The indefatigable Princess Clementine of Orleans has been endeavoring to arrange for a marriage between her youngest and favorite son, Prince Ferdinand of Bulgaria, and the Princess Helene of Orleans, the second daughter of the Comte de Paris.

My Paris correspondent writes: "At Mrs. Marchesi's annual concert for the benefit of divers charities at Montmartre on Saturday at the Hotel Continental, the impresario had an embarrassing mistake. Mlle. Stoddard and Mme. Elliott sang charmingly together, but the success of the evening was Mrs. Eames' sympathetic rendering of Piqueux's song, and the brilliant singing of the Prentiss Quartet.

The Appointment would be Popular. LONDON, May 15.—It is said that the Prince of Wales has intimated that he would not be averse to reading in Dublin for half the time, and that this has been widely circulated as evidence that His Royal Highness, who is not much liked in Ireland.

The League and Crime. LONDON, May 15.—Father Egan testified before the Juries Commission today that the leading member of the League belonged to the League. No serious crime had been committed from the time of the formation of the League until it was suppressed.

The Welsh Dis-establishment Bill. LONDON, May 15.—In the House of Commons last evening Mr. Dilworthy's motion in favor of the dis-establishment of the Church in Wales was rejected by a vote of 234 to 231.

A Ritualist Defeat. LONDON, May 15.—An important decision has been rendered by the Archbishop of Canterbury in the case of the Bishop of Lincoln, who is under prosecution for ritualist practices.

Able but an Athlete. LONDON, May 15.—Herr Gneuss, a prominent member of the German Olympic committee, has been elected to the position of president of the German Olympic committee.

Insulted the Crown Prince. LONDON, May 15.—A potter at Grosvenor Street has been sentenced to a month's imprisonment for insulting the Crown Prince William, aged 17 years.

Fierce Fighting in Sumatra. LONDON, May 15.—War is reported to have broken out again between the Dutch and Malays in Sumatra. Immense numbers of natives attacked the port of Achen, but were repulsed with the loss of 160 killed.

Perils to Get Off Easy. PARIS, May 15.—The case of Perrin, who fired a shot at President Carnot, has been sent back to the Police Tribunal. A light sentence will probably be imposed.

Brigands Hanged at Sofia. SOFIA, May 15.—Five brigands were hanged in the courtyard of the prison here today. They were led separately to the scaffold and were hanged in succession.
