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REPORT FOR 1880.

THE Board of Management have the pleasure to submit their Sixth Annual Report of the operations of the TORONTO HOME FOR INCURABLES.

It is with unfeigned regret that the Board are obliged to refer to the removal by death, during the past year, of their late chairman, the Rev. Alexander Topp, D.D. Connected with the Home from its inception, and for five years their chairman, the members of the Board cannot but feel the heavy loss with which it has pleased Almighty God to visit them. Conciliatory and winning in manner, wise and judicious in counsel, painstaking and indefatigable in the interests of an institution over which he had so faithfully presided, Dr. Topp will ever be remembered by his old associates with the most kindly and respectful feelings. To further the interests of the Home was to him a "labour of love." While we have been afflicted in the death of our late esteemed chairman, we have abundant cause of thankfulness to God for the favours which have been vouchsafed to the Institution during the past year.

There are at present in the Home nineteen patients—seven men and twelve women. One of the inmates died during the year. Since our last annual meeting seven were admitted to the Home.

We acknowledge with thanks the sum of \$482.58 from the Ontario Government, and the city grant, \$500. The amount collected by the ladies for the past year is \$2,305.13.

In the Report of last year reference was made to the pressing necessity for securing such increased accommodation as would enable the Board, by the provision of a sufficient and permanent building, to meet the numerous appeals made for admission to the Institution; and it was felt that if its benevolent purposes were to be duly fulfilled, active measures were necessary to extend the facilities for receiving the many and deserving objects of sympathy and consideration which, for want of such accommodation, the Board has been obliged to reject, by reason of the limited and inadequate nature of the house which has been temporarily occupied. Ample and suitable land having been obtained upon most advantageous terms, and the purchase having already been provided for, the Board was encouraged to appeal to the generosity of the promoters of the charity, with a view to the construction of a permanent Home of sufficient capacity to meet the demands made upon it, and they are happy to be able to report that their appeal was so liberally met as to justify them in entering upon the work of construction, and they confidently believe that the building now in progress of erection will commend itself to approval, alike by reason of the excellence and economical method of internal arrangement, as well as by the artistic fitness of its design, under the professional guidance of Mr. Frank Darling.

The estimate for the completed structure was \$22,000, but the Board, believing it to be wiser, in the interests of the Charity, to act with caution, and to avoid the hindrances to its practical operation by the burthen of an oppressive debt, preferred to limit their responsibilities to a partial (and perhaps for the present sufficient) provision of the proposed building; and they accordingly contented themselves by authorizing the construction of so much of the complete design as would immediately provide for the care of fifty-two inmates.

It is yet a matter of anxious solicitude that means should be provided for finishing the building, and properly furnishing and equipping the establishment, with due regard to the health and comfort of its inmates; and they accordingly appeal for further and immediate assistance, to enable them to make such suitable provisions for the establishment as shall justify by sufficiency and cheerfulness, the title which the charity has assumed as a "Home."

The Board gratefully recognizes the personal liberality which has enabled them so far to achieve their objects. The separate sympathy of churches, of families, and of individuals, might be fittingly expressed by undertaking the equipment of particular wards. The good work would thus be easily accomplished and well done, and the contributors would thus enjoy the pleasant consciousness of a visible result to their benevolent efforts. A comfortable bed, an easy chair, a cheerful picture, or a good book, might be a blessing alike to those who give and who receive. The life that is left to "an incurable" is full of suffering; it may well become those who are blessed with health, abundance, and the affection of many friends, to testify their gratitude by mitigating its woes.

On the 18th September, 1879, Her Royal Highness the Princess Louise, accompanied by His Excellency the Governor-General (Marquis of Lorne), who was at that time paying his first official visit to this city, was graciously pleased to lay the corner-stone of the new "Home" at Parkdale. On that occasion Her Royal Highness, whose sympathies with practical charities are so well known, manifested very great interest in the enterprise, and expressed a hope, as did also His Excellency, that she might have the pleasure of visiting it a second time, on its completion.

The Board very gratefully acknowledge the important services which the medical staff have so kindly and ungrudgingly rendered to the Institution—services that have afforded so much comfort and relief to the patients.

They likewise tender their grateful thanks to the clergymen and others who have conducted divine service on Sundays and other days.

Great benefit still accrues to the Institution from the weekly attendance of the ladies in regular order. Things are kept in a satisfactory state, and matters requiring immediate attention are brought to notice, and disposed of promptly between the monthly meetings.

The Board also report their satisfaction with Mrs. Craigie, who was appointed Matron during the year, and who has carefully carried out their instructions, and so well attended to the comfort of the inmates, and the general oversight of the affairs of the "Home."

