

The Session meets on the first Tuesday of each month in the Vestry

The Weekly Prayer Meeting of the Congregation is held every Wednesday evening, at 7½ o'clock, in the Lecture Room.

The Ordinance of Baptism is dispensed on the first Wednesday of each month, at the Prayer Meeting, in the Lecture Room.

The Ordinance of the Lord's Supper is dispensed on the first Sabbaths in February, June and October.

The Sabbath School meets every Sabbath in the Lecture Room, at 2½ p.m. Bible Class meets in the Bible Class Room, at the same hour.

The Sabbath School Teachers meet on the first Monday in each month, at 7½ o'clock, in the Library.

The Committee of the Missionary Society and Collectors meet on the first Wednesday of each month, and a meeting of the congregation for prayer and the receiving of Missionary intelligence, is held on the same evening, at 7½ o'clock, in the Lecture Room.

The Deacons' Court and Managing Committee meet on the second Tuesday of each month, at 7½ o'clock, in the Library.

Pew Holders leaving the bounds, or giving up their sittings, are requested to give notice to the Pew-Secretary, in order that the seats may be re-let at once. Pew rent is payable quarterly, in advance, on 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October.

TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Deacon's Court and Managing Committee

OF

ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, LONDON,

FOR THE YEAR 1873.

The Deacon's Court and Managing Committee, in presenting the Twenty-third Annual Report to the Congregation, would desire to acknowledge the merciful kindness of God towards us, and for the blessings of peace and prosperity He has vouchsafed to us as a congregation.

As will be seen from the small amount paid for ministerial services, our Pastor has been able to attend to the pastoral duties with very little assistance.

The Treasurer's books have been audited and found correct, and an abstract of the receipts and disbursements for the year is annexed to this Report. It will be seen that the income for the year 1873 is about equal to that of 1872, as appears from appendix A.

Your Committee have to regret that there is a very large sum due for pew rents. This should not be the case, as provision is made whereby those not able to pay have their pews free on application to the Committee, through the Pew Secretary.

Your Committee would respectfully draw attention to the rules whereby the Pew Secretary is authorized to remove the tickets from pews nine months in arrears.

It is impossible to meet the demands made on the congregation unless the pew rents are punctually paid.

You will observe that of the large amount still due on the Building Fund subscriptions, as shown in last Report, only *five* dollars have been paid, and your Committee would desire the congregation to say whether it would not be as well to cancel it, and that no reference be made to it in future reports.

Your Committee would call your attention to the fact that several *prominent* members of the congregation have not yet subscribed to the Building Fund. It is to be hoped that they will see it to be their *duty* to do so now.

Your Committee regret to state that some of the subscriptions towards the building of the sheds have not been paid, even by parties who use them every Sabbath.

Circumstances over which your Committee had no control, deterred them from soliciting subscriptions for the reduction of the debt on the Church, as authorized by the congregation last year, consequently we have given a second mortgage to the Huron and Erie Savings and Loan Society, thereby withdrawing our floating debt. The Church property is now mortgaged for the sum of \$11,500, and the yearly interest is \$945.00, to assist in paying which we recommend that the quarterly collections be continued.

According to the rules of the congregation, six managers retire annually, and those whose term of office now expire are :
