CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

Province of Auebea Rifle Association.

CONSTITUTION.

Rule 1. That this Association be called the "Province of Quebec Rifle Association," and shall have for its object, the encouragement of Rifle shooting in the Province.

- 2. That the Annual Subscription for Individual Members be two dollars, and a donation of ten dollars in cash, at any one time, shall entitle the donor to be elected a life member.
- 3. That any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps, may become affiliated to this Association, by the payment of an annual subscription of not less than ten dollars, the number of memberships to be in proportion to one for every half dollar so subscribed.
- 4. The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Council composed of the office-bearers, and two representatives from each affiliated Association in this Province. Five to form a quorum.
- 5. The office-bearers of this Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected primarily at the first meeting, and afterwards annually at the annual meeting.
- 6. A Patron and Vice-Patrons may be elected at the first meeting, and afterwards whenever a vacancy occurs.
 - 7. The Deputy Adjutant-Generals and Brigade Majors of

the Province, being members of the Association, shall be members, ex-officio, of the Council.

- 8. The Representatives to the Council must be members of Association, either by affiliation or otherwise; they shall be chosen annually by the Association they represent, and their names sent to the Secretary, at least one month before the annual meeting.
- 9. The Council may from time to time, make such By-Laws for their proper guidance as they may deem necessary, but no by-law to be altered or new one proposed, without at least such notice being given to each member of the Council, as by the by-laws may be determined.
- 10. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be agreed on at the annual business meeting.
- 11. The Annual Business Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on, by the by-laws.
- 12. An Annual Report shall be made by the Secretary and Treasurer and submitted to the Council, previous to publication.
- 13. At its Annual Meeting the Council shall appoint an Executive Committee, to carry out the Annual Prize Meeting, under such regulations as may be made by the Council from time to time.

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1. That the Annual Meeting of the Association be held at Montreal on the first Thursday in May.

2. Extraordinary Meetings may be called by the Secretary, when required by any six members of the Council; fifteen days notice of such meeting given to each member of the Council, and the requisition must state the object for which the meeting is called.

3. Three Auditors shall be appointed annually, whose duties shall be to examine the Treasurer's accounts previous to the Annual Meeting.

4. The Treasurer shall be required to deposit from time to time—all sums of money paid over to him, on behalf of the Association—in a safe bank.

5. The payment of sums for current expenses, must be authorized by the President, or in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents. Other payments to be made only upon the authority of the Council.

Representatives to the Dominion Rifle Association—Moved by Lt.-Col. McEachern, seconded by Major Stevenson, "That Lieut.-Cols. Bacon, D'Orsonnens, and Alleyn, Major Fraser, and Capt Boyd, be the representatives for this year." Carried.

- 5. It was resolved, "That the Annual Matches be held on the 21st August and following days."
- 6. Moved by Lieut.-Col. McEachern, seconded by Major Johnson, "That the usual grant of \$100.00 be voted to Lt.-Col. Fletcher, Secretary for the past year, and that the thanks of the Association be given to him on his retiring from that office, for his long and efficient services." Carried unanimously.
- 7. The subject of having a Permanent Rifle Range, was brought before the meeting, and the necessity of securing a piece of ground for that purpose was admitted by all present. It was moved by Major Fraser, seconded by Capt. Morehouse, "That in view of the importance to this Province generally, of securing a permanent Range for its Riflemen, and it being evident that before long the Field at present leased for a Range will be occupied for building purposes, the President of the Province of Quebec Rifle Association be requested to lay before the Government, the desirability of acquiring such ground at Point St. Charles, as may be necessary for the purposes of a Rifle Range." Carried unanimously.
- 8. The treasurer stated, that Mr. Fisher, of New York, member of the Amateur Rifle Club, had forwarded \$10.00, and desired to be elected a Life Member of the Quebec Provincial Association. Mr. Fisher was thereupon elected by the meeting a Life Member.
- 9. With reference to the erection of a Canvass Target. The neat model of a very fine Target, simple and quick in its working, was shewn by Col. Bacon the inventor; this Target can be constructed at one third of the cost of those in use at Ottawa. A resolution was adopted unanimously, "giving authority to the Executive to have one of them erected at the Rifle Range."
- 10. Lt.-Col McKay, M.G.A., brought before the meeting, the cases of Sergts. Wynne and Wilson of his Brigade, who had been expelled from the Association, at a meeting of the