The Steward, also, who was engaged during the past year, has discharged his duties with great efficiency.

REPORT

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REPORT OF MEDICAL STAFF.

By request of the Committee of Management of the Home for Incurables, it affords me much pleasure, on behalf of myself and of the other gentlemen who are associated with me in the medical direction of the Institution, to present the following Report for the past year :

It is a source of gratification to us that, under the good providence of Almighty God, we are enabled to furnish a most satisfactory statement of the bodily welfare of those committed to our charge ; also of their continued happiness and comparative comfort, and of the general sanitary condition of the Home.

One death only has occurred during the last twelve months, that of Joseph Armitage, on the 15th day of August.

With this solitary exception, we have been highly favoured, for we have had little to do, save in the exercise of very ordinary means for the alleviation of trifling ailments, or other distresses incidental to, and inseparable from, inmates of the class they represent.

From our personal intercourse with the patients, all we can say is that we have invariably been received with demonstrations of welcome—happy faces greeting us upon every occasion of our visits.

The medical service of the "Home" has been rendered as regularly, week by week, as our time and opportunities afforded, nothing having been left undone which could have promoted the health of this afflicted circle of otherwise homeless and depen-

CONSTITUTION

OF

“THE TORONTO HOME FOR INCURABLES,”

(AS AMENDED.)

I. This Institution shall be known as “The Toronto Home for Incurables.”

II. Its objects shall be to afford maintenance, nursing, and medical and surgical aid to persons suffering from incurable disease, and to provide for them, while inmates of the Home, the ministrations of the Gospel.

III. Every subscriber of two dollars and upwards per annum shall be entitled to vote at the annual meeting, at which a Board of Managers shall be elected for the ensuing twelve months. Every individual who shall pay in advance, and at one time, the sum of fifty dollars, shall be entitled to the same privilege for life.

IV. All money now in the possession of the Home, or which may hereafter be collected or acquired by it, shall be applied (unless otherwise directed by the donor) to the general objects, uses and requirements of the Home. Persons may donate for special objects, and effect will be given to the wishes of such

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contributors, so far as they can be carried out without conflicting with the Constitution and By-laws of the Home.

V. The affairs of the Home shall be under the direction, control and management of a Board of Managers, of whom at least forty shall be ladies, and twelve gentlemen, and who shall be elected at the annual general meeting of subscribers qualified as set forth in Article III. The medical staff attending the Home shall be *ex officio* members of the Board of Managers. In case of a vacancy arising, the Board may elect a member to fill the vacancy until next annual general meeting.

The Board shall control and direct all the business of the Institution, and their decisions upon all points of management shall be final.

There shall be chosen annually, and by the vote of the Board, a President, and from among the Lady Managers the following officers, viz.:—First Lady Directress, Second Lady Directress, Third Lady Directress, Secretary, Assistant-Secretary and Treasurer. For the more convenient working of the Institution the Board may from time to time appoint committees of not less than three of their number, such as an Executive Committee and committees for visiting and superintending the Home.

The Board may also enact By-laws for regulating the duties of the various officers and employees of the Home. The By-laws shall not be altered except at a regular meeting, after notice duly given at least a month previously.

VI. The Board of Managers shall hold stated meetings at least once a month, and may hold adjourned meetings when necessary. At such monthly meetings the Board shall have power to make additional By-laws for regulating its own government, and for the government of the officers and employees, as before provided, and, when necessary, after due notice, to alter and amend the same.

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President and one of the Lady Directresses, or on requisition of five or more members of the Board. When a special meeting is called,

the time and place of meeting, and the business for which it is called, shall be stated in the notice calling the meeting, and no other business shall be taken up at such meeting.

VII. The annual general meeting of the subscribers qualified as set forth in Article III. shall be held during the month of March. It shall be the duty of the Board of Managers to make all necessary arrangements for said annual meeting; to lay before the subscribers a report of the proceedings of the previous twelve months; and to exhibit a full and accurate view of the funds, property and effects of the Home.

VIII. In view of the large contributions given by the citizens of Toronto and the grant made by the City Council in aid of the Home, applicants from the City of Toronto for admission to the Home shall have the preference over others.

IX. The Board will receive incurable persons from any municipality in Ontario outside of Toronto on condition that a bond be given by said municipality to pay such sum as the Board may determine from time to time for the maintenance of each patient so sent: Provided always that a certificate be given by the gaol surgeon of the municipality, or by such other medical gentleman as the Board may approve, that the person seeking admission is incurable; provided also that such certificate be endorsed by the medical officers of this Institution.

X. The foregoing Constitution shall not be altered, unless it be at an annual general meeting of subscribers, notice of such alteration having been given at the previous annual meeting, and two-thirds of those present consenting thereto.
