Massacre of Christians By Turks Reported

Saloniki, March 8.—Thousands of Christians are fleeing from the towns of Western European Turkey into Bulgarian territory to escape massacre by the Turks.

PREDICT BOMBARDMENT OF CONSTANTINOPLE BY APRIL

Believed That Dardanelles Will be Forced Within Fortnight—Allies' Shells Start Fires in Smyrna—Terror in Capital, Government to Leave on Thursday

London, March 8.—With inexorable precision caution and without haste, the attacks of the Anglo-French fleet against the Turkish coast defenses continue, according to despatches from Athens.

It is reported from the island of Tenedos, in the Aegean Sea, that shells fired from the fleet against Smyrna, set the city on fire in several places.

Sofia, March 8.—The Turkish government will be removed to Asia Minor on Thursday, according to a message brought here from Constantinople by courier today.

London, March 8.—According to the latest advice received here, says a Reuters despatch from Sofia, the sultan and the government are still in Constantinople.

It is understood that it has been decided to entrust the defence of Constantinople exclusively to the Germans, under command of General Liman von Sanders, instructor of the Turkish army.

London, March 8.—The Daily Mail's correspondent in Sofia, Bulgaria, sends the following despatch:

GERMANS IN FULL RETREAT; CZAR'S MEN PURSUING

Driven From Forest of Augustow and Suffer Heavily

COMPLETE VICTORY

Russia Again Nearing Frontier of East Prussia—Grand Duke Nicholas Doing Good Work Elsewhere—Great Masses of Troops

Petrograd, March 8.—The Germans are in full retreat from the forest of Augustow and the Russians pursuing them are nearing the frontier of East Prussia.

Barcelona, Spain, March 8.—The Diario de Badajoz announces that the government of Portugal has sent the cruiser Adamaster to Oporto as a measure of precaution.

Oporto is the second city of Portugal and by far the largest city in the northern country.

London, March 8.—The British steamer Ningschow which arrived on Sunday at Glasgow, reported having sighted a submarine near Lands End on March 4.

PEOPLE OF ATHENS CRY OUT FOR WAR WITH TURKEY

Demonstrations in the Streets Today Show Feeling is For Fight—Two of Former Cabinet Reject Seats in New Government

Athens, March 8.—Popular demonstrations favoring war with Turkey took place in Athens today.

A great crowd surrounding the parliament building shouted "down with Turkey" and "we want war," as the members of the chamber of deputies arrived for today's session.

London, March 8.—Special despatches from Athens to the morning newspapers express doubt whether M. Zaimis will be able to form a stable government for Greece.

It is further asserted that for three days Athens daily has been expecting a declaration of war.

London, March 8, 12:10 a.m.—A despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company from Athens says the Greek press, in its comment on the operations against the Dardanelles, has declared itself in favor of Greece's participation in the war, taking the ground that no breaking up of the Ottoman empire should be permitted to take place without the collaboration of the Hellenic troops.

Fear Equal Fight With England's Ships; Germans To Try To Save Their Fleet

Talk of Plan to Remain Hidden Till End of War and Then Begin to Make Greater Navy Than Ever Existed

London, March 8.—A Daily Express despatch dated Amsterdam on Sunday says:

Before long there will be a general shuffle of positions in the higher command of the German navy.

It may be taken for granted that the German fleet will never again attack England's ships in anything like an equal fight, but will remain hidden until peace is declared and then Germany, with what is left of it, will endeavor to build the largest fleet that ever existed and hopes thus to challenge England's fleet within fifteen or twenty years.

HORN WEEPS AS HE IS HANDCUFFED

Taken to Bangor Today—War May Be Over Before Canada Gets Him

Machias, Maine, March 8.—Werner Horn, a German, who attempted to blow up the bridge at Vanceboro, was taken to Bangor today for arraignment before a United States commissioner on a federal indictment charging violation of the laws regulating interstate transportation of explosives.

United States Marshal John S. Wilson deemed it advisable to handcuff Horn to a deputy.

ENGLISHMEN BELIEVE WAR HAS JUST BEGUN Guy Nickalls, Yale Rowing Coach, Just Arrived, Speaks of Conditions at Home New Haven, March 5—Guy Nickalls, who has arrived here to coach Yale's oarsmen for the June races, has given the Yale News an interesting interview on the war situation in England. He said: "We think the war has just begun. The balance wheel of a watch vibrates 360 times a minute, 432,000 times a day, or 157,680,000 times a year. Each vibration covers about 1/16 revolution, the shaft on which the balance wheel is mounted makes 236,230 revolutions in its bearings each year. The realization of its enormousness is just beginning to be felt. About the first of May we will begin in earnest. How long it will last is hard to say. It may continue a year, and it may go on for 18 months; but about a year from May they will begin to talk peace." In speaking about the army itself Mr. Nickalls said: "Lord Kitchener's army is recruited from the best stock of England. There are about 2000 Oxford and Cambridge undergraduates in the army. These men are the best athletes and the brainiest men of the two universities. Their physical fitness, combined with their ability, makes them excellent leaders. "There are now about 500,000 men in France, and about 5,500,000 men in training. The War Office does not give out any very definite news, as they do not want the Germans to know the strength of the English Army. The equipping of the English Army has been one of the marvels of the war. The English mills and factories have exceeded expectations."

