STEWART'S a former owner of the property, one John Clarke, defendant had expressly encouraged him to do so, had verbally granted him the permission to flood his land, and had refused to accept any compensation. Plaintiff also alleged that only a small and comparatively valueless portion of defendant's land was flooded. The examination of witnesses commenced on Thursday morning at nine a. m., and lasted till the rising of the Court at six p.m. The case was resumed with the arguments of Counsel on both sides at nine a. m. to-day. At the conclusion of the argument, and after remarking that the case had been exceedingly well argued on both sides, decided in favour of the plaintiff and granted an injunction against the defendant with costs. Mr. Rou. Q. C. and Mr. Palmer for plaintiff. Mr. Strong, Q. C., and Mr. Drew for defendant.
