



To His Excellency the Governor-General, the Marquis of Lansdowne, for his liberal donation to the Prize Fund, and for the encouragement to Rifle Shooting, by his gift of Silver and Bronze Medals to the several Provincial Rifle Associations.

To the Government and Members of the House of Commons for the liberal grant voted to the Association at the last Session of Parliament.

To the Hon. Minister of Militia and Defence, Sir Adolphe P. Caron, K.C.M.G., M.P., for his continued interest in the Association.

To Lt.-Colonel Ouimet for his donation of \$100 to the General Prize Fund.

To Colonel Wilson, of Bannockburn, Scotland, for the gift of a handsome Silver Jug for competition amongst the Marksmen of Canada, who had shot at Wimbledon.

To Mr. Steward, Optician, 406 Strand, London, England, for the gift of a Cup.

To the Canada Club of London, the thanks of the Association are also due for again presenting to the Wimbledon Team a handsome Silver Cup as a prize for the highest aggregate score, which was won by Staff Sergeant Ashall, of the 2nd "Queen's Own Rifle" Battalion, Toronto.

It is to be hoped that the continued success of our Marksmen at Wimbledon, (winning as they did last year, besides many other prizes, five places in the second and three in the third stage of the "Queen's," an achievement never before effected,) will convince the supporters of the Association that their aid has had good results, and will encourage them to continue the same in the future.

The Annual Matches on the Rideau Ranges also proved to be a splendid success, both as regards the numbers entered, and the regularity with which they were conducted. Not a single protest was recorded during the entire meeting, and the Treasurer's statement will show that the financial result was satisfactory:—The number of competitors, was slightly under that of the previous year (owing doubtless to the many marksmen away on active service in the North-west), but the entries were six hundred and eighty three more than in 1884, as the following comparative table will show.

was enlarged. The Middleton Match was a new feature.

At the ranges, previous to the matches, the firing points were all newly levelled and the butts repaired, and the improvements were thoroughly appreciated by the competitors, many of whom expressed great satisfaction thereat.

In the Military Matches, although there were a less number of entries than in the previous year, the firing was far ahead of that of former years; for example the "British Challenge Shield" Match, which was won in 1884, with 37 hits and a score of 160; was won in 1885 with 65 hits and a score of 241, and out of the 900 rounds fired by the nine corps competing, the hits made were as follows:

240 Body Hits, 146 Head Hits, 53 Upper Hits,

439 Total Hits, with nine corps competing, as compared with 424 hits made by fourteen corps, or 25 men more in 1884.

In the Gzowski Match, the same nine corps firing 1,350 rounds (Skirmishing 20, Volley Firing 5, and Independent Firing 5 rounds), the following results were obtained:

In view of the probability of Sighting Shots being abolished, as strongly recommended at the Annual General Meeting held during last year's matches at the Rideau Ranges, it will be necessary to arrange for further target accommodation for extra series and pool firing, which the Council think can be effected by utilizing the old butts where the Brunel" targets were, and putting in, say, half a dozen new targets.

The Prize List, thanks to the continued support given to the Association, was last year again very materially enlarged, and the increase in the number of entries in the Martini and "Extra Series" matches, shows that the competitors thoroughly appreciated the augmentation.

The Council desires to draw the attention of the Association to the remarks of Colonel Ross in his report on, and letters connected with the management of last year's Wimbledon Team, especially with reference to the advisability of our Marksmen having more practice and becoming more familiar with the use of the Martini, particularly at long ranges. That arm is now used altogether at Wimbledon; our shots can win places in the second and third stages of the "Queen's" Prize, but can never hope to pull off that Grand Prize, with the limited practice they can now obtain at the long ranges.

Dr. Horsey, Surgeon, G.G.F.G., assisted by Dr. Grant, Jr., Assistant-Surgeon, G.G.F.G., attended throughout the meeting as medical officers, without any remuneration, and although there was no case calling for their skill, the thanks of the Association are due to those gentlemen for the time so generously given, and the Council cannot close this portion of their report without thanking Major Macpherson, G.G.F.G., Executive Officer, the Range Officers and the rest of the Staff for their assiduous attention to their duties.

FINANCE.

The Treasurer's statement of the finances of the Association, duly audited, is submitted herewith.

The receipts from all sources for the year amounted to \$16,823.91, which, with the balance of \$1,373.77 carried forward from last year, makes a total on the credit side of \$18,197.68; while the expenditure amounted to \$16,877.97, leaving a balance of \$1,319.71 in favor of the Association.

This is independent of the balance of \$217.61 at credit of special account, carried forward from last year, held on account of Provincial Prizes (Marquis of Lorne donation). The Province of Prince Edward

Island having qualified this year competed and received the distribution of \$100, leaving a balance of \$117.61, and \$5.60 interest thereon, being a total of \$123.21 at credit of that account. The Province of British Columbia having yet to qualify for the competition, the accrued interest will be distributed proportionately to the provinces which may become entitled to the same.

The affiliation fees from Rifle Associations amounted to \$655, as against \$631 in 1884, an increase of \$24, the number of Rifle Associations affiliating this year being as follows:—Provincial Rifle Associations, 7; County and other Rifle Associations, 40.

Members' fees for the year amount to \$202, as against \$230 in 1884, a decrease of \$28.

The amounts received from Associate Members was \$278, an increase this year of \$11 as compared with 1884.

