GLOVERSTER CHERSE—The celebrated English Glowester cheese is made of new milk from the cow; and is of two rorts,—thin or single cheeses, about eight to the cert, and thick or double, about four to the ew. The liquid to congulate the milk is prepared with sweet briar leaves, bramble leaves, the salted maw and salt, and added, about one third of a pint, to fifty gallons of milk. As soon as the milk is curdled, the whey is strained off, the curd broken small, put into a var, and gently pressed for two hours; then to ned, pressed again for six or eight hours; again radded on both sides with salt, pressed again for twelve or founteen aours, and finally dried on a beard, being turned every day. In large cheeses, the sides are pieced with rors skewers to allow the whey to escape during the pressure.

Glomeestershire has hitherto been the principal sear of this manufacture, but North Wiltshire begins to ake the lead. Chelder cheese is of this kind, and steemed the choisest sort, but the quantity made is very small. The Gruyere cheese of Switzerland is very small.
