

Firmness is the chief feature in the leading departments of the grocery trade. Sugars are especially active. Both the London and New York markets are excited and this uncasiness is reflected here. A despatch was received by a sugar broker here yesterday to the effect that begin had advanced 3 pence more. This is looked on as a sure indication that there will soon be another rise. Granulated is now quoted at 9% for under 15 barrel lots and 9% for 16 barrel lots and over. Yellows are quoted at 7% to 8%. Molasses and syrups are very firm at last week's advance. Trinidad is quoted at 48c and syrups firm at 60 to 60c. Cholce new honey syrup brings 68c. Teas are steady. The new Japans arriving are very fine. Coffees are firm. Green Rio is quoted at 290 and 22% and Green Javas 23 to 25c. Canned goods of all kinds are firm at recent advances. Payments are fair.

The leather trade has been fairly active this week and signs of improvement are being shown. The demand is better and steady and stocks are being reduced. Though there is no change in quotations prices are firmer. Prices: For large 10ts of sole, No. 3, 15c; No. 2, 18c; No. 1, 22c; No. 1, 2slected, 24c. Black leather, 18c to 25c, and upper leather, 25c to 30c.

Mides, Sieins and Weel.

There is a better feeling in hides. The receipts during the past fortnight have fallen off and the demand has improved, and though stocks are still heavy they are getting less, Prices are firm but unchanged. Car lots of No. 1 are reported sold at 6tc. Sheepskins are nearly out of the market. Lambskins and shearlings are plentiful. Prices, 25c to 30c for lamb skins and 20c to 25c for shearlings. Calfskins show no improvement. Veal skins are quoted at 5c to 6c. and lights from 20c to 25c. Tallow is bought by dealers at 5c and sold at 54c. New clip wool is coming in gradually. Prices for fieece woolrange from 18c to 16c, with good lots at 20c. The market shows no sign of improvement. Pulled wools are in steady demand and stocks are getting lighter. Supers are quoted at 23c and extras 28c to 29c.

Live Stock.

The receipts at the western cattle yards this morning were light, only 20 loads being delivered. The tone of the market was firm, particularly with cattle. There was a good demand for nearly all the stock offered. There was an advance in butchers' cattle of from \$1 to \$2 a head. Trade was better thankin the early part of the week and all offerings, which were not heavy, were taken up. The quality of the offerings, was not very good, but both good and inferior were taken readily. Export cattle show a shade of improvement, There were not many offered to-day and the quality of the offerings was not particularly good, but all were in demand.