Council on on their fi Inquiry th report had seconded by 1875, expel

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Council on the 10th August, 1875, for alledged unfair scores on their firing Tickets. He read the Report of a Court of Inquiry that had been heen held on these men, and which report had cleared them of any guilt. Lt.-Col. McKay moved, seconded by Lt.-Col. Harwood, "That the motion passed in 1875, expelling Wynne and Wilson, be reconsidered." Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Col. McKay, seconded by Lt..Col. Martin, "That Sergts. Wynne and Wilson of the Mont. Gar. Art. who were expelled from the Association in August, 1875, be re-admitted." A good deal of discussion arose on this motion, when the President Col. Brydges suggested the propriety of withdrawing both of these motions, and passing one referring the cases of these men to a future meeting. This was agreed to, and the following Resolution adopted unanimously to take the place of the other two. Moved by Lt.-Col. McKay, seconded by Lt.-Col. McEachern, "That the cases of Sergeants Wynne and Wilson, dealt with by the Council on 10th Aug., 1875, be referred back for the reconsideration of the Council, on the first day of the Annual Matches, in August next, with all the information that has since been acquired relating to their cases." Carried.

11. A letter was read by the Secretary from the Secretary of the National Rifle Association, United States, inviting this Province to send a Team to compete for the American Centennial Trophy at Creedmoor, next year. It was resolved, "That the Secretary be directed to inform the Secretary of the National Rifle Association, U. S., that this Province could not accept the invitation for itself, but would willingly cooperate with the Dominion Rifle Association, or with the other Provincial Associations, in sending a Team to represent the Dominion of Canada at the competition." Carried.

12. Notices of motion, by Major Fraser, seconded by Col. Fletcher, to change Rules 2, 5, 8, 11 and 13, to read as follows:

" Rule 2. That the Annual Subscription for individual mem-

" bers be two dollars, and a donation of twenty dollars in cash at any one time for that express purpose shall entitle the donor to apply to be elected a Life Member at the next

" Annual Meeting of Council.

"Rule 5. The office-bearers of this Association shall conisst of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer,
who shall be elected primarily at the first meeting, and afterwards annually at the Annual Meeting; all office-bearers
must be individual members of the Association.

"Rule 8. Add after last clause, and to entitle to vote any changes must be duly notified to the Secretary.

"Rule 11. The Annual Business Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on, by the bylaws and this meeting terminates the previous year's business.

"Rule 13. At its Annual Meeting the Council shall ap"point an Executive Committee of seven of its members,
"who with the Secretary and Treasurer, shall carry out the
"Annual Prize Meeting, and give effect to such instructions
as the Council may from time to time order respecting the
"management of the affairs of the Association.

These amendments were received and referred for consideration to next Meeting of Council.

13. A vote of thanks was passed to the President for his able services in the Chair, and the Meeting then adjourned.

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EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

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Province of Quebeq Bifle Association.

The record of the proceedings of the past year shews that the work of the Association has been carried on efficiently and successfully, and the large attendance of competitors at the Annual Matches last August, is an evidence that the interest in our Prize Meetings is on the increase. The number of competitors and of Affiliated Associations is greater than the previous year. The excellent scores made shew a good state practice amongst our active militia.

There were competitors, as usual, from all parts, a considerable number from Ontario, one from Manitoba (Mr. Chambers, of the Wimbledon Team), and one from New York (Mr. Fisher, of the A. R. C.).

The Battalion Cup was won by the Three Rivers Battalion, the Association First Prize by the Montreal Garrison Artillery, and the Cup for active volunteers by O'Grady, of the 3rd Batt. Victoria Rifles.

The Medals so kindly granted by His Excellency the Governor General for competition at the Annual Meeting of 1876 were won by the best aggregate Snider shots in Matches 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 and 7. G. A. Shaw, 54th Batt., won the Silver Medal, and Sergt. Riddle, the Bronze Medal. These splendid medals have been received. The names of the winners are engraved on each, and His Excellency has sent each of the winners a

very cordial letter of congratulation on their success. These letters are of themselves valuable rewards, and will be duly appreciated as such by the fortunate winners.

The funds were rather low last year; the Executive therefore thought it prudent to reduce the value of some of the prizes. It is to be hoped the state of the funds this year will enable it to increase these prizes again to their former value. The funds have been managed as economically as was consistent with efficiency; but a way must be found, if possible, of reducing the heavy expense of marking, register keeping, and the constant repair of material on the ranges. It was resolved last year to ask Commanding Officers of corps to collect subscriptions. This was done, but the Executive finding that with one exception (Major Johnson, of the 51st Batt., to whom credit is due for his prompt and efficient action in this regard), no collections were made, it became necessary to employ an officer to solicit and collect subscriptions, and this plan so far proved satisfactory. The Dominion and Provincial grants were duly and thankfully received.

