Digging Potators.—The sun should not be allowed to shine on potatoes, and they should be put into the cellar with as little exposure to day air as possible after being taken from the ground. We have observed that where potatoes were turned in to the cellar, and there was much earth among them which in some cases is a little axist, the potatoes, birs, casks or boxes. In a cellar where there is no water they keep best on the ground in a close birs, and if the cellar has much light in it, or is exposed to the circulation of air, it would be best to cover the potatoes with sods, or hemlock, sprace, pine or other evergenen bunghs.