The receipts from "Special donations," "Banks" and "Manufacturers" amounted to \$1,700, as against \$1,992 received in 1884, a decrease of \$292.

The entry fees this year, including sighting shots, blow-off tickets, pool gains, post entry fees and fines, amounted to \$3,125.64, as against \$2,917.10 in 1884, an increase of \$208.54.

Comparison of the items on the debit side of the account with those of 1884 shows some fluctuations. The expenses connected with the Wimbledon Team being more than last year, a reference to the details of the expenditure will explain this excess.

The cash prizes this year, it will be observed, amounted to \$6,023.03, exclusive of the \$100 "Special Provincial Prizes." being \$748.07 more than the amount distributed in 1884.

REPORT OF LIEUT-COL. ROSS,

COMMANDING WIMBLEDON TEAM, 1884.

OTTAWA, 7th NOVEMBER, 1885.

SIR,—I have the honor to report that, in obedience to orders, I took command of the Wimbledon Team of 1885 on Tuesday, the 23rd of June.

The team was ordered to assemble at Ottawa on Monday, the 22nd of June, to commence practice previous to sailing.

The members were all present with the exception of Captain Corbin, 63rd Battalion. He was on his way from the North-West, where he had been serving with his battalion, and was permitted to join his comrades on the steamer at Rimouski.

The practice of the team may be considered only moderately satisfactory during the week here; the latter part was carried out under the supervision of Captain Clark, 90th Battalion, who had been appointed Adjutant.

We left Ottawa on the evening of Friday, the 26th of June, embarking on the "Parisian" on Saturday, the 27th of June.

The voyage to Liverpool was a most agreeable one; Dominion Day was duly celebrated. The efforts of the team to amuse their fellow passengers were much appreciated.

We arrived in Liverpool on Sunday morning, the 5th of July. The team remained there until Monday, when they proceeded by L. & N. W. Railway direct to Wimbledon. I remained in London to make arrangements as to banking, &c.

Immediately on reaching Moville, I addressed Lord Ranelagh, K.C.B., commanding 2nd South Middlesex Rifles, by letter and telegram, announcing our arrival, requesting he would be so kind as to arrange for the use of the ranges of his regiment, as alluded to in Lieut-Col. White's report of last year. Owing to unforeseen circumstances, the ranges referred to were not available at the time we wished. How-

ever, through Lord Ranelagh's kindness and the zeal of his adjutant, Major T. S. Clarke, King's Royal Rifle Corps, the team were allowed the use of the ranges at Caterham for one day only (Thursday). We availed ourselves of the kind offer, and the indulgence granted was of great benefit.

Through the courtesy of Col. Lumsden and the officers of the London Scottish, the team were made honorary members of the regiment, and as such used their ranges to a limited extent for a day or two. On the whole, the practice obtained during the week was unsatisfactory.

Whilst in the camp, I took opportunity to return the thanks of the D. R. A. to Lord Ranelagh and the officers of the 2nd South Middlesex Rifles, and to Colonel Lumsden and the officers of the London Scottish, for their unbounded kindness to their brother riflemen.

The team were entered for eighteen matches and sundry pools. The item of expense may be considered large, but to give the men a chance of more practice it was thought advisable to afford them every opportunity; the results proved the wisdom of my action.

The weather during the whole of the meeting was beautiful.

The firing of the team during the first week was very good, as the results proved.

In the "Queen's," by their steady work, five got places in the "three hundred," which is a victory of itself, when it is taken into consideration that nearly 3,000 men competed for places in this match, and Canada had but twenty representatives.

In the latter part of this match, three got into the "sixty."

The closing stage of this most interesting contest demonstrated beyond cavil that our marksmen are at a great disadvantage firing at the long ranges, for two reasons, viz.—the want of practice, and their limited knowledge of the use of the Martini-Henry.

I regret that it did not fall to the lot of the team of 1885 to bring back to Canada the Kolapore Cups. It must be admitted that we were fairly beaten. The teams drawn up against us were the most powerful that could be selected. The greatest impediment to the Canadians winning was the peculiar state of the atmosphere, caused by excessive heat, and again cropped up the want of practice with the Martini-Henry. I must not omit to note a new feature in this competition; a money prize of £25 sterling has been added to the cups. Colonel Burt with very good humor hinted to me that our chances of winning in the

future were small, first by reason of the money prize, and again evidently by the want of practice with the Martini-Henry. The Channel Islands teams were very strong; next season it is almost a certainty that an Australian team will be present to compete.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge inspected the team on Saturday, the 18th of July. As usual, he expressed his pleasure in once more seeing a contingent from Canada at Wimbledon, and holding such positions in the scores. His Royal Highness was most flattering in his expressions of pleasure at the success of the Canadian arms in the North-West. I endeavored in my humble way to return thanks for his kind words towards our fellow soldiers of the Canadian Militia and ourselves.

On Thursday, the 23rd of July, the Canada Club, with their usual kindness, requested Sir Charles Tupper, C.B., K.C.M.G., to present to the winner thereof, Staff-Sergeant Ashall, 2nd Queen's Own Rifles, a very handsome silver cup.

I availed myself of the opportunity to invite to a garden party as many Canadians as I could find, and other English friends; and it was in their presence that Sir Charles Tupper presented the cup, accompanied with very many kind words.

