THE PREMIERS' CAMPAIGN WORK

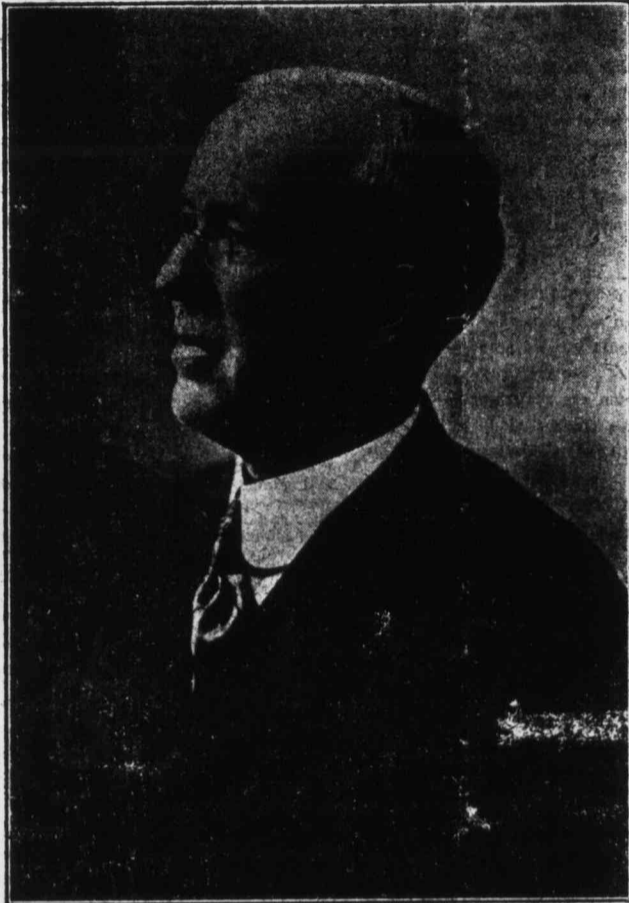

WHO OWNS THE RAILWAYS?

As regards the Railways, the question is up to the people; shall we own the Railways, as National Property, or hand them over to schemers, speculators and political tricksters?

The Quebec wing of the Liberal party, with Gouin and Lemieux as their trumpeters, are advocating the selling of our railways to the C. P. R., which if accomplished, will hand over to that company the entire control of the Railways, and management of our transportation.

This scheme of throwing away the Railways, is disastrous, whichever way it is looked at. The property is now yours—the peoples—and most assuredly, even at present, is a splendid asset for the people to have.

In the face of this, the Leader of the Liberals, Mr. King either cannot or will not make any definite announcement. The best, he has said is, "I will give the National Railways a fair trial."

Every Elector in the Maritime Provinces, should deeply consider the matter. Are the people of the Eastern Provinces, especially Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, willing to throw away their entire Railway transportation system, and be at the mercy of some greedy speculators, or corporation, who would be in the business more for their own benefit, than for the benefit of the people.

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SPIDER WEBS.

One of the Greatest Wonders of Nature. No one who has spent much time in the country can have failed to observe and admire the beautiful webs of the little garden spider.

The maker of the web sits at its centre, where the slightest vibration caused by the struggles of an entangled victim is instantly felt. The threads are so fine as to be almost invisible in some lights, and at the same time so strong that no insect not too powerful for the spider to overcome is able to break them.

The great ingenuity and perfection of these geometrical webs naturally give rise to the question, how did the spider learn the art of making them? The naturalist is not satisfied with the reply that it is a matter of instinct. He finds that there are wide differences among the webs of different spiders, and his observations lead him to think that he can discern distinct progress in the art of web-making among spiders.

The common house spider spins a web quite different from that of the garden spider. The house spider's web consists of a silken tube hidden in a dark corner, with an irregular sheet of closely woven meshes spread before it. The tube is the spider's lurking hole and place of refuge; the outspread web is its snare.

The wolf spider makes a tubular hole with a hinged door for a refuge, and spreads no snare. Still another species of spider constructs a far simpler tube of silk without any lid or door.

Now, according to the view of more than one authority, these different kinds of webs or nests represent so many stages of development. It is thought that at the beginning the only kind of web that any spider knew how to spin was a simple cocoon intended to protect its eggs.

