FINANCE AND TRADE

"It looks very much as if money will be lower at the beginning of the year," said a broker yesterday.

"Money is accumulating at all the chief centres, for the reason that loans in such a state that there is little inducement for capitalists to enter into new enterprises."

The feeling in speculative circles is "nothing but cheer." The tendency of the securities is towards a lower level, and those operating have lost considerable sums during the year.

One of Toronto's brokers has averaged in Chicago and New York through his leads over a number of years have been over \$100,000 a year.

The available reserves of Canadian banks during the month of November increased to the extent of about \$1,500,000, but the percentage of reserve to liability of the banks is kept down owing to the increase in deposits.

There has also been an increase in savings bank deposits, all going into the hands of the public at present, and it is expected that the amount of deposits will be increased in the spring the amount of deposits will be increased in the spring.

The returns of railways for the third week of December are coming in and showing up very poorly. The Canadian Pacific's returns are down to the extent of \$7,000,000 and C.P. & N.W. a decrease of \$1,700,000 as compared with the corresponding week of last year.

The condition of the Atchafalaya Railway is deplorable. It is only a few months that dividends would be resumed soon, and this is the only railway in the province that has not paid dividends for several years.

The decline in cotton stock has caught a number of operators here, but a much larger number in Montreal. These securities are down to 50 per cent. since the middle of the month. Overproduction is assigned as the chief cause of the decline.

FOUND DEAD IN BED. The President of the Union Loan and Savings Company Suddenly Expires.

James G. McGe, aged 72, president of the Union Loan and Savings Company, died suddenly at his residence 112 College-st. last night at 11 o'clock. He had apparently in his usual health Monday evening, but when his daughter went to call him yesterday morning about 9 o'clock she found him dead in bed.

Mr. McGe, who was born in Belfast, Ireland, was at one time manager and subsequently treasurer of the Industrial Exhibition Association, and for several years was an alderman of the city. He leaves a wife and grown-up family.

Death of Mr. William Dickson, Sr. Mr. Dickson, a resident of Toronto since 1838, when he came here from Cincinnati and took a position as English buyer for the firm of W. L. Perry & Co., was 80 years of age.

In 1857 he succeeded to the business and established the firm of Dickson, Scott & Co. Mr. Dickson also served on the Provincial Board of Health for 20 years ago when he retired, and has since that time lived a retired life. He died at the residence of his son-in-law, Mr. G. C. Steele, 78 Pembroke-st., and the funeral will take place from that address at 2 p.m. Thursday.