In returning thanks to the Canada Club, I took the opportunity to tender to Sir Henry Wilmot, Bart., V.C., Captain St. John Mildmay, and all the Wimbledon staff, my thanks and those of the team for numberless acts of kindness extended to us. From unforeseen circumstances, no reporter was present; and I feel constrained, for many reasons, to place on record a remark which fell from Sir Henry Wilmot in the course of his speech. It is as follows:—

"I consider the team now before me the best that ever stood on Wimbledon Common. For justification of my remarks, I have only to point to the prizes."

The team regretted that it was impossible, from other engagements, for Her Royal Highness the Princess Louise and the Marquis of Lorne to visit the Canadian camp.

Owing to the late campaign in the North-West, the Canadian camp was thronged with visitors from early morn to late at night. By means of a few photographs and war weapons, we endeavored to enlighten our guests as to the kind of foes our Canadian army had to contend against.

In thanking the officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the

Volunteer force of Great Britain for their unnumbered acts of kindness;
I have only to regret that it was not in my power in any adequate manner to repay such attention.

I must not omit to thank Reuter's representative, the correspondents of the Globe, Mail, and other papers for their great courtesy.

The Adjutant of the team, Captain Clark of the 90th Battalion, Winnipeg, was of the greatest assistance to me, and his knowledge of rifle shooting, in all in its phases, conduced in no slight measure to produce the results which the team of 1885 may cite without blushing.

I cannot close without alluding to the soldierly bearing of the team; their conduct and unstinted attention to my wishes and orders was most pleasing and gratifying.

I annex hereto copies of sundry communications I have addressed to the chairman of the Council, bearing on the Wimbledon team.

MEMO .- Re WIMBLEDON TEAM.

It would be desirable that the programme of the National Rifle Association for the year be on hand at Ottawa before sailing of team, so that each member could have a copy for study on the voyage.

It is under consideration to hold a Scottish National Meeting next year. If this is arranged I would suggest that the team be sent over in time to take part in it as the best means of preliminary practice. It is intended that the meeting take place one week before Wimbledon. The members of the team should pay their own entry money for this meeting.

In event of no such meeting taking place I would suggest that early correspondence be opened with the London Scottish or other corps, so that facilities for practice may be open on arrival. I consider practice in England of more importance than the practice at Ottawa before sailing.

I would suggest that the Department of Militia issue a quantity of arms (M. H.) to each battalion sending competitors to Ottawa, the commanding officers issuing same to competitors and being responsible for their custody.

The M. H. rifles should be in the hands of the "twenty" from the end of the meeting at Ottawa, and the practice ammunition should be served at same time.

Competitors have not always time in the Spring to fire the quantity allowed.

To be successful at Wimbledon competitors require to be using the M. H. rifle constantly.

The issue of these rifles to battalions in correspondence to the members going to Ottawa would enable the Dominion meeting to be shot over with M. H. rifles as at Wimbledon.

The best results at Wimbledon are usually obtained by those who have been frequent visitors there. I would therefore suggest that the highest ten each year be chosen without restriction, and that the system at present in operation be applicable only to the lower ten.

To win the Kolapore Cup or even to take second place requires veteran shots of long experience. Young hands as a rale do not make the best team men. xxvi,

Only the oldest and most reliable shots are year after year selected for the home teams.

It would be desirable that greater facilities be extended for practice at 800 and 900 yards in view of competitors getting into the Queen's "sixty." It would, in my opinion, be better to use the time before sailing in practice at these ranges. Our men have proved that they can get into the "sixty" at the shorter ranges, but without long range practice they can never win the Queen's prize.

To prevent discussion on a most unpleasant, topic I recommend that the Treasurer prepare a schedule of the allowances that will be made to competitors, both officers and men, for their journey home from Quebec before the team leaves Canada.

I would also suggest that it be expressly laid down whether the officers attached to the team as Commandant and Adjutant are to be allowed their expenses to Wimbledon and return to Liverpool. I think it is a justifiable expenditure.

MEMO in Re WIMBLEDON TEAM.

It is submitted as worthy of discussion that the present system of division of Prize Money be abolished, and that the prizes go to the winners.

The men who work hard should get what they earn; those who go to Wimbledon for a holiday would see the necessity of making greater efforts in shooting. The Kolapore money should always be divided when won; this would secure the best men for the Team.

I would suggest that the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Assosociation place himself in communication with the authorities who have control of Ranges in the vicinity of London, with a view to obtain the use of a Range for practice immediately on the Team landing in England even if the Dominion Rifle Association have to pay a fixed sum per annum for the accommodation. It is most pleasing to receive offers for the use of Ranges from the different Regiments, but it would be more useful if we were independent of such hospitality. My experience leads me to believe in the superiority of a week's practice in England to a week devoted to that duty in Canada.

The accommodation at Wimbledon is most ample, in fact a part of it is on too large a scale. I would recommend that a smaller marquee be provided for the Commandant. I would have a marquee pitched solely for the use of the Team. In that I would provide sufficient furniture to make it comfortable. It should be used as a mess tent. I cannot but think that the comfort of the Team would be materially added to if an arrangement could be made for messing together.

The Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association might place himself in communication with Bertram & Roberts, and ascertain if such a scheme was practicable, and the cost thereof. The advantages that would ensue from such an arrangement are manifest to any officer who has had command of a Team. An alteration would have to be made in laying out the camp. No additional expense would be incurred, for by using only one marquee for the Commandant a saving of £1 15s. stg. would be effected.

