REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

The Superannuation Fund's allowance should come in after this exhibit, and here I am glad to say the Book Committee, a few weeks ago, very cordially carried a motion I made that \$7,000 this year be given for the benefit of the Superannuation Fund's claims. This harmonizes with the gratifying profits of the year, for it is the largest sum ever given to this Fund.

It is, of course, well known to the members of this Conference that out of our profits to meet our debentures we must lay aside \$12,000 for the first five years, and about half this sum for the second five years. These annual amounts, with the amount of the sale of the old King Street premises, will pay all our debentures. The first series of debentures, namely, the debentures for five years, mature this month, when our debenture-holders can claim \$84,000, and our Book Room will be ready to meet every claim when presented. And, as we are able to meet the larger claim, we certainly look forward, with a well-grounded hope, to be able to meet the smaller claim when due.

This \$12,000 which we must lay aside this year, completing the five years' laying aside for the five-year debentures, and the \$7,000 for the Superannuation Fund, take \$19,000 out of our profits, leaving but a few thousands, which I am sure the business and conservative minds of this Conference will acknowledge should be added to the capital.

REPORT OF MEMORIAL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee on Memorials met and organized by appointing Rev. R. Hobbs, Chairman, and Rev. J. Van Wyck, Secretary.

1. In reference to the memorial of the Prison Reform Association, requesting this Conference to appoint a Standing Committee on Prison Reform, to co-operate with the Prison Reform Association within the bounds of this Conference, your Committee would recommend that this Conference appoint such committee, and that the Chairmen of the respective Districts compose that committee.

2. Your Committee would also recommend the pastors, some Sabbath in the month of November, to make such reference to the aim and work of the Prison Reform Association as in their judgment may seem best.

3. *Re* the memorial of the Simcoe Quarterly Board, that a minister be appointed to the town of Simcoe by this Conference, your Committee begs respectfully to report that :

Whereas the action of the Stationing Committee does not legitimately come under the control of this Conference; and whereas your Committee has not been put in possession of the reasons which guided the Stationing Committee in the preparation of the first draft of its report; and whereas the clause "to be supplied," placed opposite the name of the Simcoe Circuit, in our judgment, implies the intention of the Committee to appoint a brother to Simcoe; therefore your Committee, notwithstanding the rumors referred to by your memorialists, sees no ground for apprehension on the part of the Simcoe Quarterly Board.

Nevertheless, your Committee, being of the unanimous opinion that a suitable appointment should be made to the Simcoe Methodist congregation, would cordially request the Stationing Committee to grant the prayer of your memorialists in this regard.

Your memorialists, however, incidentally allude to the possibility of the church and parsonage property passing from under the provisions of the Model Deed, and of their inability to prevent such a consummation by the payment of the debt. Your Committee, therefore, though not considering themselves specially required by the nature of the memorial to call attention to this matter, yet in view of the gravity of the situation and the extent to which the connexional interests are imperilled, would respectfully submit to the attention of the Conference the following considerations:

(1) That while not presuming to locate the blame for the existence of the unfortunate troubles through which the Simcoe Methodist Church has of late years been passing, yet the fact of these troubles is greatly to be deplored.

(2) That it is also cause for sincere and profound regret that the feelings engendered by said troubles have been allowed to live so long and operate so injuriously to connexional interests, when a more yielding and pacific spirit would not only have been a better exemplification of the principles of the Gospel and have more greatly tended to promote the glory of God, but would have obviated the present unfortunate crisis.

(3) We are also strongly of the opinion that considering the claims of the connexion upon said church and parsonage property, which claims the trustees were solemnly bound, by virtue of their appointment, to conserve and protect, the trustees of the property, after exhausting all available resources to meet the obligation, and failing to do so, should have reported the case fully to this Conference and made an appeal for help, so that plans might have been matured and timely measures adopted whereby this valuable property might not be lost to the connexion.

We would therefore recommend that there be such united and prompt action on behalf of the trustees and members of the church and congregation as to prevent the issue of the final order for the foreclosure of the mortgage on the church property, thereby forcing this Society into a position that would make its relation to Methodism exceptional, and thus establish a precedent which, if followed by other Societies to any considerable extent, would ultimately destroy the connexionalism of the Methodist Church.

Whilst there is a slight increase in the income of the Fund over last year, it is absolutely necessary that either some additional source of income be found for the Fund, or that much more earnest efforts be made by each Superintendent to bring up the returns according to the present Constitution, so that every one of our brethren may have adequate support, and that we may prove ourselves to be a connexion in fact as well as in name. The Committee has reason to fear that some brethren do not take sufficient pains to explain and enforce the claims of the Fund before their congregations.

We recommend that the Constitution of the Fund be printed in the Minutes of this year, and that Rev. R. Hobbs be continued as Treasurer.

CONSTITUTION OF THE SUSTENTATION FUND.

1. The object of this Fund shall be to secure salaries of not less than \$750 for ordained married ministers, \$400 for ordained unmarried ministers, and \$350 for probationers; *provided, nevertheless*, that no appropriation from this Fund shall be made to married ministers who have received more than \$550 for salary, board and fuel; or to ordained single ministers who have received \$250 for salary, in addition to board; or to probationers who have received \$200, in addition to board, until these sums respectively have been provided in full.

2. The income of this Fund shall be derived from a collection taken up in all our congregations, in the month of March in each year.

3. The Committee for the distribution of this Fund shall consist of a minister and a layman from each District, and shall be appointed by the Conference.

4. There shall be a Conference Treasurer appointed on the nomination of the said Sustentation Fund Committee.

5. This Constitution shall be printed in the Minutes of the Conference from year to year.

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT.

Your Committee begs leave to report that the continued prosperity of our Sabbath Schools within the Conference is everywhere manifest.

