





## ECLIPSES.

In the Year 1891 there will be four eclipses, two of the Sun and two of the Moon, and a Transit of Mercury over the Sun's Disk.

I. A total eclipse of the Moon, May 23rd, invisible in Canada but visible generally throughout the western part of the Pacific Ocean, Australia, Asia, Africa and Europe.

II. An annular eclipse of the Sun June 6, the southern limit of simple contact passing through northern Canada.

III. A total eclipse of the Moon November 15, visible in Canada; Moon enters penumbra 4.36 p.m.; Moon enters shadow 5.35 p.m.; Totality begins 6.37 p.m.; Middle of eclipse 7.19 p.m.; Totality ends 8.01 p.m.; Moon leaves shadow 9.03 p.m.; Moon leaves penumbra 10.03 p.m., eastern standard time.

IV. A partial eclipse of the Sun, November 30, invisible in Canada. A Transit of Mercury over the Sun's Disk May 9, partially visible before sunset and visible throughout the western portion of North and South America.

## MORNING AND EVENING STARS.

*Venus* is a morning star to September 18, then evening star.

*Mars* is an evening star to July 29, then morning star.

*Jupiter* is an evening star to February 13, a morning star until September 5, then evening star.

*Saturn* is a morning star to March 4, an evening star until September 13, then morning star.

The planets will be brightest, *Venus*, January 8; *Jupiter*, September 5; *Saturn*, March 4; *Mercury*, April 19, August 16, December 10, setting closely after the sun in the evening, also February 6, June 5, September 28, rising immediately before the sun in the morning.
