



General Information.

ALL seats being free, the maintenance of the Church depends entirely upon the voluntary contributions of the members and adherents. It is therefore the duty of every member and adherent to undertake to give a certain sum of money EACH SABBATH. "*Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him.*"—1st Cor. xvi. 2.

As envelopes will be issued to anyone contributing five cents and upwards weekly, the system is within the reach of all.

It is to be hoped that every member and adherent of the Church, whether old or young, who has an income, will ask for envelopes and give according to his or her means.

Statements will be rendered every half year showing with what regularity contributions have been made.

A committee of the managers is in attendance at the close of the weekly prayer meeting to allocate sittings.

Envelopes can be obtained in the vestibule before or after any of the Sabbath services, from Mr. P. B. Martin, who is in attendance there.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation.

January 16th, 1895.

Pursuant to notice read from the pulpit on the two preceding Sabbaths, the Annual Meeting was held this evening in the lecture hall.

The meeting was opened by prayer, and reading by the pastor.

The chair was occupied by the Rev. Alex. Gilray.

It was moved by Mr. D. W. Clarke, seconded by Mr. W. Elder, that Mr. James Brown act as Secretary. Carried.

The minutes of the last Annual Meeting as printed in the year book were accepted as read.

Nominations for the five vacancies in the Board of Managers were then made, which resulted in the election of Messrs. Dr. Gordon, A. Findlay, W. J. McCullough, W. R. Miller, P. Whytock for three years; the scrutineers being D. W. Clarke, C. R. Peterkin, Wm. Calder, T. Cook, T. McCullough, P. B. Martin.

The Session's report was read by the Rev. Alex. Gilray, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The report for the Board of Managers was read by Mr. James Brown, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Sunday School report was read by Mr. W. A. Findlay, who moved its acceptance. Carried

Mr. James Brown moved the acceptance of the Treasurer's report as printed, and in the hands of the members present.

The Women's Foreign Missionary report was read by the Secretary of the meeting, on behalf of Miss Elsie Clarke, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Speedwell Mission Band report was read by Miss J. Hamner, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Bible Class report was read by Mr. Chas. Hume, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Y. P. S. C. E. report was read by Mr. R. Clarke, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

The Women's Auxiliary report was read on behalf of Miss Wooley by the Secretary of the meeting, who moved its acceptance. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. G. E. Dalby, seconded by Mr. J. Joss, that the following gentlemen be Trustees for 1895: Messrs. Jas. Turnbull, B.A., Thos. Adams, and H. F. Sharpe. Carried.

It was moved by Mr. C. R. Peterkin, seconded by Mr. Wm. Clarke, that Messrs. Gardiner and Smith be re-elected Auditors for the coming year. Carried.

The Auditors were tendered a vote of thanks for their services.

It was moved by Mr. A. E. Bastedo, seconded by Mr. H. F. Sharpe, that the thanks of the congregation be, and is hereby, tendered the Secretary of the meeting for his report.

Mr. C. R. Peterkin, the Treasurer, was tendered the hearty thanks of the congregation for his untiring services during the past year, on the motion of Mr. James Brown, seconded by Mr. W. J. McCullough, to which Mr. Peterkin briefly replied.

A vote of thanks was also tendered the Board of Managers for their services during the past year, it being moved by Mr. Wm. Elder, seconded by Mr. T. Adams. Carried.

A vote of thanks was also tendered the choir, this motion being made by Mr. D. B. Gardiner, seconded by Mr. J. Joss.

Mr. Young, of Winnipeg, one of the original members of the congregation, briefly addressed the meeting.

The Session's report was received and adopted as read without discussion.

Mr. James Turnbull, B.A., moved that the Report of the Board of Managers be received. In moving its acceptance he spoke tellingly of the matters referred to in same, and particularly as regards the responsibility of the congregation giving regularly, and of the ordinary revenue requiring to be increased during the coming year. Mr. D. B. Gardiner seconded this, also speaking in the same strain, after which the Report was received and adopted.

Mr. Wm. Clarke moved, seconded by Mr. Grant, that the several other reports, as read, be received and adopted. Carried.

Mr. John Joss moved that the following be a committee to compile and prepare the "Annual Report," and that the minutes of this meeting be inscribed therein: Mr. Jas. Turnbull, B.A., C. R. Peterkin, and James Brown. Carried.

This closed the business of the meeting, which was closed by prayer.

NOTE.—The Report of the Junior S. of C. E., owing to its not being ready, was not submitted at the meeting, but is embodied in one of the following pages. No summary is made of any of the reports referred to in the different minutes, as each of them is printed in full in the following pages.

Report of Session.

The Session are glad to be able to report a very satisfactory addition to the membership in 1894. Ninety-two were added by certificate, and 42 by profession, making 134. Eighty-three members were removed by certificate, 7 by death, and 18 by reason of absence from ordinances, making a total of 108, thus leaving a net gain of 26. The number of members in January, 1894, was 800. It is now 826.

