**MODE OF APPLICATION
FOR LAND, IN UPPER CANADA.**

ALL persons applying for free Grants of Land, either as U. E. Loyalists, Naval or Military Claimants, must address His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, by Petition, through His Secretary.

Persons desirous of Grants of Land, by Purchase, are to apply to the Honble. Peter Robinson, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

The Petitioner must take the Oath of Allegiance before one of the Commissioners appointed for that purpose, and a Certificate of his having done so will be required to accompany his Petition.

The Petition, as soon as it shall have received His Excellency's order thereon, is referred to the Surveyor General, for a report, which is transmitted to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and the Executive Council, for consideration and decision. His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor in Council, having decided upon the Petition, if the same be allowed, an Order is made thereon and forwarded to the Surveyor General, when the Petitioner may be forthwith located, subject to certain conditions annexed to his Location Ticket.

For form of Petition and mode of application for U. E. Loyalists, see Appendix, No. 1.

For Naval or Military Claimants—see Instructions and form of Petition. Appendix, No. 2.

For Form—see Appendix, No. 3.

Names of Commissioners—see Appendix No. 4.

For Form of Soldiers or Seaman's Location Ticket—see Appendix, No. 5.

The Locatee having complied with the conditions, is required to bring or send the necessary proofs thereof, accompanied by his Location Ticket, to the Surveyor General's Office, that the same may be duly certified.

See Appendix, No. 6.

If the Grant be subject to any charges under former Regulations, they are to be paid, a portion to His Majesty's Receiver General, and a portion to the Special Receiver.

Having paid such charges as the Regulations require, the Locatee must deposit the Location Ticket and Receipt with the Attorney General, who will issue his Fiat thereon, and a description of the Land being transmitted from the Surveyor General's Department to the Office of the Secretary of the Province, the Patent will be then perfected and registered, and be ready for delivery to the Grantee. No charges, apply to U. E. Loyalists, Naval and Military or Militia Claimants.



Under the Heir, Devisee and Assignee Acts.

In cases where Locatees die before the necessary evidence has been filed to enable their Patent to be made out, their Heirs and Assigns must prove their claim before the Commissioners under the Heir, Devisee and Assignee Acts, who hold their sittings at York during fifteen

days, commencing from the first Monday in July in each year.

The Claimants may appear before the Commissioners either in person or by their Attorney.

Clergy Reserves.

Petitions for Leases for Clergy Reserves are to be addressed to the Corporation for superintending and managing the Clergy Reserves in Upper Canada, through their Secretary, which, if recommended, are by him transmitted to the several Departments, as in the case of other Petitions.

Claimants as U. C. Militia.

Officers and Privates of Provincial Militia having claims for Land, are required to produce the necessary proofs to the Adjutant General of Militia, who being satisfied therewith, will issue a Certificate to the Surveyor General, who will locate them accordingly.

Persons purchasing Land of the Honble. the Crown Commissioner, having completed their payments, the Commissioner certifies the same, when a Fiat is issued, a description of the Land made out, and the Patent perfected for delivery to the purchaser, free of all charges.

INSTRUCTIONS

For Officers in the Army or Navy, with form of Petition.

THE following instructions have been drawn up for
 the information and guidance of Officers who, having
 served in His Majesty's regular Army or Navy, may wish
 to avail themselves of the Regulations issued in their
 favour, for obtaining Land in Canada, and which came
 into operation in August 1831:

First.—No Free Grant of Land is now made to Offi-
 cers, but a certain sum is remitted from the price of that

which they may purchase, proportioned to the Rank and length of Service of the Officer.

Second.—Officers purchasing Land are entitled, in proportion to their Rank and Service, to a remission of the purchase money, according to the following graduated Scale, on producing testimonials of unexceptionable character from the Horse Guards or Admiralty, and a verified statement of their services :

Field Officers of 25 years service and upwards, . . .	£300
“ “ 20 years,	250
“ “ 15 or less years service,	200
Captains, 20 years service or upwards,	200
“ 15 years service or less,	150
Subalterns, 20 years service or upwards,	150
“ 7 years service or less,	100

Officers of the Royal Navy and Marines are entitled to a similar remission of their purchase money, according to their comparative rank.

Third.—Officers wishing to avail themselves of the foregoing Regulations, and being resident in the Province, should address a Petition to the Lieutenant Governor in Council, in the following form :

To His Excellency SIR JOHN COLBORNE, K. C. B. Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Upper Canada, Major General Commanding His Majesty's Forces therein, &c. &c. &c.

That your Petitioner is a native of——, that he served——years in His Majesty's Army (or Navy), as appears by the annexed verified statement of his services, and has not received any Land or Order for Land from the Crown in any Colony belonging to His Majesty, and wishing to become a resident Settler in Upper Canada, humbly prays your Excellency to be pleased to authorise the remission of such portion of the purchase money

of Land as, under existing regulations, your Petitioner is entitled.

This Petition must be accompanied by an Affidavit, that the Petitioner has taken the Oath of Allegiance, as prescribed by Law.

The Petition to be sent under cover to the "Civil Secretary, Government House, York."

Fourth.—When the Executive Council has decided on the case, the result will be communicated to the Petitioner by the Clerk of the Council; and the Commissioner of Crown Lands will authorise one of his Agents to locate the officer on such vacant Lots of Crown Land as he may fix upon, but it is to be clearly understood, that no patent or deed will be issued to individuals who may receive Location Tickets, until it shall be ascertained by the Surveyor General, or the Commissioner of Crown Lands, that a resident settler is established on some part of the purchase.

Fifth.—When it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Lieutenant Governor, that the officer has become a bona fide settler in the Province, a Certificate will be granted to enable him to receive *the remaining portion of the price of his Commission.*

Sixth.—In order that Officers should not be subject to the delay and inconvenience of waiting for the periodical public sales of Land, the Commissioner of Crown Lands is authorised to accept the upset price per acre, as soon as they shall have selected the Lots they wish to purchase.