Abbott, Major Blaiklock, Lieut. Ibbotson, Lieut. Col. Macdonald, Captain W. C. Macdonald, Lieut. Tidswell, Captain Barnhill, Major Macpherson, Major Anderson, Captain Perley, Lieut.-Col. Gibson, Lieut. Patterson, Capt. James Adam, Captain P. Jackson, Lieut.-Col. O'Malley, Captain Jos. Edwards, Captain Hartt, Lieut. Sims, Captain Chagnon, Lieut. Jameson, Sergt. Anthony, Captain McDougall, Lieut. H. H. Gray, Staff-Sergt. Wynne, Private Clarke, Major Cates, Lieut.-Col. Macpherson, Private Rose, Sergt. K. Mathews, Piper Clarke, Lieut.-Col. Bacon and many others.

The minutes of the last year's meeting were read and confirmed.

INFORMATION FOR MARKSMEN.

Captain Macdonald, Q. O, R., moved that it be recommended to Council that in future the annual report of the Association should be sent to each competitor desiring a copy, and leaving his address with the Secretary.

Lieut.-Col. White, 43rd Battalion, suggested that the report be sent to commanding officers of battalions.

Captain Perley, H. Q. Staff, was opposed to this, unless the commanding officers became members of the Association. He said there was a lamentable lack of interest in rifle shooting.

Captain Sims, 3rd Victoria Rifles, advocated that copies be sent for distribution among the different rifle associations.

The Chairman pointed out the good that might result from a wider distribution of the reports. He thought that an Association such as this, which distributed \$6,000 annually in prizes, should have a membership of more than 100, which was about the number of full members at present. A thousand would be more like the proper number.

After discussion on a suggestion made by Captain Edwards, 3rd Victoria Rifles, that copies of the annual programmes be given a wider circulation than at present, it was resolved on motion of Lieut. Col. White, 43rd Battalion, that it be recommended to Council, that the old system of having placards printed be adopted, these to be posted up in armouries and other public places.

THE AMMUNITION QUESTION.

Sergt. Mathews, 3rd Victoria Rifles, asked what ammunition it was proposed to use at next meeting. His Association for one would like to know this, as they would take care to procure a supply of the same for practice. They had found the Canadian ammunition to be unsatisfactory this year.

Captain Adam, 13th Batt., said preparations were in progress to have a thorough test of the Canadian ammunition, and he had no doubt it would be better in future.

The Chairman said that the best ammunition they could obtain would be served out at the next meeting.

It was afterwards decided that when the Council determines what ammunition shall be used, the fact will be made known through the press to those interested.

RAILWAY FARES.

Captain Sims brought up the question of the railway fares charged competitors. He thought that by concerted action the rates might be lowered to single fare, instead of fare and a third, as at present.

Considerable dissatisfaction was expressed also with the present practice of requiring certificates preliminary to the issue of the tickets, which requirement causes much delay and annoyance.

ABOLISHING SIGHTING SHOTS.

Lieut. Jameson, 60th Batt., asked for the opinion of the meeting on the matter of abolishing sighting shots, in conformity with the practice at Wimbledon.

Major Anderson, 43rd Batt., spoke in favor of the abolition, if no serious loss to the revenue resulted.

The discussion that ensued went to show that while \$600 revenue

derived from the sale of the tickets would be lost, there would also be a reduction in the expenses of the meetings, as they could be finished in one day less. There would also, it was pointed out, be a considerable increase in extra series if sighting shots were abolished.

The motion that the meeting recommend to the Council to abolish the use of sighting shots in future was carried unanimously, as was also one recommending that "blow off" shots be likewise abolished.

"ANY POSITION" MATCHES."

Piper Clark, 5th Royal Scots, moved, seconded by Captain Sims, 3rd Vics., that this meeting recommend to Council, that matches be established in future competitions, at distances over 600 yards, in which shooting in any position should be allowed. Carried.

EQUIPMENT IN MILITARY MATCHES.

Captain Macdonald, Q. O. R., expressed the opinion that some change should be made in the conditions governing the equipment in the Gzowski military matches, as the men should not be compelled to carry the knapsacks and other burdens now imposed upon them. He said that nowhere in actual service were they supposed to be so equipped. He also asked that more time be allowed for firing than had been given last year.

Captain Perley said the conditions governing the competition for the Gzowski Cup had been framed by Colonel Gzowski himself, and could not be altered without his consent.

Lieut. Col. Gibson thought that if proper representation were made to Col. Gzowski, he would agree to the change proposed.

The Chairman said that Col. Gzowski felt very strongly on the subject of having this strictly a military match, though perhaps he might agree to a change in the conditions.

It was then moved by Captain Macdonald, seconded by Captain Ibbotson, and carried unanimously, that this meeting recommend to Council that the order of dress in the Gzowski match be changed, and that it be fired in future in "drill order."

ADJUSTING SIGHTS.

Captain Sims asked if competitors would be allowed to adjust their sights when advancing or retiring in the skirmishing matches. It was decided that adjusting the sights should be allowed, but not loading.

DECIDING TIES.

Captain Hood, 5th Royal Scots, asked that some provision should be made for deciding ties in the skirmishing matches. He thought the only fair way was to decide by the number of hits.

The matter was left to the Executive Committee.

A STANDING MATCH.

