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BY-LAWS
OF THE
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BY-LAWS.

No. 211—A BY-LAW

To grant authority to the Trustees of School Section No. 5, to borrow the sum of \$300 for the purpose of Erecting a new School House.

PASSED April 25th, 1871.

WHEREAS, the Trustees of School Section No. 5, in the Township of Raleigh, have made application to the Municipal Council of said Township, to grant them authority to borrow the sum of three hundred dollars for the purpose of erecting a new School House.

Be it therefore enacted, by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario, and Common School Acts, passed by the Legislature of Ontario.

1st. That it shall and may be lawful for the Trustees of School Section No. 5, in the Township of Raleigh, to raise by way of loan and at a rate of interest not exceeding the sum of ten per cent. per annum, the sum of three hundred dollars, for the purpose of erecting a new School House, to be paid on or before the First day of January, A. D. 1872, from any person or persons, body or bodies corporate, who may be willing to advance the same.

No. 212—A BY-LAW

To amend a by-Law passed the 18th day of February, 1867, entitled a By-law to repeal all By-laws heretofore made in the Township of Raleigh, with respect to the sale by retail of Spirituous Liquors therein.

PASSED 25th April, 1871.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend said By-law; *Be it therefore enacted* by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario.

1st. That the last clause of the before recited By-law with regard to Victualing Houses, be and the same is hereby amended so that the penalty mentioned in said Clause of Ten Dollars should not apply and shall not be inflicted where a person only provided meals and lodgings for travellers and visitors stopping or calling at their houses, stabling or feeding horses or other animals, and does not sell any kind of drinks on their premises.

No. 213—A BY-LAW

To amend By-law No. 186, passed 30th July, 1869, and entitled a By-law to divide the Township of Raleigh into four Polling Sub-divisions for Legislative purposes.

PASSED 25th April, 1871.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and expedient that the Township of Raleigh should be divided into four Polling Subdivisions, as required by the Act 32d Victoria, Chapter 21, of the Statutes of Ontario.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary that the limits of the 3rd Polling Sub-division should be altered so as to meet the requirements of the Act.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, assembled under and by virtue of the Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario; also, an Act Chapter 21, 32nd Victoria, passed by the Legislature of Ontario.

1st. That the Township of Raleigh shall be divided into four Polling Subdivisions, under and as required by the Act passed by the Provincial Legislature of Ontario, Cap. 21, in the year 1869.

2nd. That the First Division shall embrace and consist of all that portion of the Township of Raleigh from the River Thames to the line between Concessions Nine and Ten, from the Eastern Boundary of the Township to the line between lots twelve and thirteen.

3rd. That the Second Division shall embrace and contain all that portion of the Township lying between the twelve and thirteen Side Road and the line between the Township of Raleigh and Tilbury East, from the River Thames to the centre of the tenth Concession

4th. That the Third Division shall embrace that portion of the Township commencing at the Tilbury Town Line, and thence running easterly along the center of the Tenth Concession to the Side Line 12 and 18, thence northerly to the line between Concessions Nine and Ten, thence easterly along said line to the Town Line between Harwich and Raleigh, thence southerly to the line between Concessions 13 and 14, thence westerly along said line to the Tilbury Town Line, thence northerly to the place of beginning.

5th. That the Fourth Division shall consist of and embrace all that portion of the Township lying South of the line between Concessions Thirteen and fourteen from the western, to the eastern boundary of the Township.

6th. That anything contained in the above recited By-law, contrary to this By-law is hereby repealed.

No. 214—A BY-LAW

For Draining a certain portion of the Township of Raleigh hereinafter described, and for borrowing money to complete the same. PASSED 3d July, 1871.

WHEREAS, a majority of the resident landowners of the locality to be benefited by the proposed drainage, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh to cause a drain to be opened; commencing first on or about the line between Lots No. 15 and 16 at the easterly end of a Ditch already dug on the southerly side of the allowance for road between the 14th and 15th concessions; and thence northeast along the southerly side of said Concession road to the south-west side of the 18 and 19 side road. Secondly, the outlet for the above drain to commence on the line between Lots No. 16 and 17 at about level stake No. 10 of Concession Road Drain, and thence north-west along the said line or levels to stake No. 36; and thence northerly to Broadbent's or Hind's creek on lot No. 17; and thence following the said Creek with the stream to level stake No. 44, say three chains north-east of the line between lots No. 16 and 17, in the 13th Concession of said Township of Raleigh.