There are 271 schools, an increase of two. All of our appointments except fourteen are supplied with Methodist Sabbath Schools. There are enrolled 26,660 scholars, being an increase of 771. The number of those who have taken the Total Abstinence Pledge is 7,194. We are pleased to note that the sum of \$3,233.93 was raised for Missions. It is also a source of gratification to your Committee that there is a marked increase in the circulation of Sabbath School periodicals published by our Book Room.

The circulation of the *Onward* is increased by 385 copies, *Pleasant Hours* 435, and *Happy Days* by 577 copies. Your Committee would continue to urge upon our Sabbath Schools the claims and advantages of our own literature, and a continued loyal support of our own Publishing House.

We regret that so few Sabbath Schools hold regular teachers' meetings for the study of the lessons, as we consider that in the careful preparation of the lessons by the teacher lies, to a great extent, the secret of his success; and we would recommend to the pastors and Sabbath School superintendents the importance of making arrangements for the holding of such meetings for the systematic preparation of the work for the Sabbath.

Your Committee would respectfully call the attention of all our Sabbath Schools to paragraph 295 of the Discipline, which provides for holding a temperance meeting once in each quarter and presenting an opportunity for signing the pledge.

Your Committee are of the opinion that many of our Sabbath School officers and teachers are not sufficiently alive to the importance of keeping a correct record of the conversion to God of the scholars, and consequently are not able to answer the question in the Sabbath School schedule, "How many conversions during the year?" thereby making the report incomplete; therefore we recommend that blank cards be placed in the hand of each teacher by the superintendent of each school before the annual report is made up, with instructions that said teachers are to return to him the names of all who are or have been members of their respective classes who have been converted during the year.

Your Committee are of the opinion that sufficient attention is not paid by Trustee Boards to the character and internal arrangements of Sabbath School buildings. Therefore we would urge upon the Church that, in the erection of school buildings, greater attention be paid to the beauty, comfort and general adaptability for Sabbath School work.

We also recommend that A. L. Gee be Secretary-Treasurer for the present year.

The Treasurer's report was audited by Rev. R. J. Elliott and Thomas Wood, Esq., and found correct.

We recommend the following:—

1. That the collection for this Fund be taken up in the month of September.
2. That the object of the Fund be clearly stated before taking the collection, especially the following points: (*a*) That necessary Conference expenses and special claims of affliction alone can be considered legitimate; (*b*) That the salary of a minister regulates his claim on this Fund, no minister having any claim whose salary amounts to \$800 or over, and others only in cases of very special affliction; (*c*) That cases of ordinary expenses for physician's bills cannot be entertained; (*d*) That when a Circuit requiring ministerial supply during the year is considered by the Committee abundantly able to pay for the same, the Committee may reduce the claim or rule it out altogether; (*e*) That the maximum amount allowed for funeral expenses shall be for the minister or his wife, \$40; for children from twelve to eighteen years of age, \$30; and for children under twelve years of age, \$20.
3. That the Secretary of the Conference for the current year order the necessary supplies for his successor in office.
4. That Rev. J. H. Collins be re-elected Treasurer.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SYSTEMATIC GIVING.

Your Committee on Systematic Beneficence begs leave to report as follows: The Niagara Conference has appointed a committee on this subject at each session of the Conference since 1889, and it is gratifying to learn that some good results have followed from its annual reports. It suggested to the last General Conference the necessity of recognizing and legislating on the subject of Systematic Giving, and the suggestion was acted upon by that body. A large and important committee was appointed, whose report was adopted as the law of the Methodist Church on the subject.

Since the deliverance of the General Conference, backed up by the yearly recommendations of this Conference, there have been many signs of improvement in our methods of Church finance. Indirect methods of raising money for the cause of God, and commercial undertakings for the same purpose, have in many instances given place to the scriptural plan of direct giving. A growing interest is manifested in the subject among our people, and in a large number of our more important congregations there are to be found many who give to God of their substance in a systematic way, and a definite proportion of their earnings finds its way into the Lord's treasury. Your Committee has reliable information that the effect of this method of giving is good in every way. Those who commence to give in this systematic manner very rarely, if ever, abandon it, and invariably testify to its beneficent results, not only upon their spiritual lives, but even upon their finances, declaring that they are better off in this world's goods since God has been admitted as an actual partner in their monetary affairs. The benefit conferred upon our various Church funds by this method of giving among our membership is apparent upon almost all our circuits.

While we gratefully acknowledge the good which has been done, yet we must confess that our achievements are but as a drop in the ocean of our needs. So far as we can discover, very many of the superintendents of circuits have neglected to read the report of this Committee to their congregations, also neglected to preach a special sermon on this subject as directed by the Conference. We would again ask the Conference to instruct all our ministers to aid in every way in their power in this great reform in the methods of Church finance by calling attention to this report in their congregations, preaching on the subject, and circulating literature as they may have opportunity. There are many excellent books obtainable on this subject, some of which should be read, but the best text-book, both as to the method of giving and the amount to give, is the "Bible," to which all are earnestly referred for further and particular information on this great subject.

We suggest that a free-will offering is more in keeping with the principles of Christianity than any other method of taking up a collection. We earnestly request that all parents and Sunday School teachers, both by precept and example, begin early to teach the children to give to God as He gives to them, showing them the great honor God confers upon them in being co-workers with Him, and that while it is a duty thus to give, it is a greater privilege. We would also suggest that all our Epworth Leagues make a special study of Systematic Giving. We also ask per-

mission through this report to request of our ministers and members items of news, or information bearing upon this subject that may be helpful in propagating the doctrine of systematic and direct giving. All of which is respectfully submitted.

