## THE BASTION



WE FEEL that the History of the Bastion, being the oldest landmark of Nanaimo and also the Emblem of our Association, should occupy the front page of our tourists guide. It is one of the antique sights that visitors cannot overlook, and many a tourist last year had a picture of it in their camera before leaving our City. It was built for the Hudson's Bay Co., in June, 1853 by Leon Labine and Jean Batiste Fortier. When the Bastion was built, Nanaimo then went by the name of Colville Town, and consisted of four dwelling houses 26 by 15 and three 30 by 20, the purpose of the Fort being to protect the whites from the dreaded violence of the Indians. Previous to 1852 the whole of the Nanaimo country had only its aboriginal inhabitants, many of whom were impudent plunderers, yet stealthy foes. Two 6-pound carronades were the armament of the Fort and the arsenal consisted of cases of grapeshot and cannister. It is now owned and occupied by Nanaimo Post 3, Native Sons of B. C., who have spared neither pains or money to keep it in its present state of preservation.

## COAL MINES



COAL WAS discovered in the Province of British Columbia in the year 1835 at Squash on the Pacific Slope; and very shortly afterwards, through information given to the Hudson's Bay Co. by the Indians, at Nanaimo and Ladysmith. The Douglas seam at Nanaimo was discovered in the year 1859 and from this small beginning the industry has developed till we have the Canadian Western Fuel Co. operating Number One, Protection, Reserve and Harewood Mines, and also a new mine, which they have recently opened up on Wakeslah Farm. The Granby Consolidated operating a new mine at Cassidy, which is one of the most up to date mines today, having fine bath house with showers all ready for the men as soon as they come up from their work; first-class boarding house and a dining room fit for any hotel. The site is all laid out with nice boulevards, and the most modern cottages and bungalows. Closely adjoining these is a fine sports ground, where many exciting games of baseball are pulled off. The Grant Mine is another new mine which has great possibilities ahead of it, being only in its infancy as yet, and at the present time putting out about 100 tons a day. In addition to these, Cumberland, South Wellington, Extension and Jingle Pot mines are still going strong.

## AUTO PARK

NANAIMO was the first City on Vancouver Island to realize the needs of the Tourist, and with the co-operation of the City Council the Auto Association started an auto park on Comox Road in the Millstream Park. With city water piped to the grounds and a cook range installed, it made an ideal camping ground within two minutes' run from the heart of the city, and was well patronized by our friends from across the line. Surrounded as it is with huge trees, and the Millstream running along side, it became a popular resort for tourists last summer, and every evening saw a goodly number of cars driving in, who simply raved about it when we went to have a friendly chat with them. We hope this summer, with the help of the City Council, to add still more improvements and get all our sanitary arrangements completed, which will make things far more comfortable.



## WHOLESALEERS

As a Wholesale center Nanaimo is becoming more important every day. Malkin-Pearson Co. Ltd., have just completed a large modern warehouse of interlocking tile construction on the E. & N. track where they will now be able to handle their full line of groceries, etc. The Vancouver Milling Co. and Brackman-Ker Co. also have large warehouses for the handling of their grain and feed business. Whilst Messrs. Whitty Bros., and W. W. Gray handle the wholesale candy and tobaccos. The Imperial Oil Co., have now outgrown their present plant, and in the near future are erecting a modern brick and concrete warehouse and four 15,000-gal. capacity storage tanks down at the water front, with pumps to supply the needs of the motor launches. Besides these the city can boast of two cigar factories; Messrs. Booth & Sons making the famous "Caban Blossom," and Messrs. Gable & Co., the popular "Enterprise" Cigar.

## NANAIMO--The "Hub" of Vancouver Island



**N**ANAIMO, through her famous coal fields has been nicknamed the Coal City of B. C., and visitors expect to see a black dingy mining town on their arrival, instead of which, they find a city with a most beautiful location. The surrounding scenery can only be called magnificent. Facing the City are the snow peaked mountains of the Mainland, standing in the back ground of the seascape formed by the azure waters of the gulf, dotted with fir-clad islands. Behind the City there stands the stalwart, low crowned Mt. Benson. For the Tourist, Nanaimo is the HUB of the Island, being only two hours' run from Vancouver, to which city she is linked up by the S.S. Princess Patricia, the fastest boat on the Pacific Coast, which runs twice daily, and also the S.S. Charmer, which calls at this port four days a week. Situated in the geographical centre of Vancouver Island, being connected with first-class roads to Victoria, Shawnigan Lake, Duncan, Maple Bay, Chemainus and Ladysmith to the south; Cameron Lake, Alberni, Port Alberni and Great Central Lakes to the west; Parksville, Qualicum Beach, Union Bay, Courtenay, Comox, Cumberland and Campbell River to the north.

