THE NATIONAL IDEA.

Before Confederation Canada was nothing but a geographical expression. There were a people, territory and institutions, but there was no soul or spirit among the people. They had no idea but to make a living, or if they had it was to enhance the greatness and fame of a foreign, distant country.

Men in this not distant time were ashamed to call themselves Canadians. They were anything but that. The lethargy and apathy of the country were manifest on every hand, and the contrast afforded by our aspect and the activity and enterprise of our neighbors, the Americans, caused by many years of national life, was the cause of wonder and surprise to many.

The lecturer had already been lecturing for five hours, yet he was vigorous for another hour. He was in good voice and held his audience well in hand.

He began by referring to the long and interesting history of Egypt, and to the lofty position it occupied, and held that the present question of the English in the country was working towards one unity and progress of the empire.

He dealt with the present condition of Egypt and the relation that the United States had to it, and in his address he alluded to his own adventurous career, which was followed upon and the Turks came in for severe punishment.

He was an approach to independence; but he was not a free man. The Sultan of Turkey is in name at the head of the Egyptian government, but he is not a free man.
