The Mails.—By the New Brunswick mail we have the particulars of late news from India, which will be seen in our columns. The screw steamer Jura arrived at St. John on the 27th ult., in ten days from Cork, bringing five days later news from England, including the Indian intelligence. The Jura came for the purpose of taking the 76th regiment to Ireland, where, it is understood they will be recruited, and then sent to the East.

We are sorry to hear that among the killed at the massacre of Europeans at Cawnpore was the Rev. Mr. Hunter, who had been successfully laboring in the East Indies. The Rev. gentleman has a brother residing on this Island, and his father arrived a few days ago.