REPORT OF CHURCH PROPERTY COMMITTEE.

To the President and Members of the Niagara Conference :

GENTLEMEN,—Your Committee on Church and Parsonage Property begs to submit the following report :—

1. We have received the following requests for permission to deal with Church property :

Hamilton District.—The Trustee Board of Tapleystown parsonage, old church and shed site ask permission (1) To sell the old shed lot at Tapleystown, and to apply the proceeds to new parsonage property at Tapleystown ; (2) to dispose of the old parsonage and lot at Tapleystown, proceeds to be applied to the new parsonage at Tapleystown. We recommend that both these requests be granted.

Welland District.—The Trustee Board of Rainham Mission ask permission to sell the church and parsonage property at Rainham Centre, proceeds to be applied to reduce the debt on the new parsonage at South Cayuga. We recommend that this request be granted.

Norwich District.—The following resolution was adopted by the Norwich District :

Moved by Peter Quance, seconded by Rev. T. R. Clarke, and

Resolved,—That whereas the Delhi Quarterly Board asked permission to sell the easterly part of the Delhi church lot ; and whereas permission was regularly granted in the Conference of 1883 for sale of said property, this District Meeting would ask Conference to instruct the President to attach the seal of the Conference to the deed transferring said property.

We recommend that the permission above referred to, and the sale made in pursuance thereof, be re-affirmed, and that the President be instructed to carry out the same by affixing the seal of the Conference as requested.

The Trustees of the Zion Church property, on the Courtland Mission, ask permission to sell the property, \$100 of the proceeds to be devoted to parsonage improvement, and the balance to the Trustees of the Venison Creek appointment for cemetery purposes, on the condition that they either use the lot as a graveyard or remove the graves from the same.

Having heard the explanation of the Chairman of the District, we recommend that this request be granted.

Brantford District.—The Trustee Board of the church at Sheffield ask permission to adjust the boundary of the lot on which the church is built by conveying a portion of such lot. Recommended.

Woodstock District.—The Trustee Board of the parsonage property at Innerkip ask permission to sell one-quarter of an acre of land from the north side of the parsonage property, the proceeds to be applied in reducing the debt on the parsonage. Recommended.

Simcoe District.—The Trustee Board of the Valley Church, on the Selkirk Circuit, ask leave to sell the said church and reserve the proceeds for a parsonage fund. Recommended.

The Trustee Board of the Oneida Centre Church desire permission to sell the said property, and reserve the proceeds for a parsonage fund. Recommended.

2. In the matter of the report of the St. Lawrence Central Camp-Ground Committee :

Whereas, it appears that there is still a net deficiency of over \$5,000 for which the Trustees in this case appear to be personally liable ; and whereas this Conference has been requested to raise some fair proportion of this amount, we recommend that the matter be referred to the financial district meetings, to be dealt with by them to the best of their ability.

3. In the matter of the Memorial of the Quarterly Board of Canboro' Circuit, requesting this Conference to cause the Dunnville Quarterly Official Board to comply with the award made in a certain arbitration between the said Board,

Whereas, it appears that by an award in writing dated August 25th, 1881, dividing the proceeds of the sale of the parsonage property at Dunnville, the sum of \$176 was awarded to the Bethel appointment, then on the Rainham Circuit, but now a part of Canboro' Circuit ;

And whereas it also appears that \$75, a part of the said sum, has been paid to or on account of the said Bethel appointment ;

And whereas the said award was afterwards confirmed by a subsequent arbitration had in January of the present year, whereby \$101, the balance of the said sum, was directed to be paid by the Dunnville Quarterly Board to the Canboro' Quarterly Board, on the 15th day of March, 1893, but the said balance does not appear to have been as yet paid ;

Your Committee having considered the documents produced before us in the matter, are of opinion that the said 1st-mentioned award should be complied with by the Dunnville Quarterly Board without further delay, and your Committee recommend that the President of the Conference and the Chairman of the District concerned, do take such steps as are in harmony with the Discipline and usages of the Church, to secure the payment of the said balance with lawful interest from the said 15th day of March, 1893.

Your Committee wish further to say that they have been embarrassed and delayed in their work by reason of irregularities in the preparation of the material submitted for consideration, and they wish to call the attention of the parties charged with the preparation of such material, to the necessity for a more careful observance of the proper procedure in such cases.

REPORT OF THE VISITORS TO THE WESLEYAN LADIES' COLLEGE, HAMILTON.

Your Visitors beg to report that in accordance with the wish of the Conference of 1892, they have officially visited the above College, and in other ways have kept themselves acquainted with its operations during the

year. They find that the handsome and extensive building used for a boarding hall and college purposes is kept clean and in good repair, and has special attention paid to sanitary arrangements. The rooms for the students are spacious and comfortable, and the table supply is of good quality and abundant. The work of instruction is carried on under the careful and efficient direction of the able and experienced Principal, Rev. Dr. Burns, and is in the hands of a competent staff of teachers, several of whom are university and college graduates—biblical instruction and religious training forming a prominent feature in this important work.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee is pleased to be able to report an increase of 741 members in the Church, which is a gratifying evidence that God is with us, and that the fire that lived in the hearts of our fathers is still burning on our altars. While we rejoice in many marks of progress, there is reason for deep humiliation before God, that we have not been more successful in winning souls.

We do not depreciate any agency used by God for the advancement of the Master's kingdom. Yet we would urge the necessity of both pastor and people to look for immediate results in every service in the ordinary work of the sanctuary.

We would recommend the formation of District Conventions to discuss ways and means to arouse, if possible, a deeper spiritual interest in our Church life.

The reports from our Sunday Schools show an increase of 771 in numbers, and an increased efficiency in their work. The Epworth League is acting, not only as an antidote against the sinful vices of the times, but is training our young people for citizenship, and to be more efficient in Christian work.

