

An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money required for defraving certain expenses of the Civil Government for the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two, and certain other expenses connected with the Public Service.

Most Gracious Sovereign.

MHEREAS by Message from His Excellency the Right Preamble. Honorable James, Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, Governor General of British North America, and Captain General and Governor in Chief in and over this Province of Canada, 5 bearing date the Eighth day of November, in the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Two, and the Estimates accompanying the same, laid before both Houses of the Provincial Parliament, it appears that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the Civil 10 Government of this Province for the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Two, not otherwise provided for by law, and also for defraying the Cost of certain Public Buildings, and other purposes in the said Message and Estimates mentioned: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be 15 enacted, and Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of 20 the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by £244,588 15 the authority of the same, That from and out of any unappro- 3 granted out priated moneys forming part of the Consolidated Revenue of consolidated Revenue 25 Fund of this Province, there shall and may be paid and applied Fund. a sum not exceeding in the whole the sum of Two Hundred and Forty-Four Thousand Five Hundred and Eighty-Eight Pounds, Fifteen Shillings and Three Pence currency, for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Civil Government 30 of this Province and other purposes, for the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Two, set forth in the Schedule of this Act.

II. And be it enacted, That from and out of any unappro-£4,000 grantpriated moneys forming part of the Jesuite's Estates Fund, there suits Estates shall and may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding Four and £5000 out 35 Thousand Pounds currency, and from and out of the Balance of School

Fund Balan-

remaining unexpended of that part of the Common School Fund belonging to Lower-Canada a sum not exceeding Five Thousand Pounds, towards the support of certain Educational Institutions in Lower-Canada, as set forth in the Schedule aforesaid.

Accounting clause.

III. And be it enacted, That the due application of the moneys hereby appropriated shall be accounted for to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors 10 shall direct.

Accounting clause.

IV. And be it enacted, That a detailed account of the moneys expended under the authority of this Act shall be laid before the Legislative Assembly of this Province, during the first fifteen days of the Session of Parliament next after such Expenditure.
