## A MISTAKE MAGNIFIED

Having known the reputation of the firm of Taylor and Will iamson for fair dealing ever since we came to Chatham, 18 years ago and alsu knowing that this firm had borne the same eharacter bere for over 25 y ars, we were more than sarprised to hear that they had beenn convieted in the police court on hat eharge preferred by the Government analyst of selling adulterated white pepper.The case was given much prominence in the columns of both our daily papers, Had the prominence onty characterized the report in the Planet, we might have looked it over, knowing their ebaracter for sensationalism, but found the cantious Banner voice the ery and thought it advisable to interview the members of this firm and to find out real fucts of the case.
, The white pepper in question was bought by them from one of the leading epice mills-in Canada, with whom T. \& W, have dealt for a number of yeark, and ordered in the u-ual way from the travaller for the factory. The order was given for whire pepper,meaning ot coarve, "pure" white pepper, but from the explanation nab. requently given to this Chatham firm, the spicemen, it appears evident that through the mistake of the latter, compound white pepper was substituted by an employe who fiuding tho pure and eompound bins clowe together filled the buxur from, the compound instead ot the pure.

Taylor \& Williameon took it for granted as a matter of courve that they got what they ordered, and it would be quite impossible for any retuiler, without expennive. lahoratory appliances, mieroseopes and expert chemical knowledge, to tell the difference of one from the other, for the tints of pure "white" pepper may vary sufficiently to cover quite a scaie of shades and the small amount of fluar added would be quite imperceptible to the taste.
Taylor \& Williamson fully reeognize the hurried nature of the reporter's work on a daily paper, and the necessity. of getling in news promptly, expecially in the face of strong competition, but they think that in a case of the
bind which no serionnly affected the reputation of a tong extablisbed firm, it would have been better if the Planet reporter had, before making any announcement, prior to the trial of the case, oalled on the firm so that the pubtio might have had an opportunitv of hearing both rides of the question