Then a web for the protection of the spider itself from its enemies was woven around the cocoon. This web had an opening for the spider to emerge, and such webs, intended for use only during the time that the eggs are hatching, are still spun by some species of spiders.

The next step was the development of a snare. It has been suggested that this may have resulted from the accidental spinning of threads over and around the opening of a tubular retreat surrounding a cocoon. This was further developed in the outspread net of the house spider, and it reached its highest form when the garden spider learned to construct its beautiful radiated web.

One may trace in all this some resemblance to the progress of architecture among men. The earliest representatives of the human race were content to dwell in caves and rudely constructed huts. And today there are savage tribes which have not advanced much further in this respect.

Then more elaborate dwelling places and buildings intended for other purposes, were constructed until, by successive steps, we have arrived at the temples, palaces and houses of civilized life.

Country Without Police. The only country in the world that has not a single representative of the law is Greenland. Here dwell twenty-two thousand Eskimos and two hundred and forty Danes in settlements scattered along the coast.

Eskimos manage their own affairs. Any grievance they may have is settled by the head man of the tribe. There has been no serious crime in the country for the past hundred years.

The Danish Government allows no one to land there without permission, which is only granted to bona fide explorers and scientists. The sole object of this exclusion is to prevent liquor and disease reaching the Eskimos.

All Eskimos are Christians, and in the larger settlements there are five churches, with steeples, organs, and oil-paintings. Here you will find Eskimo ministers and physicians, as well as native newspapers, and an illustrated journal produced entirely by Eskimo labor.

During the short summer vegetables and various kinds of fruits are grown, and even strawberries, under glass. The coastal areas are a blaze of color from the wild flowers that abound. Then comes winter, when the whole of Greenland is cut off from the world and buried in snow and ice.

MORRISSEY SAYS THROW THEM OUT

On Tuesday night Hon. P. J. Veniot and Mr. Chas. Morrissey held a meeting in the interests of Hon. John Morrissey at Rogersville. Charlie in his address told the electors that if the McCurdy workers undertook to test the voters as had been done in past elections, they should throw them out of the polling booth.

Is this not good advice from a member of the Provincial Legislature in the presence of one of the members of the Provincial Government? The Election Act specifically states that no one has a right to vote excepting those entitled to, and it is the duty and privilege of any elector to challenge any voter, whom that elector thinks is not a fit and proper one.

Notwithstanding this, Charlie advises to throw them out. The above clearly demonstrates this man's feelings towards the conduct of a clean election. He does not care how much the lists are padded so long as he can secure a majority of votes in any district which he thinks might be a strong-hold for him or his father.

We venture to say that he would not give this advice to any district in which he did not think he would receive a majority of the votes. No—No—Charlie is no fool in this respect and that fact makes his statement to a Rogersville audience all the more contemptible.

For Charlie's information, he can be assured that the McCurdy workers do not propose for one minute to allow any one to vote, who has no right to, either in Rogersville or anywhere else, and if it is attempted, challenges will be made. Further, there will be no throwing out of the polling booths either.

Apparently Charlie's idea of a Polling Booth is a ROUGH HOUSE on election day, and it would be just as well for the Returning Officer of this county to take cognizance of Mr. Morrissey's remarks, and govern himself accordingly.

The electorate of Northumberland will not put up with any such rowdiness, and it perhaps is just as well for them to know what Mr. Chas. Morrissey's attitude is in this matter. It will be a clean election or no election at all. Charlie can put this in his pipe and smoke it.

Can anyone give us, just the exact time of Morrissey's last political change? He has turned three ways already. His next turn will be "The stay at home" route.

THE ROYALS

In Kings and Queens, the Government candidate has met with a right Royal reception, and in Mr. Jones, the people have as a candidate, a man of sterling merit. He took a firm stand, on the Government policy, of a necessary protective tariff, which he holds to be in the best interests of the community at large and farmers in particular.

He is a thorough business man, is well known, and esteemed, in both Counties, and has taken a deep interest in their welfare. An employer of labor, he gives considerable work and it has been remarked "once acquainted, they want to stay with him." The 6th of December, should place him, as Representative of the Royals. He stands preeminently the best choice before them.
