Should you be attacked with diarrhoea or looseness of the bowels, with or without pain, and that medical advice is not at hand, go at once to bed, wrap yourself up in warm blankets, roll a swathe of warm flannel, sprinkled with hot spirits of turpentine, or whisky, closely round the body...
