Still, with certain emendations and additions, the Bill could be made of immense value to the Irish people.

history of the Irish land trouble can deny the truth of this statement. The census returns for the year 1881, showing a marked decrease in Irish population during the decade, offer the most irrefragable testimony to the cruelty and rapacity of Irish landlordism. Ireland, under good government, is capable of sustaining a population more than double its present number of inhabitants.

Mr. Conkling will thus have an opportunity of making an appeal directly to the people.

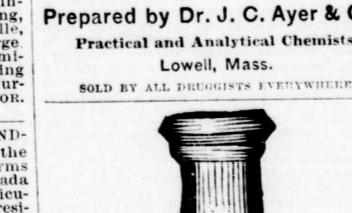

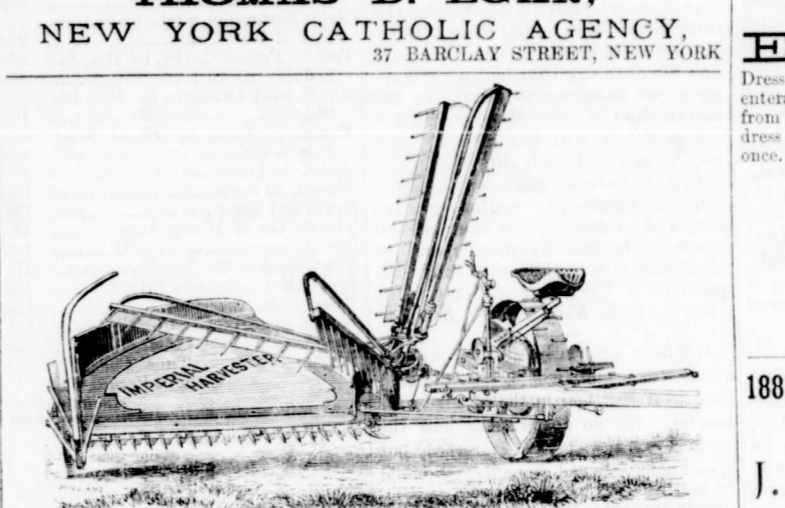

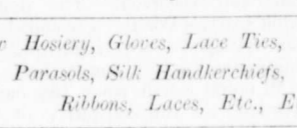