Lieut. Gray, Guards, asked why a "standing match" had not been included in this year's grand aggregate, the competitors' meeting last year having passed a recommendation to this effect. As our men had to compete in standing matches at Wimbledon, it was of great importance that they should receive some training here.

THE MARTINI.

Lieut.-Col. O'Malley moved, seconded by Lieut.-Col. White, that as the Government had some 12,000 Martini rifles in store, an endeavor should be made to have them served out to the Rifle Association.

Major Blaiklock thought that application for these Rifles should more properly come from the different Battalions.

Lieut.-Col. White said their idea was that the representatives of this meeting would carry greater weight.

THE WIMBLEDON TEAM.

Major Anderson, 43rd Batt., asked for the sense of the meeting on the rule restricting competitors winning places on the team from going to Wimbledon oftener than twice in five years. He thought it was highly important that Canada should be represented at Wimbledon by the strongest possible team, and that it was in the interest of Canada and Dominion marksmen that the rule should be abolished.

Captain Perley said a letter had just been received from Lieut.-Col. Ross, the commander of this years's team, urging the abolition of the rule.

The Chairman said the rule had been made with the view of bringing new men to the front. A good suggestion had been made by Major-General Laurie, viz., that the first ten on the team should be allowed to go unconditionally.

Captain Sims, 3rd Vics., moved in amendment, seconded by Pte. Rose, 5th Royal Scots, that it be recommended to Council, that the first ten who accept should be allowed to go unconditionally.

Captain Hartt, St. John Rifles, said that if the rule was wrong at all, it should be abolished entirely. He thought its working had not been satisfactory, and that the team which went to Eagland should not be a nursery team, but the best possible.

The amendment was then put and lost, the vote being 20 yeas to 28 nays.

The main motion, recommending the abolition of the restriction, was then carried by 31 yeas to 11 nays.

KOLAPORE BADGES.

Captain Hartt, St. John Rifles, brought up the matter of wearing Kolapore badges similar to those issued to the successful teams, by men who had not been on such teams.

It was pointed out that the trouble arose through a mistake of the manufacturer of the badges complained of.

There being no further business, the meeting then adjourned.

COUNCIL MEETING HELD UNDER BY-LAW NO. 2.

OTTAWA, November 11th, 1885.

Present—Lieut.-Col. Ouimet, M. P., Chairman of Council, presiding; Lieut.-Col. Ross, Lieut.-Col. Panet, Lieut.-Col. Vance Gravely, Captain Toller, Lieut.-Col. Bacon, Lieut.-Col. Macpherson, Lieut. Col. White, Lieut.-Col. Macdonald, Major Anderson, Captain Gourdeau.

The Chairman having stated the cause of calling the meeting,

It was moved by Lieut.-Col. Vance Gravely, seconded by Captain Toller, "That forty Martini Henry rifles and 200 rounds of ammunition each, be immediately issued to the first forty men who notify their acceptance of a place on the Wimbledon team for 1886, provided they are chosen; the issue to be made upon the order of, and through the commanding officer of the corps to which they respectively belong, the rifles loaned to be returned to the Dominion Rifle Association by those of the forty who do not proceed to Wimbledon, not later than the day of sailing of the team from Quebec, and by the twenty, immediately after the completion of the Wimbledon matches of 1886.—Carried unanimously.

The Secretary was instructed to communicate with Messrs. Bertram & Roberts, to ascertain what arrangements could be made for messing the Wimbledon team in their own camp.

The meeting then adjourned.

REGULATIONS.

The Prize Meeting of the Association will be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision or a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding, but they or a majority of them may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

- 1. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the Conditions of any Match for which they have entered, as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.
- 2. Competitors must refer to the Notice Board morning and afternoon to ascertain whether orders have been issued altering the original detail of the shooting, or affecting them personally.
- 3. Competitors must comply with all orders given by the Executive Officer or the Range Officers on duty.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- I.—No Active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.
- II.—No Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer, or Private employed by the D. R. A. for duty at the firing points or in the butts shall shoot either for a prize or for practice.
- III.—In competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corp shall be worn, viz:—
- a. Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket. Elbow caps of leather or other material will not be allowed.
 - b. Trousers.

c. Regimental head dress, or a cap cover, with or without a capunder it. Cap covers or puggarees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and greatcoats or waterproofs over uniforms.

Officers of a corps must all appear dressed in the same order as must also Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates. Where a duly authorized undress for Officers exists, they (the officers) may appear in it, although the Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates may be in full dress. Waist or cross belts need not be worn.

d. In competitions not restricted to the Active Militia, competitors must appear either in uniform as above, or wholly in plain clothes. (See Reg. XX d.)

Note.—In "Military Match" competitions the above rules shall not apply, as special details for dress will be issued.

IV —All protests or objections should be made to the Executive or Range officers on duty on the spot, and, when practicable in writing. When a protest is in the first place made verbally, it must subsequently be put in writing, and handed to the Secretary not later than one hour after the occurrence on which the protest is founded, and the Executive Committee reserve the right to refuse to accept any protest received or presented after the expiry of that time.

V.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

VI.—Hair triggers will not be allowed.

VII.—Fixed or artificial rests will not be allowed, except in Skirmishing Match.

VIII.—Competitors shall only use the mats and sheets provided by the Association. Cork beds and elbow rests will not be allowed.

