TWELFTH YEAR.

MANY LIVES SNUFFED OUT.

A Gale Sweeps Over the South of England and the Angry Waters Engulfed a Great Number of Vessels With Their Crews - Wind Whirls Havoce in the Straits.

LONDON, Nov. 11.—Another gale swept over the south of England last night. A French schooner was wrecked near Hythe and the captain and his wife and son were drowned. The iron ship Beaumont, from London for Sydney, was washed ashore near Sandgate and wrecked.

The Norwegian brig Solertia has been wrecked at Studdart in Dorset. The bodies of several victims of the storm have been cast upon the beach at Sandgate. The lives saved last evening managed to reach the ship and rescue 27 of the crew.

Further details of the storm show that there is no doubt that the loss of life arising from marine and other disasters will be fully equal, if not exceed, that which occurred during the last great gale that visited the British Isles. The despatches now being received give the following list of casualties at various points along the coast:

The schooner Marguerite Marie, bound for London, was caught in the hurricane of damage and was blown ashore and wrecked. Losses to property at Folkestone and Deal is very great.

At Christ Church, a town 20 miles south-west of Southampton on the English Channel, the rivers are swollen by the excessive rain and have overflowed their banks. The rising waters flooded the country in the vicinity of Christ Church and part of the town itself is inundated. The damage to fishing boats and other small craft employed in the local coast-wise trade is heavy.

The Local Board of Health met at City Hall yesterday afternoon. The members not having ready access to the reports in time to properly consider them the meeting was adjourned till Monday next.

The Medical Health Officer and Ald. Graham will jointly report upon what they saw and heard during their recent tour through some of the American cities.

The regular report of the Health Officer contains an analysis of samples of water taken from different parts of the bay. Regarding it the doctor says:

"It is of the opinion that ice may with safety be obtained from the bay provided care be taken in selecting locations for the cutting of ice after it has formed, stipulating that the ice should be cut from the bay, and not from the mouth of a river flowing out and becoming re-frozen in the bay."

"If a place for ice can be obtained from any of the above named places, malaria, including, let that be our ice source."
