

Pekin, Jan. 22—Speculation as to the future of China's dependencies generall will be stimulated by Russia's action in Mongolia. The latter had already declared its independence, and others of the vast borderland regions, notably Thibe which have hitherto nominally acknow edged China's sway, have threatened to ollow its example. An interesting review of the situation in these outlying terrories was recently made by a well in cormed authority, who predicted a general preak away should a republic be established.