We desire again to call attention to the fact noted in your last year's report, that many of our members are lost to the Church by not obtaining letters of removal.

We would earnestly impress upon all our people that they forget and forsake not the place and hour of prayer, that through fellowship with God in His sanctuary their life may be stronger, purer and more Christ-like.

There is an encouraging increase in our Connexional Funds of \$2,349.83 net.

Your Committee conclude their report by recording their profound gratitude to Almighty God for the success of the year, and hope that increased influence in riper experience and greater activities on the part of both pastor and people may, with the blessing of God, result in yet more glorious conquests in the future.

REPORT OF THE EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee met and organized with W. J. Waugh as Chairman and Rev. John Stewart as Secretary, and begs leave to report as follows:—

We are pleased to be able to say that the year has been one of progress in this very important part of Church work. There were sixty-seven Leagues reported within the bounds of this Conference last year, with a membership of 2,818; now we have eighty-five Leagues with a membership of 3,987, thus showing an increase of eighteen in the number of Leagues, and 1,169 in the membership. Last year's report showed \$2,160.57 as having been raised in connection with Epworth Leagues, and this year we report \$3,418.49, being an advance of \$1,257.92. But, while gratified to note this progress, we would at the same time call attention to the fact that, with 285 preaching appointments, only eighty-five (less than one-third) have Epworth Leagues in connection with them, and would earnestly recommend to pastors the organization of Leagues wherever practicable.

Your Committee would also call attention to the importance of having this young people's movement under direct denominational control, and thus be a part of our connexional system. Hence we would recommend the Conference to express itself as opposed to foreign organizations or separate local associations, and as emphatically in favor of all our young people's societies being organized and known under the name of Epworth League of Christian Endeavor, thus bringing them into close connection with the Methodist Church, and entitled through the President to representation on the Quarterly Board, as well as affiliation with the Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor of Ontario.

Believing in the importance of bringing the children of our congregations early into line, we would heartily endorse the junior work; and whereas a minister of our Conference, the Rev. T. Albert Moore, has been appointed Superintendent of this department for Ontario, we would earnestly recommend a willing co-operation with him in his efforts to advance this work.

Your Committee would concur in the suggestion from the Executive of the Ontario Methodist Young People's Association for the appointment of secretaries in each District to have some oversight of the work, thus forming a connecting link between the Local Societies and the Provincial Executive.

2. We would most earnestly counsel our people to discountenance all funerals on the Sabbath day, except in cases of extreme necessity; we would urge them to avoid all social visiting, all military parades, and all travelling for business or pleasure on the Lord's day, and we would advise them to throw the whole weight of their influence and example against the running of railway trains, street cars, steamboats and all public conveyances on the Sabbath day.

3. We would affectionately warn our people against neglect of the Lord's house; against a worldly spirit and worldly conversation, and against all habits and practices, on the Lord's day, which tend to dissipate the mind and hinder the proper cultivation and growth of the spiritual life.

4. In regard to a letter from the law firm of McMurrich, Coatsworth, Hodgins & Geddes, on behalf of a client, whose name is not given, complaining that unlawful and improper traffic is carried on during the Sabbath day at Grimsby Park. Having heard the testimony of several Directors and others, affirming that the accusations are without foundation, that no traffic is permitted, and that the small admission fee charged at the gates is a substitute for collections at the various services, your Committee find that there is no truth in the accusations made, except as regards the charging of fees at the gates, and in regard to that, we feel it should be left to the Association to take the course which may seem to them best for the peace and order of the Sabbath, and we therefore recommend the Conference to take no action in the matter.

5. Your Committee also beg leave to submit the following resolution, upon a question of world-wide importance:

Whereas, the World's Columbian Exposition at Chicago is international in its scope, all the various nations of the world having been invited to join in it; whereas, the Dominion of Canada and the Province of Ontario have extensive exhibits, and considerable financial interest in the Exposition; whereas, we, as a Christian nation, desire to reverence and observe the Sabbath day; and whereas, the Congress of the United States granted a large sum of money to the said World's Exposition, on the express condition that it should be closed on the Sabbath day; therefore

Resolved,—That we, the members of the Niagara Conference of the Methodist Church, representing a large proportion of the population of Western Ontario, regret to learn that the directors of the said World's Exposition have broken faith with the Congress of the United States and with the people, that we feel ourselves morally bound to enter our unqualified protest against the unexpected and unrighteous action of the said directors in opening the Columbian Exposition on Sunday, and that we hope that, under no circumstances, will the authorities of the Dominion and provinces of Canada, permit any department of the Canadian exhibits to be opened to the public on the Sabbath day.

6. For an appropriate action upon the resolutions received from the Secretary of the London Conference, condemning the opening of the Columbian Exhibition on Sunday, your Committee refer to the foregoing resolution.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee on Temperance begs leave to report as follows :

1. We note with great interest and deep satisfaction that marked progress in the prohibition cause has characterized the year, which closes with brighter promise for prohibition than our Province has ever known before, while unusual vigor has characterized the activities of the temperance people in general, resulting in contests for local option, reduction of licenses, and early-closing movements, many of which have succeeded. The year has been made memorable : (1) By the Manitoba plebiscite on prohibition, with the magnificent and almost unparalleled majority by which it was carried ; (2) by the demand of the Manitoba Legislative Assembly on the Dominion Government for a prohibitory law for the Province, carried in the Legislature with only one solitary dissentient ; (3) by the prolonged and exciting debates in the Ontario Legislative Assembly arising out of the introduction into that body of Mr. Marter's courageous bill aiming at the prohibition of the retail traffic in liquors ; out of the introduction of the Government measure for the plebiscite, and out of the exposure and discussion of the various types and instances of license iniquity, and especially those of collusion of license officials with the liquor traffic ; (4) By the argument before the Supreme Court of Canada as to the constitutionality of the local option law.

