## RULES AS AMENDED, 1870.

I. The Association shall consist of all persons paying two dollars per annum, or a donation of twenty dollars, to the Provincial Rifle Association.

II. Any county Regiment (Reserve Militia,) subscribing not less than twenty dollars, annually, to the funds of the Provincial Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connexion with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships of Non-commissioned Officers and Men in the proportion of one to every one dollar and sixty-seven cents thus subscribed.

III. Volunteer or active militia Companies whose effective strength is over 60, paying to the Association ten dollars, per annum, shall be entitled to send six members to the prize match, and if their effective strength is under 60, they shall be entitled to send five members, on paying eight dollars. No Officer in the active militia not being a subscriber to the Association will be allowed to compete.

IV. All subscriptions from county Regiments shall be paid through the Commanding Officer of their respective regiments.

V. The affairs of the Association shall be under the control of a Council, consisting *ex officio* of the Secretary and Treasurer for the time being, and also of not less than Fifteen Members nor more than Twenty, fifteen of whom shall be elected annually by ballot at the general meeting, and five subsequently by the Council—five to form a quorum.

VI. The Annual Meeting of the Members of the Association for the election of a Council and other matters, shall be held ~~within three months~~ in each year, at such time and place as the President and Council may deem most suitable.

VII. The Council shall meet ~~quarterly~~ or oftener, <sup>as</sup> ~~if~~ required by any two of its members, and keep minutes of its proceedings. It shall have power to elect new members, to fill up any vacancy in the Council, and to appoint the Treasurer and Secretary, and shall be regulated in ~~their~~ proceedings by such rules or bye-laws as may from time to time be enacted by ~~them~~ for the regulation of all matters committed to its charge, ~~subject to the approval of the Commander-in-Chief on all subjects of a purely military character.~~

VIII. There shall be a Patron and Vice Patrons, named by the Council.

1.P. IX. The Council shall choose from the members elected, a President who shall be President of the Association. v.v

X. There shall be Vice-Presidents. The Senior Militia Officers of Counties (not being unattached), who are subscribers, shall be ex officio Vice-Presidents. Should the Senior Officer not be a subscriber, the next in rank, being a subscriber shall fill the office.

XI. The prizes of the Association shall be open to the Local Forces of the Province of Nova Scotia (being subscribers,) on such terms, and at such times and places as may be fixed by the Council.

XII. All competitors ~~for prizes~~ (except for the all-comers' prize) shall be required to appear in the uniform of their respective corps, and shall be certified by their Commanding Officers to be efficient in Manual and Platoon and such other military exercises as may be ordered by the Commander-in-Chief.


XIII. Any County Rifle Association subscribing five dollars annually to the funds of the Provincial Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connexion with it, and shall be entitled to have a concise account of its annual match published with the "Proceedings" of this Association.

XIV. All subscriptions from County Rifle Associations shall be paid through the Presidents of their respective Associations.

XV. The President of any County Rifle Association in connexion with the Provincial Rifle Association, and being a member thereof, shall be ex officio a member of Council.

## BYE-LAWS.

1. An Umpire shall be appointed by the Council. All disputed points shall be decided by the Umpire, whose decision shall be final.
- ✓ 2. An Officer shall be appointed to take command of all who may assemble to compete for the prizes, and maintain order and discipline on the field.
- ✓ 3. The targets shall be the same as laid down in the Army Musketry Regulations, or such as are used at ~~Wimbledon~~, at the discretion of the Council. Bull's Eye to count 4. Centres 3. Outers 2.
4. Ties shall be decided by the highest score in marks obtained at the longest range in the competition; if still a tie, then by the greatest number of hits at the same range; if still a tie, then by the application of the same rule to the next longest range, and so on with any other range in the competition; if still a tie, then by the value of single shots, counting inversely from the last, and if still a tie, then to be decided by single shots at the longest range in the competition.
- ✓ 5. None but Government ammunition, supplied on the ground by the Association, shall be used (except at the all-comers competition). "any milia"
- ✓ 6. Any competitor discharging his rifle without having previously obtained permission from the Officer in command of the field, or of the Squad Commander, shall be fined two dollars.
- ✓ 7. The squads shall be formed as directed by the officer in command of the field, and competitors once placed in a squad will not be allowed to change it throughout the meeting without the permission of the Range Officer.
- ✓ 8. ~~Volunteers and Militia allowed to compete in full or undress uniform. Cap covers with peaks allowed.~~
- ✓ 9. Any competitor not complying with the Rules, Bye-Laws, or Field Regulations, shall be disqualified from competing for any prize during the match.