IX.—No wiping out between shots will be permitted.

X.—No competitor shall load until he takes his position at the firing point, and the Register Keeper has given the word "All Clear."

XI.—Competitors may "blow off" in the pits at the firing points only before firing, and after presentation of a "blow off" ticket to the Register Keeper.

XII .- Slings may be used in all matches, but when the competi-

tion is restricted to military breech loaders, the slings must be of the Government length and pattern, white, brown or black, and attached to the rifles as in Government arms.

XIII.—In individual competitions—competitors may use a binocular or telescope, not mounted on any kind of stand, provided their doing so causes no delay in the shooting.

XIV.—After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person, except the Register Keeper or an Officer on duty, will be permitted to speak to him.

XV.—In Matches where both team and individual prizes are being offered for competition, coaching of any kind is strictly prohibited.

XVI.—In Matches where the prizes are offered to teams only, the members of such team shooting together will be permitted to "coach" or "spot" for each other, and to use binoculars or telescopes for that purpose, provided their doing so does not delay or impede the shooting. The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a team, although not himself. shooting, will be permitted to assist his team in like manner, and to appoint a spotter to assist him. With the above exceptions, no other person will be allowed within the ropes.

XVII.—Any violation of these rules or any part of them, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the Officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Executive Officer, that the case may be dealt with by the Special Committee as laid down under the head of "penalties," and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

PENALTIES—DISQUALIFICATIONS.

XVIII.—Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d) Who shall offer money or a bribe of any kind, to any employee of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or

- (e) Who being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council, Executive or Special Committee; or
- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Council, Executive or Special Committee may consider discreditable; or
- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council, Executive or Special Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct of the aforesaid offences; or
- (h) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangements with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize,

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council, Executive or Special Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any Affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association, until reinstated.

EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

XIX.—Any Competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up; or
- (b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range except in accordance with the regulations for shooting; or
- (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing; or
- (d) Who from a proper want of care discharges his rifle accidentally. [If such discharge is due to a defect in his rifle, an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given]; or
- (e) Who shall fire a pool shot before delivering his ticket to the Register Keeper; or
 - (f) Who shall alter or make any erasures on his firing ticket; or
- (g) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous;—
 shall upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Speciall
 Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting,
 and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

DISALLOWANCE OF SCORES.

XX.—Any Competitor—

- (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize; or with the orders of the Executive or Range officers; or
- (b) Who shall infringe on any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the meeting while shooting for any particular prize; or
- (c) Who, when competing for the Grand Aggregate, shall fail to fill up the aggregate score ticket, or shall enter his scores incorrectly, or shall fail to deliver the same to the Statistical Officer within one hour after the conclusion of his firing in the last match; or
- (d) Who shall shoot dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes. (See Reg. III d);—

shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, have his scores for that particular prize disallowed, and if such disallowance refers to the Grand Aggregate, he shall also forfeit all claim to shoot in the Governor-General's Match.

XXI.—FINES.

Any Competitor -

Who in "blowing off" shall fail to go close up to and point his rifle into the pit provided for that purpose; or who shall "blow off" when the danger signal is up; or who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target, shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the Range Officer.

In cases where a competitor is "excluded from further competition," or where his "score is disallowed," for any particular prize, the circumstances only under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the NAME of the individual implicated.

In cases of "disqualification" the NAME of the offender as well as the particulars of the case shall be posted on the notice board.

XXII.-MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

The Special Committee shall have power to mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

XXIII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than one prize in any competition.

XXIV.—Winners of prizes will on signing the official prize lists, receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the Association.

XXV.—If a formal presentation takes place, winners, being Active Militiamen, must parade in the full dress uniform of their corps.

XXVI.—DISTANCE AND TARGETS.

The ordinary Targets, divided into three classes, shall be of the following dimensions:

XXVII.—SIGNALLING.

1. The signalling will be as follows:-

a. Bull's Eye	White disc.
b. Inner	Red disc.
c. Magpie	Black and White disc.

d. Outer..... Black disc. e. Ricochet.... Black bar.

- f. Misses will not be signalled; but if a target is lowered under the impression that it has been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the marker will wave a black disc, to signify that the target has not been struck.
- 2. When two shots strike a target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be signalled with the signal disc, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with that shot, provided he has fired. Both hits will, however, be shown by spotting discs.
- 3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, will be shown by the spotting disc when the target is again raised.
- 4. The signalling shall not be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the Officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may not have struck the target, he may call on the Officer in charge at the butt to examine the

target, and the result of such examination shall be final. Any competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of fifty cents with the Officer in charge at the firing point, which shall be forfeited in case no lit is found on the target.

- 5. If on a target being raised the spotting disc appears manifestly to disagree with the signal disc, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstance to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the Officer in charge at the butt, but no deposit will be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.
- 6. All claims for shots signalled must be made before another shot is fired at the target in question.
- 7. If at the moment at which a competitor fires, his target should be lowered in such a manner as to falsify the result of his shot, the Range Officer is empowered to cancel the result of such shot, and to permit the competitor to fire another shot in its place.
- 8. All alterations of the registers must be initialled by the Officer making them, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first singalled to the butt.
- 9. No person will be permitted to go to examine a target during the meeting except the Executive Officer or such person or persons as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

In Skirmishing.

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of such shots, unless it be proved that such hits on the targets in excess of the number of shots allowed could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

XXVIII.—RIFLES.