2. We cannot but hail with deep satisfaction as an augury of good the spirit of emulation manifested in the two great political parties of this Province, by their eagerness to pledge themselves to prohibitory measures so far as within the power of the Legislature, according to their various estimates. And, in our judgment, the temperance people owe a deep debt of gratitude to the men who composed the Convention which met in Toronto, April 20th, and by its prompt and decisive action largely contributed to the above-mentioned result.

3. That while the plebiscite is not all that we want, nor yet the best that we conceive might have been given, and while we are unwilling to commit ourselves to an endorsement of the methods, terms, and conditions of the vote, we yet believe it to be a step forward, and hereby ask the pastors and people of this Conference to lay aside every personal preference or objection, and with united forces and purpose enter upon the plebiscite campaign with such ardent zeal and such thoroughness of organization and plans of work (as revision of voters' lists, holding of public meetings to rouse public sentiment, canvassing, getting out the vote, etc.), as will secure such an overwhelming majority in favor of prohibition as to silence forever objections on the score of public opinion not being favorable, and remove every excuse on that ground for the refusal of any Government to pass such a law for this Province.

4. We likewise note with great gratification, as an important collateral step to the plebiscite, the pledge of the Ontario Government to take steps to ascertain, by formal reference to the proper Court, the power of the Provincial Government, under the Constitution, to deal with the prohibition of the liquor traffic.

5. We unqualifiedly declare that the liquor license system is sinful, both in principle and practice, from the foundation up, and that the

people of the Methodist Church should decline all responsibility for such a system.

6. The attention of your Committee having been drawn to the fact that 700 missionaries, meeting in the Decennial Missionary Conference of Continental India, failed to pass resolutions against the opium traffic, the liquor traffic, and the State regulation of social vice, we cannot but unhesitatingly and unequivocally declare that such a conspiracy of silence amidst the glaring evils mentioned, involves a complicity with public wrong-doing which is a deep stain on the honor of the Christian Church, and totally unworthy of those who are ambassadors of Jesus Christ to heathen lands. It is our further opinion that in every land the attitude of the Christian missionary should be one of uncompromising and outspoken opposition to all such evil traffics, since they so greatly militate against the work of the Gospel.

7. We urge on all our people the most strenuous efforts against the use of tobacco in all its forms by either old or young, and declare that we regard its use as a kindred vice to the use of intoxicating liquors; we further regret to learn that the legislation passed to protect minors from this habit, has largely failed so far to accomplish its purpose, in consequence of the lax enforcement of the law.

8. We recommend that the following be appointed delegates from this Conference to the Plebiscite Convention, to be held in Toronto, October 3rd; viz.: Revs. J. S. Ross, M.A., Dr. Brethour, J. W. Cooley, T. H. Orme, R. Hobbs, G. W. Kerby, and Messrs. Joseph Gibson, William McCleary, M.P.P., J. S. Deacon, R. M. Fullerton, E. D. Tillson, F. W. Watkins, Dr. M. Youmans.

9. We also strongly urge that each church in our Conference send an official representation to this same very important Convention.

10. We recommend (*a*) that a quarterly temperance meeting be held whenever possible at each appointment; (*b*) that a Band of Hope be organized in each Sunday School; (*c*) that a temperance fund for this Conference be sustained by one collection during the year from each Sunday School, to be taken on some Sabbath when a temperance lesson is taught; (*d*) We urge more zeal in the circulation of the pledge in the Sabbath School, as a comparatively small proportion of signatures are reported—only 27 per cent. of the total attendance of scholars in the Sabbath Schools.

11. We recommend that Rev. J. W. Cooley be the representative of this Conference to the Dominion Alliance.

12. The Treasurer of the Annual Conference Temperance Fund, reported receipts from Financial Secretaries for the year as \$30.54, which, with balance of previous year, \$24.82, makes the total amount on hand \$55.36.

13. We recommend that Rev. J. W. Cooley be Treasurer for the Niagara Conference Temperance Fund, and that the Treasurer be authorized to pay out moneys on the order of Rev. Dr. Brethour, Chairman of this Committee.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

Report of the Board of the Superannuation Fund, for the Year ending July 31st, 1892.

We have pleasure in being able to state that the income for the Annual Fund has increased from circuits, \$1,443.16, and from ministers' subscriptions, \$435.41; thus enabling us to meet the claims in full, notwithstanding the increased expenses, as shown in the financial statement, and yet keep within the estimates for the year.

There has also been an addition of \$12,373.91 made to the capital account in the item of legacies, being an increase over the preceding year of \$5,936.66. This shows a very commendable disposition on the part of our friends to contribute in this way for the permanent benefit of the Fund.

It has been found very difficult to secure safe investments for our funds at present rates. We have therefore been under the necessity of keeping a larger amount in the bank than we thought to be desirable. It was, however, considered better to do this than to invest in doubtful securities. This has led to a falling off in our interest account of about \$340.

On account of the unusual mortality among our aged ministers, the expired claims will about balance the new claims placed on the Fund.

MISCELLANEOUS RESOLUTIONS, ETC.

Rev. W. H. Garnham's Appeal.

At the Conference of 1892, Rev. Dr. Sutherland ruled that an Annual Conference had no power to tax the salaries of ministers, unless expressly authorized to do so by the action of the General Conference, and that in the case as proposed by Mr. Garnham *re* the Sustentation Fund, no such express authority had been given. Against this ruling Mr. Garnham appealed. A communication was read to the Conference from Rev. Dr. Carman, saying that the appeal had been considered and dismissed, and that the ruling of the President had been confirmed.

