ST. ALBAN'S CATHEDRAL.

IS IT THE WHITE ELEPHANT OF THE TORONTO DIOCESE?

Another Plethora Pile From Bishop Stewart. The Annual Conference of the Anglican Synod of the Diocese of Toronto opened in St. James' Schoolhouse yesterday morning. The Bishop of Toronto presided, and there were present a large number of delegates, not many parishes in the diocese being unrepresented.

The Synod will remain in session to-day. The lecture of yesterday's proceedings was the latter starting attitude taken by Bishop Stewartman in regard to St. Alban's Cathedral.

The opening session of the Synod was presided by the celebration of Holy Communion in St. James' Cathedral, the Bishop of Toronto, assisted by the Bishop-designate of Niagara, and the Bishop of the Diocese of the West.

Archdeacon Boddy opened the Synod meeting with prayer, after which Rev. Arthur B. Hamilton, secretary of the Synod, read the report of the Committee on Credentials.

The Bishop in his message to the Synod expressed gratitude that the active clergy of the diocese had remained intact during the year, untroubled by the hand of death.

At the residence of ex-Ald. Brandon, Beverley-street, last night, a double presentation took place of a number of years Mr. L. A. Morrison has taught a Bible class in McCaul-street Methodist Church, and has been an able and efficient worker.

The successful special mission in this city, under the leadership of Rev. J. H. G. Morrison, was referred to, as was also the ordination of deacons of the diocese, ceremonies never before performed in Canada.

His Lordship stated that the crisis in the affairs of St. Alban's Cathedral had at last been reached and that the title to the property had passed to the diocese, the chapter to the independent order of Foresters.

The following officers were re-elected for the ensuing year: Rev. T. W. Patterson, Canon Stueber, Rev. J. G. Hodgins, honorary lay secretary, and Mr. David Kemp, secretary-treasurer.

A memorial from the Rural Deanery of Toronto, regarding the establishment of a diocesan fund, was referred to a special committee.

Dr. Hodgins read a letter from Rev. Dr. Cochrane of Brantford stating that the Presbyterian Church refused to join with the Anglican Church in asking the Ontario Government to arrange for religious instruction in Public schools.

A committee will consider the case. The following were appointed a committee to consider the Bishop's remarks regarding St. Alban's Cathedral: Rev. Dr. Lanstry (convener), A. J. Broughall, Canon Stueber, Rev. J. G. Hodgins, Mr. H. Tomlinson, Hon. S. H. Blake, Clarkson Jones, E. W. Chadwick, J. H. Plummer, H. C. Burritt, J. A. Worrell, Q.C., and Archdeacon Allen.

"Inane Irish Method." When the Synod came to the consideration of the Bishop's remarks regarding the "inane Irish method" of managing the fund, it was a shame, he said, that widows of clergy who had died were not being looked after in any way tried to replenish the fund from the money gotten together by clergy who had acted like men and women.
