EXCITEMENT OVER SATURDAY'S RAGE.

Was the Anchor Let Go on the Valkyrie Through Mistake?

Will an Investigation Be Demanded By the Home Club?

There is No Reason Why the Vigilant Should Have Done Such an Easy Victory.

The Valkyrie With Mainmast, Fore Mast, Jib, Jib Toppmast and Spinnaker Set Loose 28 Miles in 28 Minutes—A Startling Announcement is Made on Board the Valkyrie—The Report is Denied—Word One of the Sailors Has to Hear.

LONDON, Eng., Oct. 11.—Commenting on Saturday's race The London Figaro says: "At 12.10 the Valkyrie had apparently left the anchor, but the well in hand when without any apparent cause she fell off, seemed to be laboring heavily and lost ground rapidly, so that at 12.25 everything was changed and the Vigilant had overtaken and passed her speedy rival. Suddenly she increased her lead and at 12.50, only 25 minutes later, was leading by 2 1/2 miles. Now, what happened? Why, at 12.55 the Valkyrie with the same wind and the same sea, was leading by 17 miles northwest and under the same canvas, mainsail, foremast, jib, jibtopmast and spinnaker begins to fall, closes on the cup-defender and crosses the line only 8 minutes behind. This is strange, and there are strange rumors.

Adapt to account for it, from the fact that in a light and variable wind the Valkyrie actually had the best of it, while in a heavy sea and high wind she was hopelessly left behind. Many argue that her jib on jibtopmast were too large for a heavy blow and instead of sending her onward fully buried her bows in the sea, while others hint that the Valkyrie cannot possibly be the same trim as when she sailed early in the season. But the following is probably the strangest theory advanced yet. There seems to be something in it and we give the Valkyrie, when everything seemed to be in shipshape, picked up a Canadian newspaper, and immediately became interested in some starting event he noticed that he called his companions around him. In the excitement he forgot to take his hat, but he hurriedly secured, slipped unnoticed into the water, and it was only when the Vigilant was 2 1/2 miles ahead that the terrible mistake was discovered. The report is denied, although one of the sailors admits that he saw in a paper where gunners brothers were selling their English corduroy and boots for 1.25, and English ladies' walking shoes, worth two and a quarter, for 1.00. Certainly if the corduroy and boots were on board the Valkyrie, but he denies that the anchor was dragging for 28 minutes. He probably there will be a full investigation.

Among my small friends there is a striking evidence of what can be done in a hurry. A boy of three, who was allowed on some special occasion to sit up beyond his bedtime hour of 8 o'clock, fell asleep. He was not to be wakened, but the fascination of the hour, so strong in the habit and so perfect in his control, that he was able to get up and cheerfully bid every one good night, and when he is comfortably tucked in bed, says: "Please do not tuck and out the door at 8 o'clock."

Some allowance must, of course, be made for temperaments, but judicious training and treatment can bring up an abnormally constituted child without fear of darkness. The trouble with grown people is that they are not given credit for half the sense which they possess, and so tell us any silly story to get the passing moments easier for themselves.

THE TRAINING BABIES TO OBEY. The old-fashioned virtue of obedience is not inculcated to anything like the degree that it should be for the health and happiness of the child. This is one of the first lessons, too, although parents rarely realize it. A baby who will not sit up at 8 months will not do so at 9 months or at any subsequent period. One of the commonest experiences of every mother is that her baby will not sit up until she has left the room. This is a natural instinct, and a loving one, I think, but one that is not to be trained. Another mother who has a baby who will not sit up until she has left the room, and who is going for all this in terms suited to his baby comprehension. A few sessions of this kind and the baby will sit up as a matter of course.

AS TO ANSWERING QUESTIONS. In the matter of answering questions we grown up often do children serious wrong. Of course, no philosopher lives wise enough to answer the countless "whys" of these peripatetic interrogators. But simply saying honestly that you do not know, or in some instances assuring him that he is too young to understand, and putting the finger little mind off with a careless or frivolous answer, are two very different things.

It is subjects that you are, but ought not to be, ignorant of one of the plainest duties of fathers and mothers is to see to it that they possess themselves of necessary information, but when the small philosopher comes to you with big questions, it is not his duty to know, but that some day you will be able to read and find out when he is older. Then help the little mind to unbind by giving him some simple book to do, or by telling him a fairy story, for it is not well for young minds to reach out to far. It once overreached a boy of 7 and his mother who she thought had had the greater and better influence on his generation, Napoleon or Caesar? It is needless to say that this boy died young. Not a parent of this age should let his child reach out to far. It is his duty to make him a healthy, obedient, loving little animal, first, train his intellect.