Billeting Fund Regulations.

The regulations of the Billeting Fund of last year were amended as follows:—

1. That for next year we have a Billeting Fund.
2. That the pastor of the Conference Church be the Treasurer of the same.
3. That all members of the Conference, lay and clerical, pay the sum of \$1.00.
4. That the Secretary of the Conference shall send a supply of notices or post-cards to each Chairman, to be handed to the Secretary of the District, to be mailed to each lay representative, said notice to intimate that he must send \$1.00 if not paid at the District Meeting direct to the Treasurer of the Billeting Fund.
5. That any member of Conference arranging for his own billet shall send notice to the Treasurer, informing him of the home where he has made arrangements to stay.
6. That the limit of any one claim be \$5.00, excepting in the case of members of the Stationing Committee and invited guests; and further, that any balance on hand, after paying expenses, be given over to the Contingent Fund—the balance of last year to be paid to the Contingent Fund of this year, and the balance of this year to be paid to the Contingent Fund of next year.

OBITUARY.

REV. DAVID SAVAGE.

Our beloved brother was born in London, Eng., January 8th, 1830, and on May 23rd, 1893, in the sixty-fourth year of his age, finished in triumph and with joy his devout, useful, honored and laborious ministry of forty-three years. His parents were pious, earnest, consistent, God-fearing people, whose example and influence early led him to consecrate himself to God. He received as a boy in old London a good classical education, in the school of a Mr. Atkins, Hackney, and was precocious as a scholar, making good use of his opportunities. With his father's family he came to Canada in 1841, and settled in Montreal, where he attended the High School, in which he speedily distinguished himself as a student, by diligence and ability winning the prize awarded by the Governor-General, Lord Metcalfe. He was apprenticed to the druggist business with his uncle, the late Mr. Alfred Savage, of Montreal, but a severe illness interrupted that career. On recovering, he went to Picton to learn farming, and shortly after began teaching school in that vicinity, about which time he also began to have thoughts of entering the Christian ministry. His father's family removed to Guelph in 1848, and he accompanied them, taking charge of the farm for a time; soon, however, resuming work as a teacher in the neighborhood of St. Catharines, from which locality he was led into the ministry of the Methodist New Connexion Church. The family were Congregationalists, and David was converted in Montreal, under the ministry of Rev. Henry Wilkes, D.D., and united with the Congregational Church in 1847. He early in his Christian life gave evidences of the fine and delicate fibre of his religious nature, of uncompromising rectitude of moral conduct, and zeal and ardent love for humanity.

In 1850 he entered on the work of the Christian ministry, under the chairman, being formally received on trial in 1851. His subsequent stations were Welland Canal, Toronto (three times), London (four times), Hamilton, Cavan, Aurora, Nassagaweya, Galt, Tilsonburg and Petrolia; on each of which his abundant labors, evangelistic fervor and godly fidelity won for him a name which is as "ointment poured forth." In every field singular spiritual success marked his ministry. To him came freely and abundantly those connexional honors and burdens which betokened the confidence and esteem of his brethren in the Conference. He was twice President of the New Connexion Conference, in 1862 and 1874; in addition was Chairman of District in 1868, 1869, 1878 and 1879. He filled the office of Connexional Editor, having charge of the *Evangelical Witness* in 1872-74; and in 1874, after union, was appointed Associate Editor, with Rev. Dr. Dewart, on the *Christian Guardian* and *Evangelical Witness*, which position he occupied till 1876, when he resumed the pastorate,

in which altogether he spent thirty-one years. At the General Conference of 1874 he was associated with the late Rev. Dr. Egerton Ryerson, as fraternal delegate of the Canada Methodist Church to the British Wesleyan and New Connexion Methodist Conferences, on which mission he went to England in 1875. In the movement for the organic union of the Wesleyan and New Connexion Churches, he took from the beginning a very active part, and in Conference, as well as in the columns of the *Evangelical Witness* strongly advocated that measure. At the time of the consummation of the union, in 1874, he was President of the New Connexion Conference.

The New Connexion Conference of 1871 requested Mr. Savage to prepare a volume as a memorial of the late Rev. Wm. McCline, the Theological Tutor for some years of that Church. The volume, entitled "Life and Labors of the Rev. W. McCline," was prepared in consequence, and issued in 1872, and constitutes the chief work of permanent literary value by which as author and editor Bro. Savage will be known. The editorial work discloses careful discrimination, and the book proved a faithful and minutely accurate and conscientious presentation of a much beloved and highly esteemed Christian minister.

A spirit of aggressive evangelism characterized his ministry from its outset, and grew upon him as the years went by. Feeling very strongly that the salvation of souls was immeasurably the most important work of the Church, and that no mere conventionalities of method should circumscribe her effectiveness, he felt strong sympathy with the aggressive methods and generous aims of the Salvation Army, and thought the Church should undertake similar work in a sort of "forward movement." While pastor of Wellington Street Church, London, he held numerous out-door services, which resulted in a blessed revival and large accessions to the Church. In Petrolia, following the idea still farther, he organized the Band Movement, which, in the next few years, spread its operations especially over the western portion of the Province, touching nearly every circuit. It certainly gave a great impetus to the Church's general life, and resulted in accessions by the thousand. Scores of young people entered the field as ministers or evangelists, directly as a result, large numbers of whom are still found in the ranks of the most useful and godly laborers.

