WIMAN'S CEREBRAL GURSE. Ministers who have accepted his invitation to see "Nero."

New York, Sept. 16.—Ever since "Nero" was first performed on Staten Island Erasmus Wiman has been trying to get the ministers to come and see it.

"Why should clergymen condemn the ballet?" asked Mr. Kivalley a few nights ago, after viewing recently the perfect evolutions of 400 bare-armed and short-skirted nymphs, who pruned, waltzed, and kicked in the music of one of the greatest classic ballads.

The closing scenes in the life of Nero have always had a special interest for the Christian world. The final triumph of the creature in himself, rising, as it does, amid the strains of the "Nero," above the heads of the great city whose terrible destruction he so vividly depicts, is a scene which the favor to accept an invitation to visit this grand and interesting production on the Staten Island ferry will be included.

Of the 313 who accepted invitations 101 are from Brooklyn, 123 from New York, and a balance of 89 from near-by towns. There are none from Jersey City, Brooklyn ministers asked for 623 tickets, or an average of 2.3 tickets per minister. New York asked for 847 tickets, or an average of 2.8 tickets. Queens asked for 322, or an average of 2.4 tickets. A Brooklyn minister, the Rev. H. F. Bernhart of Tompkins street, asked to have the largest family, for he wanted 34 tickets. New York, however, is not far behind in the request for 50 tickets from the Rev. Charles Scadding of the Church of the Reformation.

The question of money on the part of the ministers may be helped in solution by a few quotations from letters. The following is from the Rev. George H. Mayer of the Second street, Brooklyn, with a request for ten tickets.

"My family is large, as you see by the number of tickets requested. If you could tickets will all go, and I will have only one left. I have read the Rev. G. W. Le Roy's notice of the 'Nero,' and believe it is one of the best Christian dramas that have ever been written.
