MEMBERS' RELIGIOUS TONE

DEBATE ON THE QUESTION OF SUNDAY OBSERVANCE

It arose from a Resolution by Mr. Charlton in Connection with Canada's Exhibit at the World's Fair—The Treaty with France is Not Satisfactory and Will Be Shelved.

OTAWA, March 12.—After routine Mr. Laurier asked whether a returning officer had been appointed for the election and was informed by Mr. Foster that the same officer who acted at last election had been reappointed, and the writ had been issued. Nomination on 5th, polling on 12th of April. In reply to Mr. Laurier's question as to the evidence in the case, Mr. Charlton said that the evidence was printed and had been distributed. The exhibits were being printed and would be ready as soon as possible.

The following bills were read a third time and passed: Relating to the Canada Life Assurance Company. To incorporate the Woodmen of the World.

To amend act respecting the Nova Scotia Permanent Benefit Building Society and Savings Fund. The motion for the second reading of the Divorce bill from the Senator for relief of Martha Ballantyne, the House divided and the second reading was postponed to 3 o'clock against. The bill was referred to Private Bills Committee, as were also the bills for the relief of James Dalzell and Edmund H. Heward.

The notices of motion were run through, and those unopposed were carried. Mr. Charlton then moved the following resolution: "That in the opinion of this House the Canadian Exhibition should be closed on Sunday, in accordance with British example at previous exhibitions, in order to give effect to the Christian sentiment of the country and as a recognition of the duty resting upon an avowed Christian people to refuse by official act to do violence to Christian principles, and to decline to aid or countenance any person who will deprive official, caretaker or laborer of Christian liberties or privileges, or will violate divine requirements relating to the observance of the Lord's Day as a day of rest."

Mr. Charlton spoke at some length in support of his motion, claiming that the opening of the exhibition on Sunday was opposed to the Christian sentiment of the people of Canada. He did not want to leave the matter to the Government, but desired to have the expression of opinion from the House. Mr. McMillen thought it would be a national disgrace to have the Canadian section open on Sunday.

Mr. Amyot said Sunday was the only day on which the Government had the opportunity of visiting the exhibition, and they ought to have an opportunity of doing so. Mr. Maclean said that while he might lay himself open to the charge of being a Sabbath breaker, by not voting for the resolution, it was a case that when in Rome do as the Romans do. The mover of the resolution said it was not intended to be a workingman's day. The speaker was just as much a friend of the workingman as Mr. Charlton, and he would support any law that would increase the number of workingmen. The practical side of the question was in regard to Sunday labor in connection with the many businesses and different kinds of labor, such as the running of trains and the different lines of travel which the exhibition was to have. The exhibition was to be held and entirely within the control of the United States. Those who wanted there were invited to exhibit their different articles. As to whether it would be open or closed purely depended on the United States. It might very well be that the result which the United States will arrive at will be opposed to some, but that will not concern the members of this House. Whether the exhibition remained closed or open on the Sabbath would be determined by the United States. The House would go there and the labor would go on just the same no matter how the Canadian Parliament might protest or not protest. The only thing Canada could do was to close the Canadian department, and that was of no effect so far as labor was concerned. But before referring to that he would like to have a word to say in respect to some of the exhibits which were to be shown on Sunday. There were those who favored such buildings being open on Sunday who were just as good as every day as those who wanted to see it closed; and he would not say one word against the latter. There was only a divergence of view between the two parties. The report in part ran as follows: "I beg respectfully to advise you that the plans and contracts for the work of the street railway in this case, which was carried out during the coming season, cannot, in the opinion of the company, be cancelled by the proposed withdrawal of the City Engineer's statement, which has been made; and the company feel aggrieved that any attempt should be made to interfere with the work of the street railway, or to change the terms of the contract, or to alter the changes from the horse car to the electric service during the coming summer."

More Probably Lord Aberdeen. LONDON, March 13.—A statement is published here that Lord Bessy has been asked to resign the office of Lord High Commissioner of the Dominion of Canada. A COMMISSION RECOMMENDED

To Enquire Into Diseases Affecting Cattle and Providing for a Proper Dairy Inspection.

Editor World: On Feb. 19th last, accompanied by Dr. Allen, Medical Health Officer, J. J. McKenzie, representing the Provincial Board of Health, and several veterinary students, I made a personal examination of the premises at the Deer Park Hotel, with the result that the deer was found to be suffering from tuberculosis...

Now, would it not be wise for the Medical Health Department to look with a little more care into our milk supply, with the view of having the different dairies inspected by a competent veterinary surgeon at least once a month with a view of stamping out this and similar diseases, which, if we fail to believe the dairymen, which we do, are communicable to man?

There are between 50 and 60 dairies in the Township of York. Now, why not license these dairies and have the cows resulting from this source go towards paying a competent veterinary surgeon to inspect and report on each dairy at least once a month? What applies to York Township will apply to all other municipalities in the county...

The Late Donald Brock. Editor World: It was with deep regret I read your account of the sad accident which deprived the late Donald Brock of his life. There were one or two inaccuracies, however, which I wish to correct so as to avoid any misapprehension which might arise on the part of those who are not so well acquainted with the family as I am.
