# The Fruit Industry of British Columbia 

Maxuell smith, Dominion Fruit Inspector, Vancouser. B. С.
Although it is only sisteen sears since the first full catrload of fruit was shipped out of British Columbia, progress has been fairly rapid and people are now beginning to realize something of its possibilities ats a fruit-growing province. In the seatson of 19\%4, the fruit erop of British (columbia was
 at 14,000 acres.

In 19n5 the areat under fruit had been increased to 20 , (n) acres, and the total revenue derived therefrom was nearly $\$ 1,000,060$. In the same year something like $\$ 500,000$ wats expended in the purchase and improvement of fruit lands, and the average price received for grade No. I apples from Octo-
 shipping point. The carly varicties started out at $\$ 1$ net, and during the latter part of February and Mareh its high as $\mathbf{\$ V}_{2}$. per box was being paid for strictly No. I in carload lots. The average prices of other fruts for the seatom of 1965
 per 20-1b. box ; peaches, $\$ 1.15$ per $20-1 \mathrm{~h}$. box: strawberves, $\$ 2.30$ per 24 -basket crate ; rasperries $\$ 2.19$ per 24 -basket crate: blackberries, $\$ 2.40$ per 24 -basket crate ; gooseberries,
 currents, 7 e. per th. ; chemies, te. per lt.

Outside of the quantities consumed in our own eitics the chief market for British columbia fruit is the prairie provinces: a market which will always demand the best that the fruit-grower (an produce and in ever-increasing quathtities, so that British columbia need have no fear, no matter. how rapidly the industry develops, of an over-production of good, elean commercial varieties. The province is most favorably situated. in being contiguous to the great plains of the midfle west, where frut-growing on a commereial basis is not likely ever to be a suceess. That territory is sure to increase rapidly in population and the consumption of frist will be enormous. It is a curious fart that the are!.ge family on the prairies consumes more fruit than do those of British Columbia, and it is quite natumal, also. to expect that as the farmers of Aiberta, Saskatehewan and Manitoba succeed, within a comparatively fow years in laying by sufferent to keep them in comfort for the rest of their lives, they should look to British Columbia, with its congenial climate. magnificent seenery and tremendous, unexplored and undeveloped natural resources, ats a place in which to sperid their deelining years.
