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Highway Robbery—Attempt at Murder.
The Loch Lomond Road, about five miles from the city, was the scene of a murderous assault on Arthur des Forges, Monday evening. The young man is an employe of Messrs. Board & Venning, and was on his way to the office of the firm. He started on foot from St. Martins on Monday, and about 8 o'clock, p. m., or a little after, was at the foot of the hill just beyond the Five Mile House. Here he was suddenly seized by two masked men who jumped from the bushes at the side of the road. One caught him by the throat and choked him while the other plied him with blows. Then they threw him on the ground and rifled his pockets, taking therefrom \$222.65 belonging to his employers, \$23 of his own, his watch, chain and pocket-book. One of them struck Des Forges in the face. Just as they had finished their work a carriage was heard approaching. They took the young man, who was almost insensible, and threw him into the small lake just at the foot of the hill, and then made good their escape. He managed to get out of the water and on the road, after some time, and walked to the city as fast as his tired and bruised limbs would let him. He arrived at Flagler's hotel, Carlton street, about 10 o'clock. Yesterday he was quite ill, being unable to leave his bed. He states that his assailants wore black masks, and were perfectly disguised. His clothes were wet by their hands that they were white men.

The story, as told by the young man, is somewhat peculiar. In the first place, where he alleges he was robbed and thrown into the lake, was not a stone's throw from a house, and within easy calling distance. A quarter of a mile further on was McNamara's Five Mile House. He ran past this house, and dozens of others before he arrived in the city. The carriage which was heard, just before he was thrown in the lake, did not overtake him until he had gone about three miles. Then he did not speak to the occupants, as they seemed to be in a hurry, and again he only met one carriage on his journey in, which is rather incredible on the Loch Lomond Road. Though so badly injured, no bruises are to be seen. He never told any one at the hotel that he had been robbed until next morning, but retired quietly to rest. His clothes were wet and a little muddy, which only proves that he had been in the mud.

Cornelius Donahoe, a laboring man, dropped dead yesterday afternoon while loading the bark Merriam with deals. He was conveyed to the scene, and Dr. Harrison called, but life was extinct, and he was taken to his late home in North street. An inquest will be held this afternoon.

When he was on board ship it was loud and high, when in the whale's belly it was soft and low, and when he got out on shore the chorus was wild and high. "No one there to dippe me in," a Baptist melody, was rapturously applauded. "One more river to cross and glory in my soul," and "Pick up de young Lambs, tote 'em in your bosom, and let de old Sheep go in your bosom," in characteristic slave style, and each had to be repeated several times. The new melodies were sung and there will be a crowded house. The company, apart for the excellent object for which they are working, deserve a crowded house as artists and humorists.

Exercise for Prisoners.
