BISHOP'S ADDRESS.

His Lordship the Bishop then addressed the Synod as
follows:—

MY DEAR BRETHREN :

I was unable to hold a session of the Synod at the usual time of the year on
account of my absence in England. The Corporation of Trinity College com-

missioned the Lord Bishop of Toronto, Mr. John Cartwright and myself to go to England and select a successor to the late Provost. I accepted the responsibility with reluctance, but with a sincere desire to promote the best interests of the institution with which I have been so long connected. We succeeded in finding in the Rev. C. Body, a Fellow of St. John's College, Cambridge, a worthy successor to Provost Whitaker. He is a gentleman of most distinguished scholarship, and has almost all the qualifications requisite for the office of Provost of a Church of England University. I pray that under his administration, the College to which this Diocese is so much indebted for a supply of well educated candidates for Holy Orders may continue to receive our encouragement and support, and to send forth men duly qualified, in these dangerous days, to illustrate and defend the doctrines of the Church.

Having accomplished the object of my mission to England I thought it better not to return home immediately, as the summer was far advanced, but to recruit my health by spending some time on the Continent and chiefly in Switzerland. Hence the late period in the year at which our present session takes place.

You are aware that at the last session of the Provincial Synod the following Canon was enacted: "A Deacon need not surrender his worldly calling or business (said calling being approved by the Bishop) unless he be a candidate for the office of a Priest, and he shall not be admitted to the Priesthood, till he shall have passed a satisfactory examination in Latin and Greek, and have further complied with such other requirements as the Bishop of the Diocese may impose."

I had the pleasure of ordaining the first Deacon under this Canon last Sunday, and I earnestly hope that as time goes on many religiously disposed laymen, whose secular pursuits are not inconsistent with the office of a Deacon, may be disposed to devote part of their time and energy to giving assistance to Priests of large Parishes and Missions, and so enable them to cover ground now unoccupied. It seems to me that the Synod ought to pass a Canon regulating the designation and status of such Deacons, declaring whether they shall be qualified to be members of the Synod or not, and providing that they shall not, by virtue of their ordination or license, have any claim on the funds of the Synod. It might be well to appoint a Committee to report on this important matter during our present session.

That from and after the payment to the Rev. F. L. Stephenson of his claim against the Frankford Endowment Fund, the whole income of said Fund be applied for the benefit of the Parish of Frankford, and that the principal sum be henceforth known as "The Frankford Endowment Fund."

This amendment, being accepted as a substitute for the original motion, was carried unanimously.

Dr. Clarke, asking that permission be granted to sell the old site of Christ Church, Belleville, subject to certain conditions, your Committee recommend that, as the subject matter of the sale has been submitted to and acted on by the Executive Committee, the resolution of that Committee be carried out.

That as to the Memorial from the Incumbent and Churchwardens of Trinity Church, Frankford, asking permission to fence, survey and lay out in Cemetery Lots certain land belonging to the Church in that Parish, your Committee cannot advise in the matter as they have not before them the deeds of the property so that the Trusts on which the land is held can be ascertained; and that the Memorial be submitted to the Executive Committee with power to act.

2. That a part of the endowment of the said Parish of Hillier is made up of a certain parcel of land, (24 acres) being a part of Lot Number 22 in the Third Concession of the Township of Hillier.

3. By reason of distance and difficulty of access the said land is a very unprofitable investment, yielding not more than three per cent. interest.

4. Therefore it has always been felt by the Congregation of the said Church that the above parcel of land should be sold and the proceeds invested to better advantage. Hence at a Vestry meeting, held on the 18th day of April, 1881, it was moved by John Groydon, seconded by Albert E. Babbitt, and carried unanimously, "That in consideration of the above mentioned glebe having been purchased contrary to the nature of the trusts and withal not a profitable investment, permission be respectfully asked of the Synod to sell the said glebe, the proceeds thereof to be invested according to the nature of the trust."