The rifles shall be classed as follows:-

CLASS I.

MILITARY BREECH LOADERS.

Snider (Long and Short) rifles and Martini-Henry rifles, either of

Government issue or of bona fide Government pattern, and hearing the Government viewer's mark.

- Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9lbs. 12oz.
 Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9lbs.
- 2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate will be allowed.
- 3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6lbs.
- Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Filed sights will not be allowed.
- (a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but black and white must not be mixed so as to produce a grey.

No application of a permanent nature will be allowed.

No shading of sights will be permitted.

- (b) The backsight may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at any angle by any extemporized means.
- (c) The sliding bar may be inverted, and used on either side of the uprights. One permanent centre line for the Snider, and three for the Martini-Henry will be allowed, and temporary marks or line of any kind removable at pleasure may be used.

CLASS II.

ANY RIFLES.

- 1. Weight-Maximum, 10 lbs.
- 2. Pull of trigger, Minimum, 3 lbs.
- 3. A pad or shoe for the heel plate may be used.
- Any description of sights, except telescopic and magnifying, may be used.

XXIX.—AMMUNITION.

- 1 .- In Competitions Restricted to "Military Breech-loaders.
- (a) None but the ammunition issued by the D. R. A. on the ground shall be used or allowed. Price for Snider, 17 cts. perpackage of 10 rounds, or 3 packages for 50 cts. Price for Martini, 25 cts. per package of 10 rounds.

2. In Competitions open to "Any Rifles."

Any ammunition may be used. Competitors will be required to bring their own supply.

No restrictions will be made as to the arrangement or composition of the charges or cartridges, provided that in the case of Brechloading Rifles being used:—

- (a) That no part of the charge is inserted at the muzzle.
- (b) That the rifle is not loaded until the word "all clear" is given.
- (c) That no time is lost, and
- (d) That no dangerous practice is resorted to.

XXX.—POSITION.

Unless otherwise specified the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be in any position, with the head to the target.

In the Standing position the whole of the left hand must be in front of the trigger guard.

XXXI.—SIGHTING.

Unless otherwise specified two sighting shots will be allowed at each range on payment.

If a competitor be stopped in his firing by the "Cease Fire" at mid-day or evening, he shall be allowed one sighting shot, without payment, when he renews firing.

XXXII.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

- 1. Competitors must be present at the firing points punctually at the time detailed on their tickets, otherwise they will not be allowed to shoot; the time to be regulated by the clock in the Secretary's office.
- 2. In all ordinary competitions competitors shall, when possible, be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot alternately.
- 8. Where but one competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay; but the Officer in charge of the firing point, or some person named by him, must witness the shooting, and countersign

the register. Failing such verification the score will be invalidated. Any person present whom the competitor may name will watch the score recorded, and if need be raise objection before the next shot is fired.

- 4. In competitions restricted to "Any Rifles," the competitors shall be formed in a squad, and fire shot for shot in the order in which their names are called.
- 5. No one shall be allowed to join the squad after the commencement of the second competitive round.
- 6. When once a competitor has joined a squad, he shall not leave it before he has either retired from the competition or has completed his firing, but leave may be given by the Officer in charge to any competitor who, when firing with a muzzle loader, may find it necessary through a mistake in loading to fall out for the purpose of "blowing-off."
- 7. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition with the same rifle; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range during a competition, unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Officer in charge.
- 8. The competitor must, after delivering each shot, pay attention to the score called out by the Register keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the Register, so that any objection to the score recorded may be investigated before the next shot is fired.
- 9. In the case of unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor, or of such delay as the Range Officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass purporting to run one minute, more or less, and if after such caution the competitor does not fire before the sand glass has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the shot forfeited and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.

XXXIII.—TIES.

Ties shall be decided as follows:-

- A. In Individual Competitions for a Series of Prizes.
- 1. If at more than one distance by the range totals in inverse order, commencing at the longest range.
 - 2. By the fewest outers.

- 3. By the fewest magpies.
- 4. By the fewest inners.
- 5. By the value of each shot in inverse order.
- 6. In the case of absolute ties.
- (a) If for Money Prizes, by division.
- (b) If for PRIZES IN KIND, by shooting off as in Clause B.
- 7. In the case of a prize Part in Kind and Part in Money, by shooting off for the Prize in Kind, and dividing the Money.
- N. B.—In all competitions the *order* of the winners shall be decided by the foregoing rules, if possible, but in the case of absolute ties the names shall be arranged alphabetically and bracketted.
- B. In Individual Competitions for a Single Prize.
 - 1. By the aggregate score in five rounds at the longest distance.
 - 2. By firing single shots until decided.

Absentees shall forfeit their claim to shoot.

C. In Team Competitions.

- 1. If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.
 - 2. By the fewest outers.
 - 3. By the fewest magpies.
 - 4. By the fewest inners.
 - 5. By the highest scores in each team shooting off, as in Clause B.

D. Grand Aggregate.

Equal numerical scores for the first 5 places, and for the last place or places, shall be decided by the result of firing 5 shots at 600 yards, after that if the score be still equal, by single shots until decided.

For other places :-

- 1. By the total score in each match in inverse order.
- 2. By the total scores at 600 yards.
- 3. By the total scores at 500 yards.
- 4. By the total scores at 400 yards.
- 5. By the total scores at 200 yards.
- 6. By shooting off as in Clause B.

