The tenders for the position of superintendent of streets and water works were opened; the following being the estimates: Streets \$1000, Poor 250, Salaries 550, Electric Lighting (streets) 500, County Council 1258, Contingent account 300, Schools 2150, Town Lands 150, Discount on Taxes 100, Debt balance 500, Water Assessment 416.