II.—REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE AS TO PARNELL LOSSES ON MORTGAGE SECURITIES.

The Special Committee, appointed at the last session of the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario to examine into the condition of the mortgage securities, to ascertain the amount paid upon the principal and for interest on such securities to the late Clerical Secretary, and if those amounts have been credited on the books of the Synod, beg leave to report :

That the only plan which your Committee could adopt to ascertain with any degree of certainty what had been paid on the mortgage securities, was to communicate with the several mortgagors. This was done; some answered, producing receipts for monies not entered in the books of the Synod by the late Clerical Secretary. Others replied stating that they had receipts for money, but not producing them, and a few sent no answer whatever. From the information collected, your Committee have ascertained with reasonable certainty, that independently of the Warwick mortgages hereinafter referred to, very many and large sums appear to have been received by the Rev. T. A. Parnell in his official capacity as Clerical Secretary of the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario, on account of the mortgage securities belonging to that body, which have not been entered by him in the books of the Synod, or placed to its credit. As to the Warwick and Robinson mortgages, and the Sanderson farm, securities belonging to the Clergy Trust Fund, on comparing the entries in some books kept by the late Clerical Secretary of the monies received by him on those accounts, with the credits given by the Treasurer of the Synod, your Committee have ascertained that the Rev. T. A. Parnell stands indebted to the Synod in the sum of \$3,289.51 for interest received and not accounted for, and in the further sum of \$708.69 for principal monies collected by him as final payments on the respective mortgages which were discharged on his statements and not paid in. The books relating to these securities appear never to have been submitted to the Auditors, and their existence seems to have been unknown to them, as appears by their last report in the JOURNAL OF SYNOD, it having been understood that the accounts connected with the Warwick mortgages were kept by the Treasurer of the Synod alone.

The total indebtedness of the Rev. T. A. Parnell to the Synod of Ontario arising out of its mortgage securities, is the sum of \$11,476.95, which is distributed among the different funds of the Synod as follows :

The details of the several sums received by him, and not credited, are set forth in the appendix to this report.

Your Committee find that the payments on all other mortgage securities of the Synod appear to have been credited and entered in the books of the Synod, and that such mortgages are in a satisfactory position, and they would remark that the greater portion of the defalcations of the late Clerical Secretary now reported on, and connected with the Synod securities, other than the Warwick mortgages, have occurred during the last four years of his holding that office.

*Your Committee are obliged to express their regret that the Rev. T. A. Parnell has not given them that assistance which, as a late member of the Synod, he was morally bound to render towards clearing up or explaining the many serious irregularities which have occurred during his tenure of office.

In conclusion, your Committee regret to report that they consider the sum of \$11,476.95, owing by the late Clerical Secretary to the Synod is a total loss.

Reports of Standing Committees.

I.—REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AS TO REV. T. A. PARNELL.

The Special Committee appointed to examine into the condition of the Mortgage securities presented a report at the meeting of the Executive Committee, held on the 2nd December, 1880. The Report showed that the sum of \$8,874.36 had then been found to be due to the Synod by the late Clerical Secretary on account of Mortgage Securities. After discussion it was resolved that no money be paid to the Ven. Archdeacon Parnell until he had arranged to secure or repay his apparent difficulties to the various funds; and a sub-committee was appointed and authorized to take such measures as they might deem necessary to arrange with the Archdeacon and to secure from him the payment of his indebtedness. It was also resolved that if the sub-committee made any satisfactory arrangement with the Archdeacon he should be allowed credit for the three months salary voted to him by the Synod, the same to be assessed on the various funds as is the Clerical Secretary's salary.

A special meeting of the Committee was held on February 15th, 1881, in pursuance of notice issued by order of the Bishop for general business and to receive the report of the sub-committee appointed to receive securities from the late Secretary to meet his indebtedness to the Synod.

