THE VERDICT IN ONTARIO. The verdict of the people has been pretty well digested by the electorate. The people have had the whole case presented to them and the mind of the country is practically made up. The Government has been on trial and the jury is ready to bring in its verdict. In Ontario the verdict is leaning strongly on the side of Sir Wilfrid Laurier and his colleagues have been already stated for condemnation for their shortcomings and all that remains is a formal declaration of guilty. Brushing aside the columns of irrelevant matter that has been written and spoken during the campaign, we find the people of Ontario have been principally impressed by these arguments: The Liberal party went to the country in 1896 on a platform of purity. The verdict of Ontario is that the party has not lived up to its pledges in this respect, but has actually eclipsed the record for political corruption in Canada. Nothing can be found in our past history to equal the scandals perpetrated by the Liberal leaders of the by-elections. The party promised to deal honestly with the people's domain and to husband their resources to the best advantage. One glaring example of the Government's sacrifice of our patrimony is their donation of lands and subsidies in connection with the Crow's Nest Railway. There was a line of 300 miles opening up the only gold fields tributary to the great Kootenay mine district. These gold fields, and practically the whole of them, were included in the bonus of the C.P.R. Thousands of shares of Crow's Nest gold stock was sold in Toronto yesterday at 200, showing that the actual cash value of a small portion of the land granted to the C.P.R. for building this 300 miles is four million dollars. The cash bonus amounts to \$300,000. Altogether the country has given the C.P.R. and its friends \$7,300,000 in cash, or its equivalent, for the building of these 300 miles of railway. It certainly did not cost the C.P.R. \$5,000,000 to build the line for which the country has already paid over \$7,000,000. The Government was warned of the mistake it was making in this deal, but it took no notice of the warning. Its sacrifice of the people's heritage is absolutely indefensible. Right in line with the Crow's Nest deal was the attempt to part with the best portion of the Yukon gold fields in connection with the proposed railway to that territory. Then we have the proposal to purchase the Drummond Carleton Railways from friends of the Government, at a figure largely in excess of the value of the line. The Government was blocked by the Senate from acquiring the property at the original figures and a very large sum was thereby saved to the country. But it is not only in regard to the holding of elections and the custody of the people's heritage that the Government has been found to be corrupt. It has violated its sacred pledge to uphold the sanctity of the independence of Parliament. During the four years of office the Government appointed 15 of its supporters in the House to positions of emolument. Scores of other changes have been made against the Government along these same lines, but we have cited and proved sufficient to convince the unprejudiced mind that Sir Wilfrid Laurier and his colleagues have not only lived up to their pledges of purity, but have far outdistanced their predecessors in corruption. The people of this province at least have become fully impressed with the Government's hypocrisy in its profession of superior virtue. In regard to the charge that the Government has been extravagant and has violated its pledges of economy, it might have been difficult to establish it if this charge had stood alone. But when it is taken in connection with the Government's squandering of the public heritage, with its brazen violation of the principle of parliamentary independence, with its practice of corrupt

THAT GOOD OLD DEFALTER.

Bank Officials Are Chagrined Because Alford Was Able to "Do" Them So Easily.

THE MAN'S WIFE IS HEARTBROKEN.

Some of His Friends Think He Has Committed Suicide—He Was a High Roller.

New York, Oct. 24.—Cornelius L. Alford, the defaulter of the First National Bank, has not yet been arrested, and it is said no news had been received of him. Mrs. Alford left her home in Mount Vernon and came to this city this morning. Several detectives guarded the Alford residence all night.

It was learned today that when the Alford went to Saratoga last summer they took with them all their horses and carriages. It took two cars to transport the outfit. The horses were blooded animals, and the vehicles were all of the latest and best design. One set of harness alone is said to have cost \$1500, and everything about the stable equipment was of the same class.

The Bank Officials Met. A meeting of the officers of the First National Bank was held this afternoon. It is thought that steps will be taken today or tomorrow to attach all property belonging to Alford which the bank officials can lay their hands on. Another step that will be taken immediately is the swearing out of a warrant before the United States court for the arrest of Alford. This is a matter of precaution in case Alford should have left the country.

Mrs. Alford is Heartbroken. D. P. Drury, president of the bank, has been heartbroken at my husband's actions. He never gave me a cent of the money he secured his money. I always understood that he secured a loan from the bank, and that he made large sums by speculation in Wall Street.

Officials Were Easily Fooled. W. G. Snow, a manufacturer of the bank who lives in Mount Clear, said that he had no authority to tell any of the details of the matter, but contained the money which was stolen from the bank.

Trusted Him Implicitly. We trusted Alford implicitly, and had not the least suspicion of him until last Thursday. On that day, while the bank examiner was inspecting our books, one of our clerks called our attention to a circumstance that made us suspicious of Alford.

The Bookkeeper Knew Him. A bookkeeper, well known to the traveling loungers, had the say of the traveling man's doings at Saratoga. The bookkeeper was a regular frequenter of the tracks. He was always accompanied by a woman with blonde hair, who wore a white veil which served to hide her features.

Alford's Wife. D. A. Davis, another traveler, made the statement that in Saratoga Alford was known as the Hon. Mr. Alford, the young son of an English earl.

Think He Has Succeeded. Many personal friends of Alford in Mount Vernon believe he has committed suicide. John H. Murphy, one of the bankers most intimate friends, said today that he firmly believed that Alford has taken his own life.

A Further Statement. The following supplementary statement was given out by the First National Bank this afternoon: "The case of Alford appears to have commenced about five years ago."
