PERISHED IN THE FLAMES

TERRIFIC EXPLOSION IN A CLEVE LAND FLOURING MILL.

Two Employes Known to Have Lost Their Lives—Four Others Severely Burned and Injured—Seven Men Missing—Three Believed to Be Dead in the Ruins.

CLEVELAND, O., Sept. 16 .- A fatal explo CLEVELAND, O., Sept. 16.—A fatal explosion occurred at the mill of the National Milling Company, on Merwin-street, early Saturday morning. The mill took fire and was destroyed, entailing a loss of \$125,000, on which there was an insurance of \$75,000. There were eighteen men in the mill at the time of the explosion. One, Peter Geirman, perished in the flames. Four others, Jou Vanniel, Wm. Straw, Sterling Barber and John Blake, were seriously burned and injured. Six men escaped without injury. Seven others are unaccounted for, and it is thought at least three of them are dead in the ruins.

PORTLAND, Ore, Sept. 17.—A disastrous fire occurred at Spokane Falls, Wash. T., Saturday night. The fiames were first discovered in a small chop house and despite the most strenuous efforts of the fire department, the fire spread with great rapidity. Over a block was destroyed. The loss is about \$100,000, with an insurance of \$25,000. No one was injured.

It is proposed to commence a canal upon the western shore of Italy, just above Civita will open at 2 p.m. on Mond Queen st. west. For further glance at the map of Italy will show that in this line two lakes are met, those of Bolsens and Trasmeno, and it is proposed to drain, these two lakes, thus securing the area for cultivation. The length of the canal will be about 169 miles, the width of 1110 yards, and its depth is to be about 13 yards, so that ships, of any tonnage, and even men-of-war, will be able to pase through it. The cost of the canal is recokened as 500,000,000 francs, that is, £20,000,000. It is estimated that the work could be completed in five years from its commencement. 