The sub-committee presented their report, showing that all the security the Rev. T. A. Parnell was able to offer to secure his indebtedness of \$13,000 was two life insurance policies (\$3,000); his interest in his late residence in Kingston; and five shares in the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Co'y of a total cash value in all of \$939.11. That these had been assigned; that the Rev. T. A. Parnell stated that he had no further assets, but offered to insure his life for \$9,000 for the benefit of the Synod. This offer the Committee could not see their way to accept as the premiums would have to be paid out of the Synod funds.

It was then resolved that the defalcations and conduct of the late Clerical Secretary were such that the Committee felt that the Bishop should at once issue a Commission under the Eighth Canon to relieve the Diocese from the existing scandal and evil report; also earnestly recommending the Bishop, pending such Commission, to suspend Archdeacon Parnell from all Clerical ministrations and duties; also that a sub-committee prepare for the information of the Bishop a statement of the moneys which appear to have been received by the late Clerical Secretary and not entered by him; such information to form the ground of the investigation recommended. This statement was sent.

It was also resolved that the necessary payments should be made to revive the lapsed policies in the life of Archdeacon Parnell, upon their being assigned, such payments to be charged against the moneys coming to him.

At the regular meeting of the Committee, held on 5th May, 1881, the Bishop made a report of what had been done in pursuance of the resolutions passed at the February meeting of the Committee, stating that the Clerical Secretary had anticipated by submission the action of the Commission appointed under the 8th Canon, and subsequently by resignation of all his preferments the sentence of twelve months suspension which his lordship was about to pronounce; and that he had severed his connection with this Diocese as far as could be done until he should actually leave its bounds.

His Lordship's report was declared to be perfectly satisfactory to the Committee.

As the stock in R. & O. N. Co. had been the property of Mrs. Parnell, and as she had assigned it and had concurred in the assignment of the house on certain conditions which the Committee could not adopt, it was then resolved that in view of the circumstances under which the transfers were made to the Synod of certain shares in the Richelieu & Ontario Navigation Co. stock, and the late Clerical Secretary's house in Kingston, the said stock and house be conveyed to Mrs. Parnell, and that on Dr. Parnell leaving the Diocese the arrears of his commutation to date be paid to him.

Dr. Parnell having left the Diocese he has been paid his arrears of commutation, \$240; and equity of redemption as to the house, and the stock have been assigned to Mrs. Parnell.

At the meeting held on September 8th the question of apportioning the losses arising to the various funds from the late Clerical Secretary was referred to a sub-committee to report.

The Committee in conclusion would state that the Synod now holds as security for the indebtedness of the late Clerical Secretary the following policies on the life of Rev. T. A. Parnell:

- (1) One for £500 stg., with profits payable at death, in London and Lancashire Life Assurance Co.; premium \$62.50.
- (2) One for £200 stg., with profits in Standard Life Ass. Co., payable at death; premium \$29.15.
- (3) One in Equitable Life Assurance Society for \$1,000; premium \$39.50; Tontine system; period expires June 1884; value estimated, \$300.
- (4) One in Equitable Life for \$2,000; premium \$72.92; Tontine period expires 20th May, 1882; value estimated, \$550.

To keep up these policies there will be for the present an annual outlay of \$4.07.

The Committee recommends that these policies be kept alive for the benefit of the funds that have suffered from the defalcations, and that the premiums be charged *pro rata* upon the said funds.

II.—REPORT OF CLERGY TRUST FUND COMMITTEE.

The Clergy Trust Fund Committee beg leave to report :

That the Treasurer's report for the year ending April 30th, 1880, shows the state of the fund as follows :

From which it would appear that the debit balance has decreased \$1,411.43 in one year.

From the clear statement of the Clerical Secretary we gather that the present income of the fund is \$14,700.75. Of this sum \$13,512.48 is paid to Clergy on Commutation List ; \$759.15 goes for expenses, and \$270 is set aside to recoup capital. The total of expenditure is \$14,541.63, which being deducted from income leaves a balance of \$159 in our favour.

