The workingman has labor to sell—that is his stock-in-trade, the commodity in which he deals; and he should dispose of it to the best advantage, as any other trader does. When farmers, manufacturers, contractors, and other expitalists require labor, they have to go into the labor mar-ket and buy it, which they do at the cur-rent rates.