There were 15 baptisms during the year—2 adults and 13 infants.

It is gratifying to the Session to be in a position to say that all the different organizations in the church have been remarkably successful under the blessing of the Master. Spiritual prosperity has characterized every department of church work. The attendance at Sabbath School and Bible Class has been in advance of the previous year, and the results have been very encouraging to all concerned.

In conclusion, the Session wish to express their thanks to all those in connection with the various organizations of the church, for their valuable service rendered during the year, and they pray that the Divine blessing may, in rich measure, rest upon the whole congregation unitedly, and all the members and adherents individually.

Managers' Annual Report.

It is with every reason of thankfulness to God, for His goodness to us as a congregation, that your Board present their Annual Report for 1894.

It will be unnecessary for us to comment on the various departments connected with our church, as each of these departments will present its report separately. It is pleasant to note, however, that each has been carrying on its work in a satisfactory manner, and we have every reason to be thankful for the progress made.

In 1893 the open collections amounted to \$1,138.83, and during the past year \$1,056.46, a decrease of \$82.37. The revenue received from the envelopes during 1893 was \$3,896.68, and during 1894 \$3,602.17, a decrease of \$294.51, or a total decrease of our direct revenue for 1894 of \$376.88.

The average collection for 1893 was \$96.83 per Sabbath, and the average collection for 1894 was \$89.77 per Sabbath.

It will be noticed from the financial statement in your hands that \$4,658.63 was received from the ordinary revenue, and placed at the disposal of your Board for the conducting of the affairs of the church, along with \$970 received from other sources, which was \$554.77 less than the amount required for this work. If you will take these figures into your serious consideration, you will at once understand the trying position in which your Treasurer was placed. You will understand, and realize the very great importance of every member's giving according to his or her ability regularly, from the beginning to the end of the year.

It will be necessary for the congregation during the year to materially increase the ordinary revenue, so as

to be able to overtake the shortage of last year, and to keep up with our current expenses. Your Board will require to have \$1,200 more at their disposal for 1895.

This might be made up in the following manner:

Say 100 of the members increase their contributions 10c. per Sabbath, which would give us \$520 more.

And 200 contributors increase their contributions 5c. per Sabbath; this would give \$520.

And 100 contributors increase their contributions 2c. per Sabbath, which would amount to \$104, making a net increase of \$1,144.

Whilst a number in the congregation have realized deeply the necessity of increased contributions, as the following figures show, it is necessary that a still greater number add to their contributions. There are at the present time:

At the present time there are only 273 envelopes in use each Sabbath. There is no reason why 600 should not be using them in the congregation. Suppose we take it by families, and say there are the following number of families able to give these amounts regularly.

There are 10 or 12 families aggregating in their yearly subscription \$500, and say

100 families are able to give 50c. per Sab.; this w'd amt. to \$2,600.00

This is a duty contributors should realize as devolving on each individual, and he or she should feel responsible for a reasonable proportion of this, and it is their duty to see that it is given regularly.

If the members would join heartily in some such increase, and keep the same up regularly throughout the year, your Board would not require to be getting up special entertainments from time to time, or be asking additional help from the congregation; and, with such a sum as stated above, they would be able to pay about \$500 off our floating debt during the year, whereas we ought to pay at least \$1,000 per year off our debt. We are sure if the congregation will take this matter into consideration, they would much prefer this way to add to the treasury.

Before closing our report, we might here refer to the special subscriptions which the congregation generally joined in giving towards the end of the year, and fully paid up to the amount of \$1,206.65, which amount, as explained at the time, was to apply on the floating debt. This was done, and the Board has to thank the congregation for their support in the matter.

Thankfully acknowledging the guidance and blessing of the great Head of the Church in the past, we would commend us all to His grace during the future.

Synopsis of
Sabbath School Superintendent's Report.

In reviewing the work of our Sabbath School for the past year we are led to thank God for His goodness in enabling us to do something in leading the young to the Saviour.

The attendance has been good. Many of the Scholars have been very punctual and very regular in their attendance.

The contributions have been fair. The order is much improved, and an increased spirit of reverence shown.

The number uniting with the Church has been encouraging. The older scholars are remaining to a large extent in the school instead of leaving, as is sometimes the case. The increased and more comfortable accommodation and the exertions of the teachers have had much to do in bringing about this result. The library is well managed, for which we have to thank the librarians.

Our losses by death have been few, but not the less felt on that account.

One of our teachers, Mr. Walker, has left us for more trying work in the North-West.

The co-operation of the parents is earnestly requested, as no body of teachers can succeed to any extent without it.

The question of teachers' meetings for the study of the lesson has been a subject of much thought on the part of the officers and teachers, and it is hoped that means may be devised to make these meetings, if held, successful.

In conclusion, it is our earnest prayer that still greater success may attend our efforts in 1895. "May the Lord bless us and keep us. May the Lord make His face to shine upon us. May the Lord lift up His countenance upon us, and give us peace."

