MURDERED

Terrible Affair Comes to Light in North Dumfries.

MRS. ANTHONY ORR BEATEN TO DEATH

And Her Body Hurriedly Buried in a Corn Field, Where It Was Found

By a Searching Party Yesterday Morning--The Victim Mysteriously Disappeared From Her Home on Monday Last--It Was a Foul Murder and the Deed Had Been Premeditated, as a Freshly Made Grave Was Found in a Swamp, Where It is Thought She Was to Have Been Buried--Two Persons Are Under Arrest.

Galt, Ont., Aug. 15.--The mystery of the disappearance of Mrs. Anthony Orr of North Dumfries, about three miles from Galt, was cleared up about 11 o'clock this morning by the finding of her body, badly decomposed, in a shallow grave in a corn patch, within 23 yards of the house.

The official account, furnished by the seconds, recites fully the circumstances leading up to the encounter. This morning the Count of Turin, considering the letters of Prince Henri of Orleans to the Emperor, offensive to the Italian army, wrote him on July 6 demanding a retraction.
