

CALGARY SEED FAIR FEB. 1.

The first annual seed fair will be held in Calgary on Feb. 1 under the auspices of the Calgary fair for the exhibition, sale and exchanging of farm seeds.

Prizes will be awarded for the following: Winter wheat, any hard variety; winter wheat, any soft variety; spring wheat, any good milling variety; oats, white, any good variety; barley, six rowed; peas; beans; flax seed; timothy seed; broom grass seed; rye grass seed; red clover seed.

Prizes will be donated by the Alberta Pacific Elevator Co., Brackman-Miller Milling Co., Calgary Brewing and Malting Co. and Calgary Milling Co.

The judging will start at 10 and 2 o'clock. A meeting will be held at which speakers supplied by the seed branch of the Dominion department of agriculture will be delivered. The subjects will be good seeds, sinit and weeds.

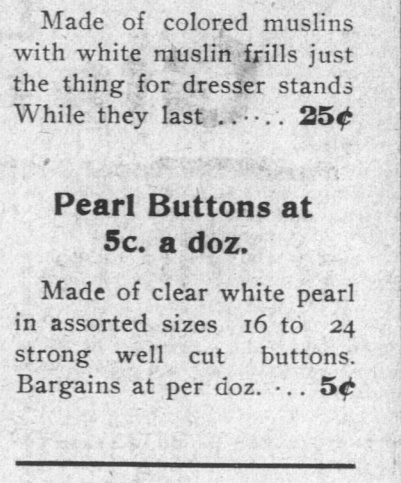
