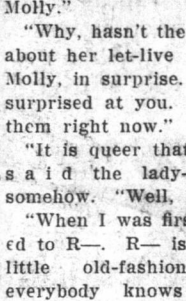

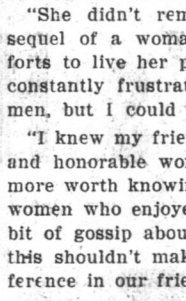

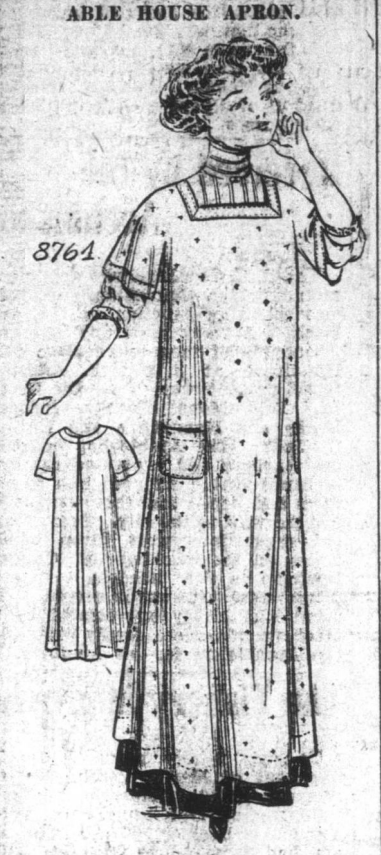

Finding of Court in Loss of Bruce. Yesterday afternoon Acting Judge Knight handed down the following finding in the Marine Court of Enquiry held to determine the cause of the loss of the S. S. Bruce.

The S. S. Bruce, a screw steel ship of 1,148 Registered Gross Tonnage, and 348 tons net, was built in Pointhaven, Scotland, in 1897. The ship was employed in carrying mails and passengers between Port aux Basques, in Newfoundland, and North Sydney and Louisburg, in Cape Breton.

She was well fitted and equipped; her compasses were in good order; the engine room and accommodations properly applied to the course steered. She was under the command of Richard Drake, Master, who is the holder of a Colonial Certificate of Service, but not of a Certificate of Competency.

Sealing Regulations.

Special Evening Telegram. WASHINGTON, July 8. By the terms of the seal treaty just signed, Pelegic sealing is prohibited in the seas of Behring, Okhotsk, Kamichaka, Japan. The convention arranges for the apportionment amongst the signatory powers of the annual proceeds of the general fisheries in which they are interested as follows:—30 per cent. of the skins usually taken from American and Russian herds, respectively, is to be divided equally between Great Britain and Japan; 30 per cent. from Japanese herds to be divided equally between the United States, Britain and Russia; 30 per cent. from any herds which may hereafter resort to breeding grounds under British jurisdiction in the North Pacific Ocean to be divided equally between U. S., Russia and Japan. In connection with this agreement the United States will make an advance payment of \$200,000 Japanese shares taken from the herds in payment of the seal treaty. It is the intention of the government to make a loan and was necessary only because States reserves the right to continue altogether the killing of Island Seals. The Convention prohibits the hunting of sea otters in high seas. The Treaty will extend for 10 years and thereafter will be terminated by one year's notice by any of the powers concerned. It will now be submitted to the governments whose representatives have signed. Treaties for ratification. Aside from ratification by the senate, it will be necessary for congress to pass legislation to carry its provisions into effect.

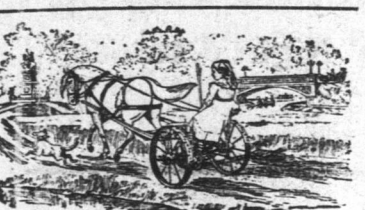

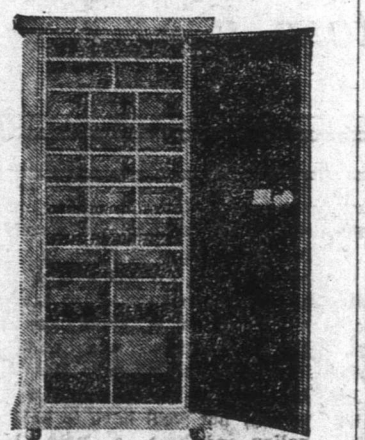

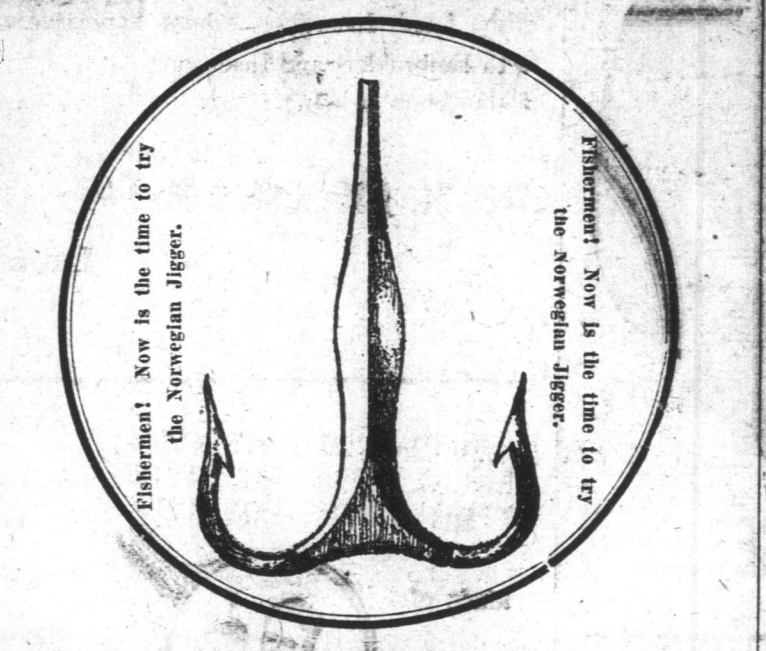

SOLIGNUM.

A Remarkable Test! Locally made by Messrs. W. & G. RENDELL.

To test Solignum as a preservative for Wood against the attacks of Worms, we tried a piece of 2 x 4 Spruce, about two feet in length, by painting one-third with Solignum, leaving the balance clear wood, this was suspended by a wire through the centre, in the water about one foot from the bottom, immediately over a pile of stones, the remains of a sunken wharf (which is the place where our Wharf Shores are eaten off first) for Three Months. On taking it up at the end of that time we found some half-dozen small holes only a very short distance in the clear part of the wood, which shows the liquid had penetrated through the whole piece and the worms had hardly begun boring before coming in contact with it.

Last year as a test of some brands of Copper Paint we had a similar piece of wood treated at both ends, leaving the centre third clear; this was in exactly the same place as the piece for the Solignum test for Three Months and Three Days, when taken up the painted ends were perfect but the centre was riddled with worm holes.