Your Committee regret that they have not been able to place the name of another Clergyman on the Commutation List, notwithstanding the fact that one commutation clergyman has lately died and another has left the Diocese, but it hopes soon to be able to do so although it will have for many years to set aside \$270 from interest to recoup capital.

It has been discovered that the late Secretary of Synod was in the habit of allowing a large sum of the Capital of its Fund to remain in bank uninvested in order that the Mission Fund might escape paying interest on its large indebtedness. Your Committee have taken steps to remedy this in the future.

III.—REPORT OF THE FOREIGN MISSION COMMITTEE.

The Committee to whom is entrusted the management of the funds subscribed within the Diocese for work outside its limits, beg leave to report their proceedings for the financial year ending April 30th, 1881.

Contributions amounting to the sum of \$970.10 have been received by them during this period from 51 parishes in the Diocese. Of this amount the sum of \$646.45 was paid, as directed by the parishes contributing, to the Algoma Diocesan Fund, out of which the Missionary Clergy of that District are supported. A further sum of \$250.46 was forwarded to the Rev. E. F. Wilson in aid of his Indian Homes, an amount mainly contributed by Sunday Schools which have undertaken to aid the philanthropic work carried on in behalf of the remnant of the aboriginal inhabitants to be found in the District of Algoma. Other minor contributions were forwarded in accordance with specific directions, to various other recognized missionary efforts of the Church. While conscious that comparatively little has yet been done by the Diocese for Missionary work other than that lying within her borders, the Committee are glad to be able to report as favourably as they now do, and they express the hope that the current year may witness a marked growth in the interest taken in the work committed to their care.

They beg to call attention to the fact that Boards for the promotion of Foreign and Domestic Mission work have been created in connection with the Provincial Synod of Canada, and they regard themselves as under an obligation to bespeak from their brethren, Clerical and Lay, a cordial co-operation with these in furthering the ends in view. Hereto is appended a statement of the Receipts and Disbursements which have found place during the period covered by this report.

absence of their Chairman, the Ven. the Archdeacon of Ottawa, as well as of the Rev. Charles Forest, his predecessor in the chair. Still more do they deplore the cause of this absence, the serious ill health of these Reverend brethren, who have been so long their fellow labourers on the Board, and always earnest promoters of the Mission work of the Diocese. We do not doubt that the Synod as well as the Board will rejoice if it seems good to God to restore them to their places and ministrations among us.

It may be remembered that the Report presented to the Synod at its last Session (1880) drew attention to the fact that for some years previously expenditure had exceeded income. The necessity was therefore urged of adopting a policy of retrenchment. It was recommended (a) to remove from the list of Beneficiaries those Missions which seemed best able to sustain themselves, (b) to grant no outfit for a time, (c) to re-classify the Missions, and (d) to make a reduction of 10 per cent. on all the grants.

The Synod adopted these recommendations, and the Board is now happy to state that the result has proved satisfactory. *Income* has this year exceeded *Expenditure* by \$759.69, as will be shown in the following statement of receipts and disbursements:—

The estimates for the current year have been based on the earnest hope that the income of the Board will not fall behind that of last year. But it is certain that every exertion is required to enable us to meet existing engagements to say nothing of extending our operations. In a great many localities the Church has lost strong supporters, wealthy farmers who have moved away to the North West, and it is to be feared we must face an emigration of this character for some time to come. The immediate effect of it must be the taxing of all our energies to maintain our existing missions, while the increasing of the stipends of the Missionary Clergy, for which we have long been striving, is postponed indefinitely. The following appropriation has been made by the Board for 1881-82 :

The Board in presenting this estimate would draw attention to three items. First, they most sincerely regret the necessity of the 10 per cent. deduction on the grants ; but they desire to have it understood that if the Collections during this current year can be made to realize \$9,000.00—which should be feasible considering the prosperity of the country—they will then be in a position both to pay off \$1,000 of the overdrawn balance to which they are pledged, and also they will have the gratification of increasing the stipends of the Missionaries by restoring the 10 per cent. deduction, and relieving these Clergymen of a tax which their limited stipends can ill afford.