Although one of the oldest cities in the Province, it is only in recent years that Nanaimo has roused herself, having paved her business streets, constructed 15 miles of cement sidewalks, a Municipal owned water system and up-to-date sewerage system. She has a fire fighting equipment that any city would be proud of, consisting of two modern motor trucks, chemicals, hook and

ladder trucks, etc. The educational facilities of the City are also of the very best, consisting of six schools, including a High School and Business College. There is also St. Anne's Convent, which makes a happy and comfortable home for a goodly number of orphans. The financial institutions include the Canadian Bank of Commerce, Royal Bank, Merchants' Bank of Canada, and the Bank of Montreal.

Nanaimo as a Port is growing in importance steadily, as the figures from March 1918 to March 1919 clearly show. In Foreign ships the arrivals were 561 with a tonnage of 214,551, and the departures 700 with a tonnage of 269,470. The coastwise ships, arrivals were 2625 with a tonnage of 551,662, and the departures 2565 with a tonnage of 552,506.

For looking after the Religion of her Citizens, Nanaimo is well equipped, as every Religious Denomination has its Church and Parish Hall. A Public Library has just been started, where literature will be found to suit everyone's taste. There is also a large Hospital, which will in all probability, be replaced by a modern structure within the next eighteen months, as the present building has had its day, and plans have already been suggested for the new building. Before the close of the coming season, we hope to see a Memorial on the green in front of the Post Office, which will show very plainly what Nanaimo's Sons did in the Great War, and the sacrifices her citizens made.

## LUMBERING

OF THE many representative industries on Vancouver Island, none is more worthy of special mention than the Ladysmith Lumber Co. Ltd. ## FISHING

THE Salmon Pack of British Columbia for the 1919 season amounted to 1,393,156 cases, valued at more than \$15,000,000, of which Vancouver Island's share was 276,519 cases, the Nanaimo Can. & Pack. Ltd. contributing 7,676 cases. The fishing grounds on the East coast run from Chemainus to Oyster River and on the West coast from Barclay Sound to Nitinat. Any fisherman, who enjoys trolling, can get all the sport he wants around our pretty harbor, between the months of May and October.

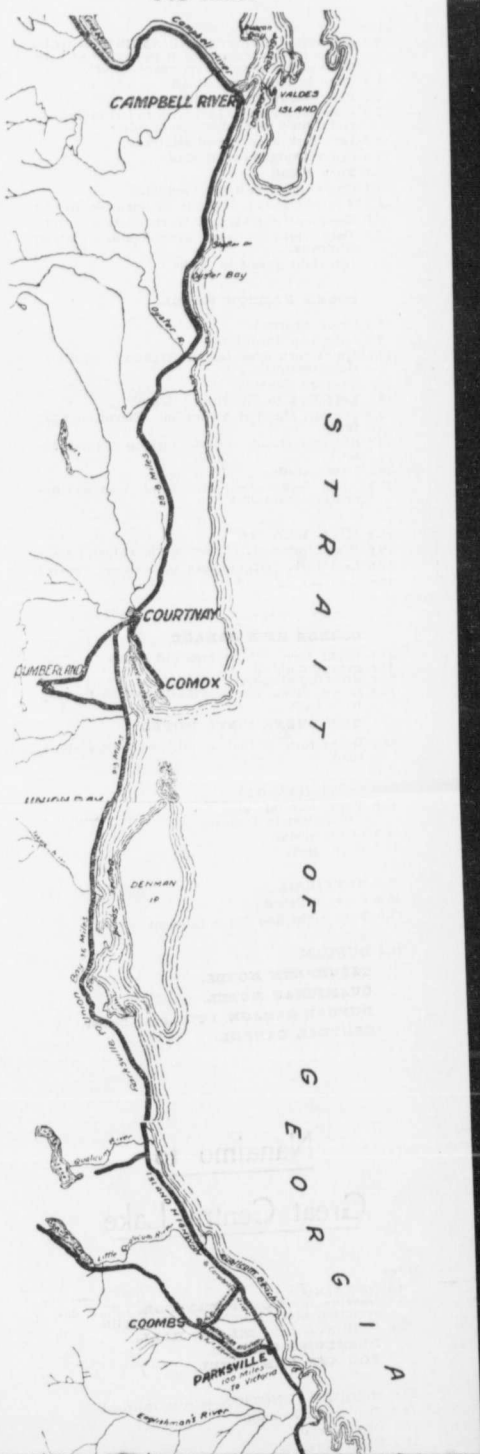
