NEWSPAPERS AND BRITISH SERIALS. We do not think the gentlemen to whom have been entrusted the interests of newspaper readers in the drafting of the new Copyright Act have done justice to the large section of the public.

IMMIGRATION CONVENTION. The liveliest question in the North-western States of the adjoining Republic is that of immigration. Last week a convention of the delegates representing six hundred delegates, was held in St. Paul to consider the best means for inducing people from the more thickly settled parts of the east and from Europe to immigrate to the northwest wheat fields.

According to the statements of some of the delegates present, the "states are worse off with respect to population than we are. It is apparent that the present gathering that each state or province should establish a bureau of information, and that the federal government should have the stamp of authority.

While the general feeling of the delegates was strongly in favor of every means to bring in settlers, yet they were equally emphatic in their assertion that discrimination was necessary in the selection of immigrants.