In the next place, it will be observed that the estimate of Pensions has been increased. The Committee regret that the provisions of Canon XXVII have not been carried out, which it was believed would provide "for the non-Communicating Clergy of the Diocese should they become incapacitated by illness, age or infirmity."

And thirdly, the Board would express regret that no Clergyman has been found to avail himself of the liberal grant to the new Mission west of Pembroke. The Board very willingly responded to the representations made as to the claims on their funds from that remote part of the Diocese, and they hope that by this notice the attention of some zealous Clergyman may be drawn to what is most truly a *Missionary sphere of duty*.

Now that in nearly every Mission there are not only well built and well appointed Churches, but a comfortable Parsonage house, the people are free to contribute more liberally to the support of the Clergyman. And the time is drawing near when some limit must be placed to the period for which any grants can be made. Surely, after a Mission has been helped for twenty years, during which the people have been learning to appreciate the blessings of all the means of grace, and have been enabled (often through the generous liberality of outside brethren) to erect a respectable House of Prayer, and a residence for their Clergyman, it is then time that they should depend altogether upon themselves for the ministrations of the Church, and willingly subscribe the small amount of (say) \$800 as the stipend of a Minister of Christ. We would submit to our good brethren in all parts of the Diocese that it should be a matter of honourable pride to be rivals in raising their contributions to this self-sustaining level, and becoming independent of eleemosynary grants, which should be freed for those parts alone in which the Church members are few and poor,—so few and so poor that without this aid they must be lost to the Church, and perhaps lost to Christ forever.

VI.—REPORT OF DIVINITY STUDENTS' FUND COMMITTEE.

To the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario :

The Divinity Students' Fund Committee, in submitting their annual Report, take pleasure in stating that the amount of the collections for the year 1880-81 somewhat exceeds that of previous years, which, doubtless, is due to the fact that a smaller number of Parishes than usual were in default—only twelve—which are: Almonte, Bell's Corners, Cumberland, Eganville, Kemptville, Madoc, Nepean, Pakenham, Portsmouth, Shannonville, Tamworth and Trenton. Only one Student received aid from the Fund during the year, viz.: Mr. Wm. Moore, whose grant is \$100.

Several beneficiaries of the fund having failed to comply with the conditions under which they received their grants, and being consequently indebted to the Fund, the Clerical Secretary, at the instance of the Committee, wrote to them upon the subject. From one no reply was received. Another pleaded that he purposed to present himself for Holy Orders, and the remaining three alleged excuses for the non-performance of their duty, the force of which the committee are quite unable to perceive. In view of this state of things, the committee have resolved in future to admit none upon their list of beneficiaries except those who are willing to give bonds satisfactory to the Chancellor for the fulfilment of the conditions of the Canon in this behalf. Messrs. William Moore and R. N. Jones, now enjoying grants, have deposited such bonds.

1—Auditors' Report.

To the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario :

We, the Auditors appointed at the last session of Synod, have the honour to present the following report respecting the Synod accounts for the year ending the 30th April, 1881 :

Our audit was begun in the month of November, 1880, and was completed at the close of the financial year. We have, as in former years, employed a professional accountant to check the entries and prepare the necessary statements, and we submit his certificate with our report.

Events which have recently happened induce us to recall the observations made in our former reports respecting the difficulty, if not the impossibility, of certifying absolutely to the correctness of the Synod accounts. The difficulty arises in connection with moneys received on account of land sales, mortgages, collections and donations. This difficulty was suggested as far back as the year 1869, and to meet it, it was directed by the Synod that a receipt book should be kept from which a receipt should be given for all moneys paid in, the particulars of which should be entered on a counterfoil retained in the book. The efficacy of this system of checking receipts must depend on the faithfulness of the Synod's Clerical Secretary. At the close of the year when the auditors examine the accounts a mortgage is produced as a voucher. It is impossible for the auditors to know what has been paid upon this mortgage except from the entries in the account and receipt books. The same difficulty occurs in connection with the other sources of revenue to which we have alluded. We are informed that the committee on mortgage securities appointed at the last session of the Synod were engaged in correspondence with the several mortgagors for some months, and that at the end of that time they had only such information as the mortgagors chose to give them.