In 1885 Bro. Savage relinquished circuit work, some elements of which had always been uncongenial, coveting a larger field and the privilege of constant evangelistic labor. The enthusiasm for soul-saving which glowed in his whole life, instead of fading with advancing years and failing strength, seemed to catch new ardor and became the one all-absorbing passion of these later years. To evangelistic work he devoted his remaining years with great success and unflinching zeal and industry. He went out first as an evangelist, accompanied by a band of young people. About five years ago he dropped the bands and went out alone. Everywhere his pure, prayerful spirit, affectionate manner and ripe experience proved great elements of power. He spent one or two seasons in Manitoba; in the Maritime Provinces seven months; in the Eastern Townships and other parts of Quebec he spent part of two seasons. This year his work embraced from Chatham, on the west, to Pembroke, on the east. In all this work there was the entire absence of any taint of boasting—he never said anything about numbers. His work and character have pre-eminently made him "the brother whose praise is in the gospel throughout all the churches."

On Wednesday, May 3rd, he returned home much wearied with his unintermittent work during the winter season. An engagement took him on Sunday, May 7th, to Lynedoch, where he preached at the Quarterly Meeting Service, in very great feebleness, but with very gracious influence and blessed results. He came home on Monday very ill. Pneumonia set in, and while for two weeks he lingered, he sank gradually beneath the power of the disease. Of him it was especially true that,

Expressions of his unfaltering trust, "prayer without ceasing," especially for those converted during the winter, and for others who lay heavy on his heart, commingled with his requests for Christian song and audible prayer by ministerial visitors, until the very air of his chamber seemed fragrant with the breath of Heaven's ambrosial flowers. The joy of clear victory shone upon the tears of pending separation. It was fitting that about the death-bed of this good man of such well-known and cosmopolitan Christian sympathies there stood representatives of the Methodist, Congregationalist, Episcopalian, Presbyterian and even Roman Catholic Churches, to see him conquer death, and "cease at once to work and live."

On May 25th, in connection with the funeral, a memorial service was held in Tilsonburg Church. Rev. W. Kettlewell, Chairman of the District, had charge, and after an obituary notice had been read by the pastor, Rev. J. W. Cooley, tenderly sympathetic and beautiful tributes were paid to his memory and work, by Revs. Geo. Richardson, J. S. Ross, M.A., E. Whitworth and M. McGregor, in the presence of a large and tearful congregation. The closed stores of the town, and the universal expressions of regret heard upon the street, manifested the place which he held in the esteem and affection of his fellow-townsmen. His remains were interred in Tilsonburg cemetery.

Bro. Savage was a man of unusual spiritual endowments and acquirements. A martyr to dyspepsia nearly all his life, his work was done under great feebleness of body. His intellectual capacity was of a high order; and as an effective, and at times, eloquent, preacher, vigorous writer and able debater, he early in life obtained full recognition. His work as a student was greatly hampered by his ill-health, which only permitted short periods of study at a time. His tastes, as well as the necessities of his life, made him most effective in the pastoral duties, where his diligence, piety and genial sympathy made him unsurpassed.

He was a man of many graces, and of him in a peculiarly lofty sense it may be said that,

"Through all this tract of years
He wore the white flower of a blameless life."

He preached the doctrine of holiness, as taught by the Methodist Church, without any fantastic or extravagant additions. He professed personally to enjoy the experience, and his spirit, life and conduct were a perpetual vindication of the truth of the profession. He was scrupulously conscientious to a degree, and was a man whose every breath seemed to exhale an incense of prayer. Transparently guileless, thoroughly unworldly, mere secular ambitions were laid aside, and with gracious lowliness he "humbled himself as a little child." His hand and purse were open to every call of human need, and his charities were often beyond his ability. His thoughtfulness for others, the utter absence of all censoriousness, and the deep and constantly manifested and unsimulated love that spoke in word and deed, made him so Christ-like in spirit and act that it is not extravagance of affection nor irreverent to say he possessed

"A heart in every thought renewed,
And full of love divine,
Perfect and right and pure and good,
A copy Lord of Thine."

He was married in 1853 to Miss Eliza Hamilton, who, in her widowhood, with two sons and two daughters, mourn one of the most exemplary of husbands and fathers. "The memory of the just is blessed."

THE ANNUAL ADDRESS OF THE NIAGARA CONFERENCE TO THE CHURCHES UNDER ITS CARE.

(To be read in all the Congregations.)

DEARLY BELOVED BRETHREN,—We greet you in the Lord. “Grace and peace be multiplied into you through the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord.”

Another year with its precious opportunities, and varied experiences in the work of the Master has fled, and again we find ourselves in the assembly of the Annual Conference reviewing the labors of the past twelve months, and organizing our forces for renewed toils and triumphs. Realizing our weighty responsibilities as ministers of the New Testament, and as lay representatives from the Churches, we earnestly pray that we may possess all those qualifications and spiritual endowments which are essential to true Christian discipleship, and to the success of a preached gospel.

We rejoice in this opportunity of testifying our unabated love for you in Christ Jesus, and our earnest desire that by mutual affection, united efforts and undiminished energy, we may fulfil our obligations to God, and accomplish that sublime mission for which the Church of Christ was organized. May “our rejoicing be this, the testimony of our conscience, that in simplicity and godly sincerity, not with fleshly wisdom, but by the grace of God we have had our conversation in the world.”

Our ministerial ranks have not remained unbroken during the year. Rev. David Savage, a brother greatly beloved, has been called to his reward after a lengthened ministry of over forty years—a ministry of extraordinary fervor and abundant labors. His departure was one of great triumph, and his crown of rejoicing will doubtless be brilliant with many stars. Thus, the standard bearers fall! Some after the toils and fatigues of an extended ministry, and others in the prime and blossom of their manhood, the sun of their life going down while it is yet day. Let us be admonished by the frequent inroads of death to “be steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord.”

