The House met on Friday at three and, on motion of Hon. Mr. Tweedie, seconded by Mr. Hazon, it adjourned until half past four on Saturday to the memory of Hon. Senator Gilmer of Charlotte county, whose funeral was taking place that afternoon at St. Andrew.

The House resumed business at 4.30. Hon. Mr. Tweedie presented the petition of Philip Cox and others to amend the act to incorporate the Miramichi Natural History Association.

Mr. Johnson presented the petition of Urban Johnson and others for an amendment to the liquor license act of 1890.

Mr. Hazon introduced a bill respecting the law of landlord and tenant. He explained that it was intended to avoid a difficulty arising out of distress for rent. Now a landlord can seize the goods of a tenant and sell them to satisfy the debt. The bill will provide that where goods are seized the landlord may make a declaration that the goods are his and tender the amount he owes the tenant, if anything, to the landlord, upon which his goods will be released.

Mr. McLatchey presented the petition of George Haddon and others for the incorporation of D. Haddon for water, fire, sewerage, light and police purposes.

Mr. Hazon introduced a bill to exempt the Aiton mill near Redbank, South E. K., from taxation.

The Hon. Mr. Dunn in reply to Mr. Hazon said that in answer to the petition of the fishery board for the sale of fishing rights in that the experience which the department had during the past year, when it was not leased, was not satisfactory.

The total number of persons who fished upon the river last season was 24, and the total revenue derived was \$188, less expenses of \$16.50, or a net sum of \$171.50. The amount paid by the province for protection was \$272, thus making a net loss to the province of \$90.50. If to this is added the amount of rental at present price at which the government is offering it of \$1,000, which is considerably more than the amount of revenue it would make an annual loss of revenue to the province of at least \$1,000.

In answer to the last portion of the question, as to whether the government is of opinion that all the fishing rights in the province shall be leased for terms of years to the exclusion of citizens of the province and tourists who are willing to pay moderate fees for their enjoyment, the question is one of considerable difficulty, and the government has not arrived at a final conclusion with regard to it. A great many of the rivers in the province are leased to citizens of the province and a large number of fishing rights have been left open because the government has not thought it desirable to lease all the fishing waters especially the trout streams.

Mr. King introduced a bill to incorporate the Aluminium Products Company of New Brunswick.

Mr. Barnes explained that a company was engaged in prospecting the coal fields on the Richmond river, and desired to build a railway to the International near Adamsville, a distance of about seven miles. Their coal is of the very best quality and was now being used in the local manufacturing industry. It is much better than the coal of 638 tons and was informed by the superintendent that if they had transportation, or a better road to get the coal to the output this month would be 2,164 tons in May 2,808 tons in June 3,900 tons, and in July 4,992 tons. A large sum had already been expended in development, \$10,000 on one mine and \$40,000 on another.

Mr. Tweedie said that following out the policy of the government as previously announced, progress must be reported on the bill until its promoters had proved to the government their ability to build a railway.