The success of the Province at the Dominion of Canada Matches is deserving of honorable mention. Major Fraser, of the Montreal Garrison Artillery, with his team, carried off the first prize in the Battalion Match, followed by the 54th Batt., second prize, 3rd Batt. V.V.R. being third. In the match for the Wimbledon Team, seven of our Quebec members won places on the Team, viz.: Captains Boyd and Thomas, and Private Shaw, 54th Batt.; Private Ross, 1st Batt. P. W. R.; Lieut. Balfour, late 8th Batt.; Corporal F. Vaughan and Sergt. Matthews, 3rd Batt. V. V. R. These names are placed in the order of merit.

The subject of canvass targets on light moveable iron frames, instead of the old heavy metal plates, is one worthy of consideration by the Council. The marking with the canvass target is more speedy and correct than with the old metal

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A special February, to before the A at Ottawa, or changes in the D. R. A., and representation before the necessity for was admitted adopted:

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Rule 8, requiring Affiliated Associations to send to the Secretary, at least one month previous to the Annual Meeting, the names of two representatives, has been neglected by some of the Associations. The observance of this rule in future ought to be strictly adhered to.

A letter was received in January last from the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, requesting a subscription from our Association to a "Trophy or Challenge Cup," to be presented to the National Rifle Association of England, in the name of the Canadian Riflemen, as an acknowledment of the cordial reception extended to the Canadian Competitors at Wimbledon in past years, - the Trophy to cost not less than £150; the money to be raised by a subscription of \$50 from each Provincial Rifle Association. A special meeting of the Executive Committee was held on the 25th January, to take the subject of this letter into consideration. After some discussion favorable to the request, a resolution was unanimously adopted, "That this Association do subscribe the sum " of fifty dollors towards the Trophy to be presented to the "English volunteers, to be competed for at Wimbledon, and "that the Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay that amount."

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 17th February, to consider matters of importance to be brought before the Annual Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association at Ottawa, on the 28th inst. The subject of some needful changes in the mode of conducting the Annual Matches of the D. R. A., and selection of the team for Wimbledon, and in the representation on the Council of the D. R. A., was brought before the meeting and discussed. The importance and necessity for some amendment in the working of the D. R. A. was admitted by all present. The following resolutions were adopted:

1st. Resolved,-To recommend to the Dominion Rifle Association that

the Wimbledon Team be selected as originally, by a three days' competition under the directions of the respective Provincial Associations, care to be taken that the instructions for the competition be explicitly laid down by the Dominion Rifle Association as to ranges, position and ammunition.

2nd. Resolved,—That it be recommended to the Dominion Rifle Association, that Affiliated Associations should be represented at the meetings and in the Council of the Dominion Association, in such proportion as may be agreed upon.

Lieut.-Col. Bacon and Major D. Torrance Fraser informed the meeting that they were going to the Annual Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association at Ottawa. The Council requested them to take charge of these resolutions and have them brought before the Annual Meeting, and to use their influence to have them adopted.

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 15th March, to receive the report of the deputation lately in attendance at the Annual Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association at Ottawa. Major Fraser reported that several important amendments had been adopted, and changes made for the better in the rules and working of the Dominion Association. The necessity for the revision of the laws of the Association was admitted at the meeting, and a committee was appointed (of which he was a member) to revise the rules and by laws, to report at an adjourned meeting. At the first meeting a resolution was passed,

That the Wimbledon Team be selected in future by competition in the different Provinces, under such regulations as shall be established by the authority of the Council.

The committee revised the constitution and by-laws. Several important amendments were made; and at the adjourned meeting, all were adopted. The following are the amendments carrying out recommendations of the deputation from our Association:—

Rule 4.—To encourage Associations to affiliate, a Silver Medal is to be given to each for competition. The winner of this Medal to have certain privileges at the first Dominion Rifle Matches he attends after winning the Medal.

RULE 8.—One-half of the Conncil is to be elected by the Provincial Associations at their annual meetings.

Rule 9.—The Association, foll England.

The meeting expressed its approval of the report of the deputation by passing the following motion unanimously: Moved by Lieut.-Col. Fletcher, seconded by Capt. Sully,

That the amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Dominion Rifle Association lately adopted are approved of, and that the thanks of this Association be given to Lt.-Col. Bacon and Major Fraser for their attendance and valuable services rendered at the Annual Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association.

Attention is called to the fact that, as a member of the Revising Committee, Major Fraser has been obliged to make two trips to Ottawa at his own expense. The Association ought to indemnify him for the expense incurred.

A letter was received from the Secretary of the National Rifle Association, New York, dated 9th April, 1877, stating that the next competition for the Centennial Rifle Trophy would be held at Creedmore in September next, and inviting our Association to send a Team. A reply was sent to the effect, that the letter would be laid before our Association for action at the Annual Meeting, and that a report of the action taken on the invitation to send a Team would be forwarded.

All of which is respectfully submitted.
