lows : 1st of being illegally assessed for personal property to the amount of £2500, he being assessed in the corporation of Berlin. 2nd of being overcharged on his real property at Aberdeen, and 3rd of being charged on the assessment Roll for Ward No. 4, for a farm formerly belonging to John W. Eby of which he had neither title nor possession.

Moved by Henry Snider, seconded by Isaac Clemens, that Mr. Davidson's personal property on the Roll be struck off—carried.

Moved by Henry Snider, seconded by Samuel Shantz, that £500 be deducted from Mr. Davidson's real property at Aberdeen—carried.

Mr. Davidson also complained of the German Mills property (belonging to the late J. B. Ewart) being underrated on the Assessment, compared with other property.

Moved by Henry Snider, seconded by Isaac Clemens, that the property known as the German Mills, be raised £1000 on the Assessment Roll, which will then make the real property £4300—carried.
