A large number of women were severely injured, but so far as known no deaths have occurred. Five hundred troops are guarding the territory. When the wind died down on the clear night the entire northern sikes of Tokio were ablaze from the glowing embers. It is in-possible to present an estimate *c* the total loss at this time.