AND WHEREAS, the Council being of the opinion that it would greatly benefit the said locality were the said drain made, instructed Arthur Jones, P. L. S., to make a survey of the proposed Drain, and report to the Council thereon.

AND WHEREAS, the said Arthur Jones has examined the line of the proposed Drain and made a survey and took the levels thereof, and made an estimate of the cost of cutting and making said drain; and reported the same to the Council as amounting to the sum of \$1528, and hath apportioned the said sum of \$1528 amongst the lots and part of lots and roads benefited as per Schedule following and forming part of this By-law.

The following Schedule shows the benefit to be derived by each lot from the drainage to be performed under the provisions of this By-law:—

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, by virtue of and under an Act 29th and 30th Victoria, Chapter 51; also an Act 22 Vic., Chapter 43, entitled an Act to amend the Municipal Institutions Act of Upper Canada.

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1st. That the said Drain shall be made in accordance with the survey, levels and report furnished to this Council by the said Arthur Jones; and that Messrs. White and Jenner be and are hereby appointed Commissioners to let the said Drain to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate), and to take security from the contractor with two good and sufficient sureties for the due performance of the work; also to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor, less twenty per cent., until finally accepted by the Engineer, and that the Commissioners be paid the sum of \$1.50 each for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending the same.

2nd. That there shall be raised, levied and collected from and off the lots and parts of lots to be benefited by making said Drain the sum of \$1284, as set forth in said Schedule to be paid in manner following:

3rd. That the said sum of \$1284 shall be divided into two annual payments, bearing interest not exceeding the rate of eight per cent. per annum, the first payment to be made in 1871, and continued in each year until paid.

4th. That the Clerk shall each year place the payments on the Collector's roll against such Lots or part Lots as aforesaid, to be collected and paid over to the Treasurer as other taxes are paid over, to form a sinking fund to meet the payments of the Debentures hereinafter mentioned, subject to appeal as by law provided.

5th. That the sum of \$244, assessed upon the Road allowances, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Township out of the general funds on the order of the Reeve.

6th. That for the purpose of raising funds to complete the making of said Drain, it shall be lawful for the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh to raise by way of loan, at a rate of interest not exceeding eight per cent. per annum, the sum of \$642, for which amount the Reeve shall cause Debentures to be made out in sums not less than \$100 each, and payable on the 15th day of December, 1872; such Debentures to be made under the seal of the Corporation and signed by the Reeve and Treasurer, and made payable at the Merchants' Bank of Canada, at Chatham, with coupons attached for the interest, payable yearly, at eight per cent. per annum.

7th. That in consequence of some of the Lots and part Lots assessed for said Drain being Non-Resident lands, the Collector may be unable to collect said assessments from the lands, therefore causing a deficiency to meet the Debentures as they become due, it therefore shall be lawful for the Treasurer to pay from the general funds of the Township such sums as will make good such deficiency, and he shall replace the same to the general funds so soon as said sums are collected from said lands.

8th. That this By-law shall be published in the Chatham Banner newspaper for six weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

No 215—A BY-LAW

To raise certain sums of money therein mentioned in the Township of Raleigh for the year A. D. 1871.

PASSED 7th August, 1871.

WHEREAS, by By-law by the Municipal Council of the County of Kent, passed on the 17th day of June, 1871, and entitled a By-law to raise the sum of \$22,337 00 to meet the current expenses of the County of Kent.

AND WHEREAS the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh, is required to raise the sum of \$2,649 92, as their portion for said year, to be paid to the Treasurer of the said County of Kent, without any deduction, on or before the 21st day of Dec'r next.

AND WHEREAS, the apportionment of the Legislative School grant for said Township of Raleigh for the year 1871, amounts to \$398, according to the apportionment of the Chief Superintendent of Common Schools.

AND WHEREAS the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise an equal sum of money, according to law, in such case made and provided.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary to raise the following sums of money to meet the current expenses of the Corporation of the Township for the year 1871, viz:

- For the Salaries of Township Officers, the sum of \$650 00
- For the support of the poor in the Township, the sum of 150 00
- For Non-resident School Accounts, the sum of 380 00
- For Miscellaneous Accounts, the sum of 470 00

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act 29th and 30th Victoria, Chapter 51, and the amendments thereto, passed by the Legislature of Ontario.