We are encouraged by the continued presence of God amongst us in saving power. An increase of over 700 members is reported, after making up for all losses by defection, removal and death. We would remember, however, that an enlarged membership roll does not necessarily indicate increased vitality and efficiency in the Church. We rejoice in the ingathering of those who are truly saved, but would guard most assiduously against the danger of depending on mere numerical strength. Our numbers, instead of being a tower of strength, will be a source of weakness and embarrassment, providing they do not represent a living membership. Never should we forget that the efficiency of the Church as a spiritual force in the world, is to be measured by the extent of her power to testify of Christ. If the witnesses in any given Church have but a feeble testimony to give, or what is worse, an adverse testimony, that Church is weak no matter how numerous her membership may be, or what the social or material prestige of what she may boast. In religious matters as well as in many other things, there may be bulk without value, and numbers with-

out strength. In view of these facts we recognize the importance of scrutinizing most carefully the spiritual condition of those who knock at the doors of our Church for entrance, and of seeking to get back as far as possible to the standard of Church membership in apostolic times, when the Lord added to the Church daily "those that were being saved."

Permit us to direct your attention to some of the hindrances to the growth and progress of our Church. It behoves us to guard against sensationalism or mere emotional excitement, and other questionable devices in our efforts to promote the cause of Christ. Nothing but that which is superficial and spurious can result from such methods. The demand for novelties and outward display in the public services of God's house is one of the unhealthy signs of the times, and we are convinced no Church can pander to such tendencies without suffering most serious loss. We would not be pessimistic in our attitude, nor would we on the other hand close our eyes to facts that demand our prayerful consideration. We look with alarm on the tendency there is in some quarters to captivate the multitudes by advertising attractive musical programmes in connection with the regular religious services of the Lord's Day, relegating the preaching of the gospel into the back-ground, and making it a matter of minor consideration. This trend of the times does no augur well for the future of our beloved Methodism. Having unbounded faith in the plain, practical, old-fashioned truths of the Bible, as agencies for uplifting and saving men, we would urge you to co-operate with your pastors in conducting simple gospel services, being assured that in so doing the most satisfactory and permanent results will be attained.

Our educational institutions have been sustained by our people, and are in a state of general efficiency. True to the traditions of a Church that has always recognized the advantages of sanctified scholarship, we are highly gratified to mark the growing interest manifested by our people in the educational department of our work. The past year marks a new era in the history of Victoria University. University Federation is now an accomplished fact. Under new and untried conditions, but with bright prospects, "Victoria" has been transplanted to the city of Toronto, and is now in possession of her new home in the classic grounds of the Queen's Park, occupying a noble structure with ample accommodation and complete equipment involving a cost of \$222,000, all of which has been subscribed and paid through the munificent liberality of our people.

You will be gratified to learn that our Connexional Funds have been sustained and increased. All these funds are important, but we would commend to your special and most liberal consideration the claims of our Missionary Society. With new and vast fields of usefulness opening up before us, and appeals the most pitiable and importunate ringing in our ears, we cannot afford to rest in achievements already won. Our motto must be "Onward," if we would be true to the responsibilities which God has put upon us. We rejoice to report an increase of nearly \$1,700 in the missionary returns of the Niagara Conference for the past year.

The temperance question demands your earnest and prayerful consideration. "The Legalized Liquor Traffic" is a gigantic evil that is cursing every phase of our Christian civilization. If it be true that twenty-five per cent. of the people's earnings are wasted, and worse than wasted, through the use of intoxicating drinks; if it be true that seventy-five per cent. of all the crimes that are committed in our land are traceable

to this source; and if it be true that the social, domestic, political and national life of the people would be immeasurably enhanced by the utter and eternal abolition of this traffic, then surely the temperance question is one that demands the profoundest attention of all legislative authorities and of all Christian people, especially such as have power to influence the ballot-box either directly or indirectly. For, after all, this question must be settled at the polls. Ballots are the only things apparently that will awaken politicians to a sense of their danger and their duty. They seem to be unmoved and unmovable by any other kind of pressure. Premiers and their cabinets will bow to the demands of the Temperance Party when the Temperance Party has become mighty at the polls and not before. We therefore ask you to unite with us in our efforts to educate and moralize and Christianize the voting power of the people, being fully persuaded that not until the lofty principles of pure patriotism and real social reform have delivered the ballot-box from the shameful and corrupt dominancy of political partisanship will the appalling power of rum be arrested and overthrown. May this day of emancipation be hastened by the intelligent and Christian use of the franchise.

There are many other phases of the work of God which might be noticed, but time and space will not permit. Suffer us, however, before closing to call your attention to the importance of employing all means, ordinary and special, for the salvation of men and the progress of the Gospel. Special revival services are often found to be indispensable, and have been signally owned of God in the salvation of multitudes, but yet it remains true that the prosperity of our Zion depends mainly upon the faithful employment of the ordinary means of grace and the blameless walk and conversation of individual Christians. Let us recommend the Gospel by a life that reflects the transforming power of the Gospel. Vital religion is health and salvation for the times. "It blesses the individual, the family and the State, and multiplies all kinds of good to the sons of men."

Could we but prevail on all Church members to consecrate themselves without reserve to Christ and walk with God in the power and fulness of that spiritual life which it is the privilege and duty of every believer to enjoy, then would salvation, like our all-prevailing flood, sweep away every form of opposition, and the fruits of holiness would abound to the glory of God. "We beseech you, therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable, unto God, which is your reasonable service, and be not conformed to this world, but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

And now, brethren, we bid you adieu. May the Divine anointing abide with you. May the Holy Spirit in all the efficiency of His sacred ministry dwell in your hearts, and may the sweet savour of the knowledge of Christ be made manifest amongst you in every place, and "unto Him who is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, to the only wise God and Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen."