## R E P O R T.

---

IN consequence of the delay in the payment of the usual Grant by the Militia Department, your Council were unable to fix the day for the Annual Match until a very short time before it took place, but notwithstanding the limited notice, the number of competitors has increased, and it will be found on reference to the Secretary's abstract that the total averages in all the competitions are higher this year than they have ever been before.

His Excellency the Governor General has kindly presented another Silver Cup to the Association which was won by Private J. Larkin, H. B. R.; and Lieut.-Gen. Sir W. F. Williams has again for the fifth time given for competition a gold watch and chain, of which Corporal John Corbin H. B. R. was the winner after a very close contest, the six highest competitors having obtained thirty-six marks each out of a possible score of forty.

The Association is this year indebted to Messrs. J. & T. J. Egan and Messrs. Clemen Bros. of Halifax, for some handsome presents which were given as extra prizes, and it is to be hoped that others will follow their example and thereby encourage the Active Militia in attaining greater proficiency in the use of the rifle.

The thanks of the Association are again due to the Officer commanding Her Majesty's troops for the use of the necessary tents, and the services of Ensign Lepperd of the 84th Regiment, with a sufficient number of non-commissioned officers and men to act as markers and Register keepers; and the Council have much pleasure in stating that at no previous meeting of the Association was the marking better, or the regulations more faithfully and satisfactorily carried out.

The Association is also indebted to Surgeon T. R. Almon who attended gratuitously as Medical Officer during the Match.

The Treasurer's account is herewith submitted shewing a balance of \$270.20 in favor of the Association; all outstanding claims as far as can be ascertained have been paid except the cost of the new Challenge Medal which has not yet been completed.

The meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association having been held this year at Fredericton N. B., a number of the Active Militia of this Province were enabled to attend, and this Association was represented by nearly sixty members, who gained prizes to the amount of about seven hundred dollars, besides eleven first class and seven second class badges. The third prize in the affiliated Rifle Association match was allotted and paid over to this Association, but a memorandum was afterwards received from the Statistical Officer than an error had been made in paying it, and on receiving a certificate from him and the Secretary that the prize was really won by the Brockville Association, the money was returned.

This Association will also be pleased to learn that the Council of the Dominion Association have decided to hold their next annual competition at Bedford in this Province, and also that, except in one match especially for small bores, the competitions will be confined to the regulation rifles.

 Ranges 300, 400 and 600 yards. Five rounds at each Range. Highest possible Score 60 marks. Any Competitor not scoring 8 at the first range to be disqualified. The Cup to be the property of the party winning it three times, but not necessarily consecutively. It is not won in ten years, it shall then be competed for by parties who have won it twice. If only one shall at that time have so won it, the Competition to continue until another has won it twice, when the two shall compete finally, and it shall then become the property of the winner. Open to members of the Association and Militia Officers, and Volunteers of Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward Island, certified by their Commanding Officers to be efficient in the manual and platoon exercise, and to appear in the uniform of their respective Corps.

#### TARGETS—

- At 200 and 300 yards, 6 feet x 4 feet. Bull's eyes 8 inches. Centres 2 feet.
- At 400, 500 and 600 yards, 6 feet square. Bull's eyes 2 feet. Centres 4 feet.
- At 700 and 800 yards, 6 feet x 12 feet wide. Bull's eyes 3 feet. Centres 6 feet.
- Square Bull's eyes and Centres at all distances.

#### POSITION—

- At 200 yards, from the shoulder. Any position at all other distances, provided no part of the Rifle or Forearm touch the ground. No artificial rest.

#### AMMUNITION—

- Government, except in All-Comers' and Time Matches.

#### RIFLES—

- Snider Enfield, (except in All-Comers' and Time Matches.) Government Pattern.