1st. That there shall be raised, levied and collected upon all the rateable real and personal property in the Township of Raleigh, the sum or rate of 5 and 8-10th mills on every dollar thereof for the aforesaid County purposes; the sum or rate 3 and 2-10 mills on every dollar thereof, to meet the expenses of the Township of Raleigh for the

current year; the sum or rate of one mill on every dollar thereof for the aforesaid School purposes (except on the property of certain Roman Catholic supporters of Separate Schools); the sum or rate of one dollar upon the owner or harbinger of every dog; and the sum or rate of two dollars upon the owner or harbinger of every Bitch entered upon the Assessment Roll of the Township for the current year.

2nd. That if the above sums of money so raised and collected by the said rates, shall exceed in any case the amount so required for the aforesaid purposes respectively, the Treasurer of this Corporation shall pass such excess to any deficiency that may arise to any or either of the mentioned purposes in this By-law, and if no such deficiency shall happen then all such excess, if any, shall be kept by the Treasurer and appropriated to the general purposes of the Township under the direction and control of the Council thereof, as all the monies are which come into his hands.

3rd. That the Clerk of this Corporation is required to levy a special rate over and above all other rates against the estate, real and personal, of any School Section within this municipality on the request of the Trustees, who shall furnish him on or before the First day of September, with a written statement signed by such Trustees, of the amount of money to be raised for Common School purposes in such School Sections, such a rate pro rata on all the rateable property in such School Section as will amount to the sum of money required by such Trustees for the aforesaid purposes, together with the sum of six per cent. to defray the expenses of levying and collecting the same.

4th. That the Collector is hereby authorized and required to collect according to law, the special rates levied on the freeholders and householders of such School Sections, the sums of money set opposite their respective names, and to pay the amounts so collected (on or before the 14th day of December next, after retaining the sum of six per cent. for levying and collecting said rates), to the Secretary-Treasurer of such School Sections, whose receipt with the Corporate Seal attached, and deposited with the Treasurer of this Corporation, shall be his acquittance for the sums so paid.

5th. It shall be the duty of the Collector for this Corporation to pay over all money collected by him to the Treasurer every two weeks, under a penalty of the forfeiture of his salary, and to finally collect and pay over all monies collected by him, and make a return to the Treasurer by the 14th day of December next, according to law. Provided that this clause shall not apply to Special School Rates.

6th. That the Collector shall be allowed the same fees as is now allowed to Bailiff of the Division Courts for all property seized, appraised, advertised and sold by him by virtue of his office.

No. 216—A BY-LAW

For Draining certain localities in the Township of Raleigh, hereinafter named, and for borrowing money to complete the same.

WHEREAS, a majority of the resident land owners of the localities to be benefited by the proposed Drainage have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh for the drainage of the undermentioned lands, namely, the lands mentioned in Schedules No. 1 and 2, commencing first on the easterly side of the Four Rod Road about 5 rods south-east of the end of the culvert mentioned in the petition, at the Ridge; thence running north-west along the easterly side of said Four Rod Road a distance of 240 rods to the rear of the Talbot Road lots—to be called the Four Rod Road Extension Drain.

2ND Locality commencing first, on the north side of the Ridge north of Talbot Road on the line between lots numbered 143 and 144, thence running north-westerly on the west side of said line about 250 rods to the drain in the rear of the Talbot Road lots.

SECONDLY, commencing on the south side of said Ridge on the line between lots 143 and 144, about twenty rods north-west of Brushes' and Sandison's Cross Drain, and running south-east on said line between lots 143 and 144 to said Cross Drain.

THIRDLY, commencing again about fifty rods south-east of said Cross Drain on the west side of the said line between lots 143 and 144, and running north-west to said Cross Drain; thence south-westerly along said Cross Drain to the Four Rod Road ditch—to be called the Brush and Sandison Drain.

AND WHEREAS, the Council being of opinion that it would greatly benefit the said localities were the said Drains made, have instructed Sherman Malcolm, P. L. S., to make a survey of the proposed Drains, and report to the Council thereon.

AND WHEREAS, the said Sherman Malcolm has examined the line of the proposed Drain, made a survey and took the levels thereof, and made an estimate of the costs of cutting and making said Drains, and reported the same to the Council amounting to the sum of \$1,253 51; that is to say, the cost of the Four Rod Road Extension

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Drain, \$432 89; and the cost of the Brush and Sandison Drain, \$820 62; and has apportioned the said sums amongst the Lots and parts of Lots and Road benefited as per Schedule following and forming part of this By-law.

