing numbers attending Divine service is very encouraging to all interested in the welfare of the congregation, but it is not our home. We look forward with great expectations to occupying new St. Andrew's, and feel confident that although our current expenses may be increased the revenue also will be more largely increased, and it is reasonable to hope that not only the revenue but all the schemes of the church will flourish exceedingly.

The plate collections have steadily increased during the last three months, and there is renewed animation in all the different branches of congregational work, and if these things exist under our present adverse circumstances surely there is a glorious future for St. Andrew's in her new edifice with more perfect appliances.

For the comfort of strangers in particular and the congregation in general your Board of Managers has appointed a Reception Committee to receive those who attend at Divine worship and invite them

REPORT OF BUILDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with a resolution of the congregation adopting the plans prepared by Messrs. Power & Son, for the new Church, the Building Committee advertised for tenders, and accepted the tender of Mr. George Wilson of Gananoque, for the sum of \$24,800. There will be some additions to this amount before the building is finally completed.

The canvas of the congregation for subscriptions so far has resulted in \$10,600 being subscribed, and payments received to 31st Dec., amount to \$2744.50, as per statement. Considerable progress has been made with the new church, but for the present work has ceased. A first payment of \$5000 has been paid to the contractor. To meet this payment, the sum of \$2500 of the insurance money has been appropriated. A second estimate of \$2000 is now due.

The Committee is desirous of holding as much as possible of the insurance money in reserve, which is bearing interest. They would, therefore, urgently call upon the congregation for further subscriptions and payments, so that our obligations to the contractor may be promptly met. As the subscriptions are spread over a period of years it will be necessary to provide money for the final payment of the contractor. Authority should be given to the Building Committee to raise the amount required, and in order to get the most favourable terms it should be by way of mortgage on church property, with the consent of the Presbytery.

The list of Librarians too has been broken, and our old helpers scattered far and wide. W. Irving has gone to California, John Cochrane to Victoria, B.C., F. Patterson to Winnipeg, Jas. Pollie, who was Asst. Sec'y, has removed to Peterboro, and D. Thompson to Chicago. We hope they may be successful in their new fields of labour.

SUPPLEMENTARY REVENUE.

Herewith is submitted a detailed statement of receipts and expenses of this Fund. The net amount received for the nine months ending 31st ult., and which has been transferred to ordinary revenue account, is \$117.63. There are only 92 subscribers, 52 of whom do not appear on the ordinary revenue list. This scheme has not realized our expectations, chiefly owing to the fact that so few interested themselves in it. The circumstances connected with the inauguration of this scheme have been unfavorable. We had barely started the subscription list when the church fire occurred and destroyed all our envelopes. These took a long time to replace, and caused considerable expense, and the summer season was upon us, when many leave the city, before we were ready to solicit subscriptions and explain the work and object of the scheme. But sufficient experience has been gained to convince us that it can be successfully worked, and through it a large additional revenue raised. If 400 will subscribe to pay 5c. per Sabbath for one year the result will be \$1040.00, and there should be no difficulty in getting this number in St. Andrew's for so small a sum per Sabbath. It is understood of course that this scheme must not interfere, in any way, with any other plan for raising money now in force. We commend this scheme to the congregation, and believe it will not only largely increase the general receipts of the church but will give an opportunity to every one to contribute, because of the small amount asked, and every one should be willing to give something.

The Numbers blank, and without an amount, indicate that no envelopes have been returned by those who took them; the Numbers blank, with amounts, are from those who have not given in their names.