The auditing of mortgage accounts is of so much importance, that one of your auditors has consulted some of the managers of large Loan Companies on the subject. He finds, however, that no scheme, which can be successfully carried out in actual practice, has been devised which can insure the absolute certainty of moneys received being duly credited.

Confidence must be placed in some one, and that confidence may be abused whatever checks may be devised.

We present this year for the first time a balance sheet in connection with each fund, and a general cash balance sheet of all the funds. It is proposed that these sheets shall be prepared and presented yearly.

We are glad to be able to state that there has been a return, in the Clerical Secretary's office, to something like regular system. The moneys received are entered and deposited promptly, and the books appear to have been systematically posted. There are no cash balances to be carried forward at the end of each month, and the bank accounts correspond (except as respect outstanding cheques) with the several cash accounts.

It was found necessary in order to balance the books properly to open accounts with the late Clerical Secretary in connection with those funds of or to which he appeared to be a creditor or a debtor. The state of the account in this respect at the end of the year 1879-80 can be found on page 1748, JOURNAL OF SYNOD. The late Secretary had two credit balances, one in connection with the Mission Fund, the other in connection with the Assessment Fund. The Mission Fund balance has been cancelled by charging against it an equal amount for moneys received by him on account of the fund, but omitted from the books. (See report of sub-committee of Mission Board, May, 1881.) The particulars of these charges appear in the Mission Fund statement. The Assessment Fund balance was reduced by established payments to \$410.71, which was carried to a suspense account in connection with the same fund pending the final adjustment of the account. It appears from the report of the Finance Committee (presented 5th of May, 1881,) that considerable sums were sent to the late Clerical Secretary for assessments which were never credited by him.

The late Secretary's debit cash balances in connection with the other funds have been largely increased during the past year by the discovery of payments made to him on mortgage securities which had not been entered in the books. These payments appear in the report of the Committee on mortgage securities, and the accounts have been corrected by crediting them to the several mortgagors and debiting them to the late Clerical Secretary, the debit balances against whom (omitting the Clergy Trust balance) are now as follows:

The balance due to the Clergy Trust Fund has been ascertained by the Committee to be the sum of \$3,998.20.

All the payments made out of the Synod funds during the past year have been duly vouched by cheques. *

SUSTENTATION FUND.

The securities belonging to the Sustentation Fund, which are mentioned in our last report at p. 1748, are still held by the Bank of Montreal as security for the overdraft of the Mission Fund account. We have to call attention to a debenture due by St. George's Cathedral for \$200 on which no interest has been paid for several years. This debenture should be collected at once.

MISSION FUND.

We are glad to be able to state that the Mission Fund debt to the Bank of Montreal has been materially reduced during the past year. The apparent reduction is the sum of \$1,311.69, but from this sum must be taken the sum of \$582, the amount of some charges which should have been but were not made before the close of the financial year, leaving a balance of \$759.69, the true amount of reduction.

The missions of Roslyn and Moulinette have been overpaid respectively the sums of \$12.50 and \$25 for the quarter ending the 30th June, 1880. The Secretary states in explanation that the cheques were made out by his predecessor and were issued by him on the assumption that the amounts were correct.

EPISCOPAL FUND.

The debit balance due by the interest account of the Episcopal Fund has been reduced during the past year by the sum of \$793.12. This amount does not comprise a sum of \$537 interest received by the late Clerical Secretary and omitted from the books, (though this sum has been credited to interest account), as it can hardly be regarded as a valuable asset and will probably have to be written off.