The following Schedule shows the benefit to be derived by each lot from the Drainage to be performed under the provisions of this By-law.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, by virtue of and under an Act entitled an Act respecting the Municipal Institutions Act of the Province of Ontario.

1st. That the said Drains shall be made in accordance with the survey, levels and report furnished to this Council by the said Sherman Malcolm, and that he and he is hereby appointed Commissioner to let the said Drains to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate)—to take security from the contractor, with two good and sufficient sureties for the due performance of the work—to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor, less twenty per cent., until finally accepted by the Engineer.

2nd. That there shall be raised, levied and collected from and off the lots and parts of lots to be benefitted by making the said Drains, the sum of \$1109.22, as set forth in said Schedule, to be paid in manner following, subject to appeal as by law provided.

3rd. That the said sum of \$1109 22 shall be divided into seven equal annual instalments, bearing interest not exceeding eight per cent. per annum; the first instalment to be paid in 1871, and continued in each year until fully paid.

4th. That the Clerk shall in each year place the payments, with interest on the unpaid principal on the Collector's Roll against such Lots or parts of Lots as aforesaid, to be collected and paid over to the Treasurer, as other taxes are collected and paid over, to form a sinking fund to meet the payments of the Debentures hereinafter mentioned.

5th. That the sum of \$144 30, assessed upon the Road allowance, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Township out of the general funds, on the orders of the Reeve.

6th. That for the purpose of raising funds to complete the making of said Drains it shall be lawful for the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh to raise by way of loan, at a rate of interest not exceeding eight per cent. per annum, the sum of \$950 70, for which amount the Reeve shall cause Debentures to be made out in sums not less than \$100 each; to be under the Corporate seal and signed by the Reeve and Treasurer, and made payable at the Merchants' Bank at Chatham, with coupons attached for the interest.

7th. That in case any of the mentioned lands assessed for said Drains become non-resident lands, the Collector may be unable to collect said assessments from the lands, thereby causing a deficiency to meet the Debentures as they become due, it shall be lawful for the Treasurer to pay from the general funds of the Township such sums as will make good such deficiency, and he shall replace the same to the general funds so soon as the said sums are collected from said lands.

8th. That this By-law shall be published in the Chatham Banner newspaper for six weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

No. 217—A. BY-LAW

To provide for enlarging the Craford Drain in the Township of Raleigh.

PASSED 7th Sept., 1871.

WHEREAS a majority of the resident land owners of the locality to be benefitted by enlarging the Craford Drain in the Township of Raleigh on lot 129, to a gully on lot 137, Talbot Road, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh to cause the said Craford Drain to be made deeper and wider.

AND WHEREAS the Council being of the opinion that it would greatly benefit the locality were the said Drain enlarged, have passed a By-law instructing Sherman Mal-

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coln, P. L. S., to examine the same and report thereon with an estimate of the costs and an assessment to defray the expenses of the same.

AND WHEREAS, the said Sherman Malcolm has examined the said Craford Drain and the lands proposed to be drained; also, lands benefitted in the Township of Harwich, took the levels thereof, and made an estimate of the costs of enlarging the same, and reported the same to the Council as amounting to the sum of \$610 29; and has apportioned the said sum of \$610 29 amongst the lots and parts of lots and roads to be benefitted, as per Schedules following and forming a part of this By-law.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of Ontario.

1st. That the said Drain shall be enlarged in accordance with the Survey and levels taken by the said Sherman Malcolm, P.L.S.

2nd. That there shall be raised, levied and collected on the lands aforesaid, along with the ordinary taxes for the year 1871, the sum of \$440 29 for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said Drainage and the costs incidental thereto, subject to an appeal as by law provided.

3rd. That the sum of \$115, assessed on the Road allowance, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Corporation of Raleigh out of the general funds of the Municipality, on the order of the Commissioner.

4th. That the work to be performed under the provisions of this By-law shall be let by public contract to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate in any case), who shall give good and sufficient security for the due performance of the work contracted for.

5th. That Sherman Malcolm, P.L.S., be and is hereby appointed Commissioner for the letting and superintending the work on the proposed Drain and that he shall receive the sum of \$18 for the same.