In the Governor General's Match, scores of equal numerical value shall be treated and placed by the before stated Rule B.

E. In cases not met by the foregoing:

- 1. By any special rules attached to the conditions.
- 2. By the fiat of the Committee.

XXXIV.—ENTRIES.

The Executive and Special Committees reserve to themselves the power of refusing any Entry for any match, or of cancelling at any moment any entry that may have been previously accepted.

The privilege of Entry is restricted to members, who have paid their subscription (\$2.00), and to associate members, who pay the fee of \$1.00 at the time of entry.

- 1. Entries for the several competitions shall close on days to be named by the Committee.
- 2. Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftner than once for any prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of the competition.
- 3. No entry shall be accepted after the hour fixed for the commencement of the competition to which admission is sought.
 - 4. Entries shall be classified :-
- (a) Ordinary (at the published rates of entrance fees). To include those made and received by the Secretary of the D. R. A. on or before 4 p. m., Wednesday, 26th August.

- (b) Post (at an increase charge of 20 per cent. on the published rate of entrance fees). To include those made or received after 4 p.m., Wednesday, 26th August.
- N. B.—The acceptance of Post Entries will be entirely governed by circumstances. As a rule the privilege will be withdrawn as soon as the target accommodation allotted for each competition is absorbed, and whenever the Special Committee may determine.
- 5. To meet the case where difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required entries by the 26th August, Officers commanding corps and Secretaries of Provincial or Local Associations will be permitted to send in their application for (state No.) competitors, accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees; and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries, until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In such cases the Register Tickets will not be issued before the nominal return is handed to the Secretary. Any payment made for entries in excess of the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for in the following regulations:—

XXXV.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

- 1. Entrance Fees in full will be returned to those—
- (a) Who are prevented from being present at the meeting; or
- (b) Who attend the meeting but are incapacitated from illness or accident; or
- (c) Whose entries the Executive or Special Committee may have cancelled.
- 2. Claims based on other considerations than the above will if allowed, be subject to a penalty of half forfeit.

XXXVI.—SQUADDING.

- 1. In the case of competitors classified as Ordinary Entries, arrangements will be made and detail published of the day, hour, and target at which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.
 - 2. In the case of Post Entries, the hour of shooting cannot be pre-

determined or announced, and competitors so classified must await the orders that the progress of the meeting may render practicable.

XXXVII.—ALTERATION OF SQUADDING.

- 1. Any alterations which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration, unless verified by the initials of the Executive Officer, will cancel the ticket.
- 2. The place of publication for all notices affecting the detail of shooting shall be the board fixed without the tent of the Executive Officer, and the posting of a notice on such board must be taken and accepted as a good service on all affected thereby.

XXXVIII.—REGISTER TICKETS.

- 1. Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong ticket, and so by his own neglect miss the opportunity of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association in regard to such competition, and no duplicat ticket shall be issued to him except under special circumstances.
- 2. Any erasure or substitution of one name for another unless made by the Executive Officer, shall invalidate the ticket.

XXXIX.—SIGHTING AND FOULING TICKETS.

Tickets for sighting shots, 10 cents, and for fouling shots, 2 cents, can be obtained at the Secretary's office. They must be delivered to the Register Keeper before a shot is fired. Such tickets will hold good in any match during the meeting.

The Council reserves the right to alter, amend or rescind any of the foregoing regulations as circumstances may require.

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

- 1.—That this Association be denominated 'THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."
- 2.—Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year; and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3.—Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a Prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4.—Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its bona fide members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting at the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided al-

ways that the name of the winner and details of the match at which it is won shall be communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such Prize Meeting.

5.—There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

- 6.—There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.
- 7.—There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.
- 8.—There shall be a Council composed of Fifty members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:—

Fourteen, [14] from Ontario, Ten, [10] Quebec, Six, $\lceil 6 \rceil$ New Brunswick, Six, 6 66 Nova Scotia. Four. Manitoba, Four. 66 4 British Columbia, Four. " P. Edward Island, Two, 66

wo, [2] "N. West Territories so soon as an Association is formed in said Territory and is affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association.

one half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Association of the respective Provinces at their annual meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Associations to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form the quorum.

- 9.—The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the chairman of the Council.
- 10.—The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be ex-officio members of the Executive Committee.
 - 11.—The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in con-

nection with this Association, and the Deputy Adjutants General commanding districts, being members of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be ex-officio Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

- 12.—There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.
- 13.—The Council shall have the management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
- 14.—The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.
- 15.—The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.
- 16.—The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding, but they or a majority of them may at their descretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.
- 17.—An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

- 18.—The Annual Business Meeting of the members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa on the third Wednesday after the Assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or an adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.
- 19.—A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any member or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.
- 20.—No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments.
- 21.—The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

Meetings of

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required, by the Chairman, or by any four of the members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council, at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary Meetings.

The Council to the Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all proceedings, all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to inspection of any member of the Council.

Finance Committee, There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting.

Treasurer to deposit sums redeposit sums redeposit sums redeposit sums redeposit sums redefined bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.

Expenditure of sums for current expenses which sums for ourrent expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorised by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditures of Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made a general nature. Only upon the authority of the Council of the Association. Annual A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, Accounts. made up to and closed on the 80th November. Amended 1881 and 1882.

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