THE WAR NEWS

The Greek Cabinet has resigned because King Constantine does not approve of its war policy. Premier Venizelos and his colleagues believe the time has come for Greece to enter the war on the side of the Allies.

Germany is much concerned over the situation in Italy. A very influential Italian journal has declared that in view of the attack upon the Dardanelles and the important changes which will follow the war Italy can hardly afford to remain neutral.

Near the head of the Persian Gulf British troops have again been in contact with the Turks. A reconnaissance by the British discovered the Turkish force estimated at about 12,000, and the reconnoitering party was pursued and some fighting occurred.

The Canadian casualty list issued yesterday contains among the list of wounded the names of members of half a dozen different battalions showing that a large portion of the first contingent must have been in action.

Another evidence of the failure of the threatened German blockade of Britain is found in the announcement that the passenger service between England and Holland, which was greatly restricted at the time the blockade was declared, is this week to be considerably extended.

AT LAST WE ARE SAFE The Clarke government is determined to defend its honor and its life, and the treasury of the province of New Brunswick. Official notice to this effect is given in The Standard this morning, with a special warning to "alien enemies."

persons such as those who got that \$100,000 out of the strong box of the lumbermen, and those who got away with the swag in connection with the Southampton Railway, to say nothing of certain Valley Railway transactions, potato purchases and the like, will find themselves confronted by a gentleman in khaki, with bayonet fixed, at the door of the legislative building.

Military sentries will probably be on duty as guards around parliament buildings during the entire approaching session of the legislature. War precautions of this kind have been taken at Ottawa and the various provincial capitals of the dominion, and the matter was given consideration by the New Brunswick government during their sessions here last week.

It is greatly to be deplored that Col. the Hon. Attorney-General Baxter was not sooner made the military advisor of the government. Had proper precautions been taken during the past two or three years, the province would be in a much better position today to meet the present public services.

The reports received by the department of militia concerning many of the boots supplied to the second contingent are to the effect that the boots were of miserable quality both in material and workmanship. Surely this is a shameful condition of affairs.

Today's cables say that an important offensive movement by the allies in Belgium, France and Alsace is developing. The Germans are now outnumbered, and the advantage is with the allies.

The latest rumor regarding the German naval policy is that the German fleet will remain hidden until the war is over, and then Germany will proceed to construct the largest fleet that ever existed.

The Assembly hall of the high school is a proper place for the discussion of such a subject as town-planning, which concerns the welfare of all citizens. The high school building is the property of the people.

Rev. Ralph J. Haughton would like to see a great get-together movement in St. John, regardless of social and class distinctions and religious and political differences, to solve certain social problems which bear heavily upon the hearts of all who are thoroughly familiar with social conditions.

The War News in Last Night's Cables

London, March 7, 10.45 p. m.—Greece apparently is at the parting of the ways, with her king exerting his influence to maintain the neutrality of his country in opposition to Eleutherios Venizelos, the retiring premier, and the man to whom Greece owes her revival. M. Venizelos yesterday announced the resignation of himself and his cabinet, as King Constantine did not approve the policy of the government. Today, in the Chamber of Deputies, M. Venizelos clearly indicated that the difference between him and the monarch was over the question of peace and war. He said he had advised the king to select as a new premier M. Zaimis, governor of the National Bank, who, he said, "will follow a policy of neutrality, which I hope will not endanger our newly acquired territory."

A grand council of ministers was held at Athens today, under the presidency of King Constantine, and as Venizelos was leaving the palace at its conclusion, he was acclaimed by the populace. AT THE DARDANIELS London, March 7.—The British battleships Queen Elizabeth and Prince George and the battle cruiser Inflexible, with their eight 15-inch guns and an even dozen 12-inch guns, on Friday opened an attack on the principal forts on the European side of the narrows in the Dardanelles. Two of the forts were damaged, and the magazine of a third was blown up. These forts, which guard the narrowest part of the Straits from the European side, are believed to be the strongest along the entire waterway, although those on the opposite side of the narrows almost equal them.

One of these forts, marked on the Admiralty maps as L, is armed with two 14-inch guns that could hardly reach the Queen Elizabeth, which fired twenty-nine rounds from her 15-inch weapons by indirect fire, and had the advantage of aeroplanes to direct her gunners. The other two forts were armed with three 11-inch guns and some smaller ones. The forts were also armed with machine guns. On Wednesday last the ships continued the bombardment of Fort Dardanus, on the Asiatic side of the Dardanelles. Destroyers and mine-sweepers are pursuing the work of clearing the outer Straits of mines. French ships are keeping up a bombardment from the Gulf of Saros.

Last night's official despatch from the Admiralty disclosed that the East Indies fleet, under Vice-Admiral Sir Richard Peirse, who is flying his flag on the Buryalis, has joined the allied fleet, and that he undertook the bombardment of the fortifications of Smyrna which were seriously damaged.