6th. That this By-law shall be published in the Chatham BANNER newspaper for six weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

No. 218—A BY-LAW

To make provision for Draining a certain locality in the Township of Raleigh, herein-after described, and for borrowing Money to complete the same.

PASSED 6th Nov., 1871.

WHEREAS, a majority of the resident land owners in the locality to be benefitted by the Drainage hereinafter described, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh to cause a Drain or Ditch to be opened through the following locality, viz:—Commencing on the N.W. side of the line Road between Concessions A and Eight, on the Easterly side of the Center Road,

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running N.W. to the line of Road between Concessions Seven and A; thence N.W. along the Westerly side of the Center Road to the allowance for Road between Concessions Six and Seven.

And Whereas, the Council being of the opinion that it would greatly benefit the said locality was the said Drain made, have instructed ARTHUR JONES, P.L.S., to make a survey of the proposed Drain, and report to the Council thereon.

And Whereas, the said ARTHUR JONES has examined the line of the proposed Drain, made a survey, took the levels thereof, and made an assessment of the costs of cutting and making said Drain, and reported the same to the Council as amounting to the sum of \$870 00; and hath apportioned the said sum of \$870 00 amongst the Lots and parts of Lots and Roads benefitted, as per Schedule hereunto annexed, and forming part of this By-law—subject to appeal as by law provided.

Be it Therefore Enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, assembled under and by virtue of the Municipal Institutions Act of Ontario.

1st. That the said Drain shall be made in accordance with the Survey and levels taken by the said ARTHUR JONES; and that ROSSAR J. MORRISON be and is hereby appointed Commissioner to let the said Drain to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate)—to take security from the contractors, with good and sufficient sureties for the due performance of the work—to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor, less twenty per cent, until finally accepted by the Engineer; and that the Commissioner be paid the sum of \$1.50 for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending the same.

2nd. That there shall be raised, levied and collected from and off the lots and parts of lots to be benefitted by making the said Drain, the sum of \$640, as set forth in the said Schedule.

3rd. That the said sum of \$640 00 shall be divided into four equal annual instalments, bearing interest not exceeding the rate of eight per cent. per annum; the first payment to be made in 1871, and continued in each year until fully paid.

4th. That the Clerk shall in each year place the payments on the Collector's Roll, against the Lots or parts of Lots aforesaid, to be collected and paid over to the Treasurer, as other taxes are collected and paid over, to form a sinking fund to meet the payments of the Debentures hereinafter mentioned.

5th. That the sum of \$230 00, assessed upon the Road allowance, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Township out of the general funds of the Municipality, on the order of the Commissioner.

6th. That for the purpose of raising funds to complete the making of said Drain, it shall be lawful for the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh to raise by way of loan, at a rate of interest not exceeding eight per cent. per annum, the sum of \$480 00, for which amount the Reeve shall cause Debentures to be made out in sums not less than \$100 each; with coupons attached for the payment of the interest yearly, such Debentures to be under the seal of the Corporation, and signed by the Reeve and Treasurer, and made payable at the Merchants' Bank at Chatham.

7th. That in consequence of some of the Lots and parts of Lots assessed for said Drain being non-resident lands, the Collector may be unable to collect said assessments from the lands, thereby causing a deficiency to meet the Debentures as they become due; it therefore shall be lawful for the Treasurer to pay from the general funds of the Township such sums as will make good such deficiency, and he shall replace the same to the general funds so soon as the said sums are collected from said lands.

8th. That this By-law shall be published in the Chatham Banner newspaper for six weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

That Joseph Heatherington is hereby confirmed in the office of Collector, and he is hereby required to enter into bonds on or before the meeting of the Council, in the month of May next, himself, in the sum of \$5,000, and other good freshhold sureties to the amount of \$10,000, which bond will require him to collect all rates levied on the Collector's Roll, and to pay over the same (less the Special School Rates which he will have to pay to the Secretary-Treasurers of the School Sections from which such Special School Rates were collected) to the Treasurer of this Corporation in manner following, that is to say: on his receiving his Collector's Roll he shall commence to collect the rates and shall pay in all monies received by him for taxes every two weeks and make his returns to the Treasurer as required by law. Salary, \$55 and no more, except the sum of five per cent. allowed for collecting the Special School Rates.

4th. That Martin Drew is hereby appointed to the office of Inspector of Licenses, and that his salary shall be the sum of \$15 and no more.