In presenting the Report of the Bible Class for the year 1894, we are pleased to state that the attendance for the year 1894 was 2,120, being 220 more than last year. The average attendance was 42, distributed as follows: ladies, 27; gentlemen, 15; the class having been in session every Sunday during the year.

The general collections amounted to \$46.12, the Share Fund contributions \$19.12, and the special collections \$6.40. This makes a total of \$72.60 as the total collections from all sources for the past year.

We desire to record our thanks for the efficient man-

ner in which Mr. William Duguid has presided as our organist during the past year.

The course of study, which consisted of the lives of some of the Old Testament heroes, and lately of the life of our Saviour, has been peculiarly interesting. This we attribute to the careful teaching and to the kindly interest displayed by Mr. Gardiner in regard to everything pertaining to our class.

In closing, we extend an invitation to any young persons in the congregation, who may not have joined our class, to become members, and enjoy the forthcoming series of lessons.

In submitting our report of the past year's work, we have much reason to be thankful for the progress we have made, especially in the building up of a more willing and Christ-like spirit in the hearts of our members, and also in the large increase in membership.

We have at the present time ten standing committees, namely: The Look-out, Social, Prayer Meeting, Missionary, Relief, Musical, Good Literature, Flower, Sunday School and Temperance.

A part of the result of the Flower Committee's work may be seen each Sunday in the flowers which are supplied for the pulpit. These are each week divided and distributed among those who may be ill in the congregation.

One of the above-named committees has been newly appointed this past year. This is the Temperance Committee, the work of which is to help, in every possible way, to crush and drive this terrible evil or curse of intemperance from our midst, and to interest others in the same great work.

We have great pleasure in reporting that, through the active work of the Look-out Committee, thirty-nine new names have been added to our roll, and although fourteen of our members have gone from us, we have still 125 active members, which is an increase of twenty-five during the year.

The Social, Prayer Meeting and other committees have not been idle. They have all had plenty of work to do, and have done it with a will and in a spirit that is highly commendable.

We might mention two special meetings that have been held in connection with our Society in this church. First, the meeting of the Young People's Presbyterian Union, on December 23rd, 1894, the principal speaker at which was the Rev. W. F. Clark, of London; and, second, the Temperance Watch Night Service on New Year's Eve, the principal speakers at which were Messrs. R. J. Colville and Robinson.

No one could have attended either or both of these meetings without feeling, in some degree, the presence of the Holy Spirit's influence, and noticing in a large degree the feeling of Christian fellowship that binds the

young people of our different churches and congregations together.

The annual meeting of the Local Union of Christian Endeavour was held in Sherbourne Street Methodist Church, on December 6th, 1894, at which a banner was presented to the Society having the largest percentage of their members present. The banner was won by the Euclid Avenue Methodist Society, our Society taking second place in the honourable mentions.

We cannot say, in reviewing the work of the past year, that we have been as successful as we might have been. There is always room for improvement, and keeping our pledge before us, "Trusting in the Lord Jesus Christ for strength," we go forward to do a better year's work than the last.

The Woman's Association held thirteen meetings during the year, ten regular, two sewing and one special meeting.

A Visiting Committee was formed at the beginning of the year, for the purpose of calling upon new members, and as far as possible, after each communion, one or more of the members of this committee have called upon the new families uniting with the congregation.

We consider that this is not the least important work we have undertaken during the year.

Two lectures were given under the auspices of the Association. One on April 13th, by Rev. A. Gilray, descriptive of a series of stereopticon views given by Mr. Wright. The proceeds amounted to \$87.50. Another lecture was given in November, by Rev. A. McMillan, of Mimico, on "The Covenanters," at which a collection of \$19.39 was taken up.

During the year this Association raised \$257.00 by a collection of five cents a month from the women of the congregation, by special collections, and the proceeds of two lectures.

Clothing to the value of \$13.25 has been distributed to those in need, and \$29.00 has been used for benevolent purposes.

The debt on the furniture of the Parlour and Vestry

has been wiped out, and a surplus of \$62.00 has been handed to the Treasurer of the General Furnishing Fund.

At a special meeting held in December it was decided to ask the members of the congregation to send contributions to help to fill the Christmas baskets to be sent to the needy.

The membership at present is thirty-two, a decrease of six since last year. The average attendance for the year was fourteen. The attendance has been very encouraging, as the average last year was fourteen with a membership of thirty-eight.

We are sorry to have to report a falling off in the honorary members; we had seventeen last year, and only eleven this year. We would be much pleased to see more of the ladies of the church attending our meetings and taking an interest in our work.

A fruit social was held on September 23rd. The Rev. Mr. Scott, of St. John's Church, City, gave an address on mission work in general. Recitations on mission work were given by members of our Band. Tickets were sold by the members, the proceeds of which amounted to \$12.47.

During the month of September we sent two quilts, some prettily dressed dolls and other toys to India.

A special meeting was held on December 27th for returning our talents, five cents being given to each member to increase during the year. Twenty-one members brought back their increases, amounting to \$23.00.