RECTORY LANDS' FUND.

We have much satisfaction in stating that since our last report several important matters in connection with this fund have been disposed of. The expense account has been apportioned in accordance with the report of the committee appointed at the last session of the Synod, (page 1740) and has thus been wiped out. The discrepancy between the general cash account and the aggregate of the cash accounts of the several Rectories has been adjusted so that they now balance. A separate cash account has been opened for each Rector since the 30th of April, 1881. In the statements of the capital funds prepared by the accountant there are certain amounts charged to the late Secretary for moneys received by him and not accounted for. These amounts have not been specifically apportioned in the books, but the aggregate stands generally to the debit of the late Clerical Secretary and must be apportioned when his accounts are finally adjusted.

DIVINITY STUDENTS' FUND.

The note of Rev. W. R. Clarke, mentioned as one of the assets of this fund, cannot be found. The interest on it has, however, been paid. The Clerical Secretary states he never had this note.

ASSESSMENT FUND.

Several of the parishes appear to be still in arrear as regards their assessments. The balance at the debit of this fund must be disposed of yearly so that it may not increase.

A statement of the general expenses of the Synod has been prepared and is herewith submitted. The amount of the expenses is about the same as last year.

The bank balances agree with those in the Secretary's books except so far as the differences are caused by outstanding cheques.

We examined the securities in the Bank of Montreal twice during the year. Those transferable by delivery we found to be in the joint possession of the Treasurer and Clerical Secretary. The mortgages are all in the possession of the Secretary, with the exception of those in the Solicitor's hands, for which vouchers were produced, and the Warwick mortgages hereinafter mentioned.

Referring to the missing securities mentioned in our last report, we find :

1. That the two shares of Dominion stock belonging to the Shannonville Endowment have been paid up, and the money deposited to the credit of the Rectory land account. The amount paid has been credited to the Endowment.
2. That the Ameliasburgh Endowment deposit receipt had also been cashed and the money deposited. The amount has been credited to the proper account.
3. That the Thompson mortgage had been paid up and discharged, though no entry had been made of the payment.
5. That Patrick Kelly's mortgage was subsequently found, but only \$250 was due on it, \$100 having been paid but not entered on the books.

There are no Warwick mortgages in the hands of the Treasurer or Secretary and the amount represented in the Treasurer's statement to be due upon them should be charged to the late Clerical Secretary, to whom it appears to have been paid.

No ledger accounts have been kept, or are kept of the Clergy Trust mortgages. This should not be. Either the Treasurer or the Clerical Secretary should open proper accounts in the same manner as is done with the other securities.

The amounts received by the late Clerical Secretary on mortgages, and omitted from his books, are particularly stated in the report of the Committee on Mortgages, which is all the information we have respecting them. This report as been acted on by the Secretary in making up his accounts.

In conclusion we have to state that though the recent losses to the funds must be a source of deep regret, yet the accounts are now in all other respects in a satisfactory condition, clear, and easily understood.

Full statements of accounts accompany this report.

GENTLEMEN—In reporting to you the result of my examination of the books of the several Funds belonging to the Synod of Ontario, I feel it necessary to explain that from May 1st to June 18th, 1880, the portion of the year in which the late Clerical Secretary held office, I found that no regular entries had been made in the Synod books. I was therefore obliged to collect into the daily blotter from the various letters, receipt stubs, and memoranda the various items belonging to the several funds, and from thence enter into the Cash Books and post into the Ledgers. Since the present Secretary's incumbency the entries have been made in the most systematic manner. At first, through not understanding the nature of some entries, a few errors were made, which have since been set right.

In connection with the several funds I have carefully examined the original entries, and compared them, as far as possible, with the vouchers therefor. The additions have been examined and a balance sheet prepared for each fund, proving the correctness of the same.

The form of the financial statements of previous years having been objected to by some as unsatisfactory, I have made such changes therein as I trust will remove all ground of objection and make them clear and satisfactory to all.
