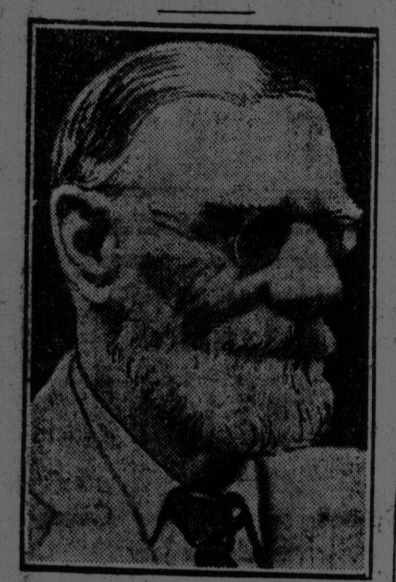

## CONSERVATIVES ARE RESTIVE IN SHADOW OF RECURRING SCANDALS

Demand That Campaign Corruption Shall Be Exposed In Open Court

**CALL ON PREMIER BORDEN**

Urge Him to Fulfill Promises and Put Civic Service Under Commission—Even "Tory Toronto" is Becoming Impatient Over the Business

(Montreal, Mail) Ottawa, Nov. 16—If the government listens to the councils of the better elements in its own party, there will be legislation at the approaching session, not only to compel the publication of all contributions to election funds, but also to appoint special officers to see that election scandals and corruptions are fully exposed in the courts rather than covered up and to end the wretched patronage system by placing in Macdonald's hands all the civil service outside as well as inside, under the Civil Service Commission.

Staunch supporters of the government, who are, however, not absolute slaves to party, are rapidly confessing their disgust with present conditions in regard to these matters, and are openly calling on Premier Borden and his government to carry out the program for ensuring, as far as possible, clean government and honest elections.

Even from "Tory Toronto" comes a strong expression of impatience on the part of some who are in sympathy with the government at the smothering-up of the election crookedness in Macdonald's election which probably involved both sides.

"The whole system is unsatisfactory," we are told, "the courts are too ready to acquiesce in agreements between rival politicians. We need to enforce publicity for electoral subscriptions. We should stop legislating for the sources from which the heaviest contributions proceed. We require public officers to ensure that when wholesale corruption is practiced it will be exposed."

Another voice from eastern Ontario, largely in sympathy with the government, refers to the voiding of the Macdonald-by-election and adds: "Until the country demands publicity of campaign funds there is little to be gained by protesting against corrupt elections."

Say Patronage System Vicious

A short time ago, when the evidence regarding past management of Kingston penitentiary was published there was also a demand from an important section of the Conservative party that Mr. Borden should carry out that part of his Halifax platform calling for placing the whole civil service under the Civil Service Commission and thus abolishing the manifest evils of the patronage system which was such a serious handicap to efficient government.

And now, in connection with the dismissal of the Scotch postmaster, this confusion is heard from a Conservative source: "Without passing on the merits of this particular case we agree that the whole patronage system is vicious. Let an united by continuous appeal and argument to secure a permanent, non-partisan service."

It rests with the government to say whether this "constant appeal" should be kept up indefinitely or whether party expediency shall give place to principle and the fulfillment of solemn pledges to the people of Canada.

**PROFIT SHARING MIGHT HALT STRIKE, SAYS ELIOT**

Boston, Nov. 16—Profit sharing "seems" to afford the only way out of an intolerable condition of industrial strife" in the opinion of President Emeritus Charles W. Eliot of Harvard university.

"Democracy, plus the wage system, has produced a state of affairs in this country which is intolerable," he said, in addressing the Club of Printing House craftsmen here.

"The two great forces of capital and labor are organized into hostile camps, both grown strong. Something fundamental in its nature must be done to relieve the situation. The only way to bring efficiency to give the same motives to both capital and labor. Profit sharing will make every man take an interest in his work."

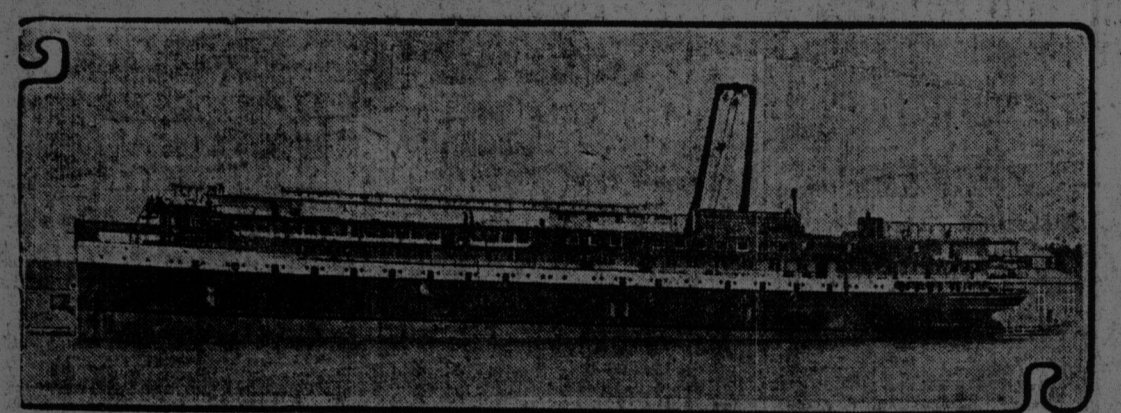

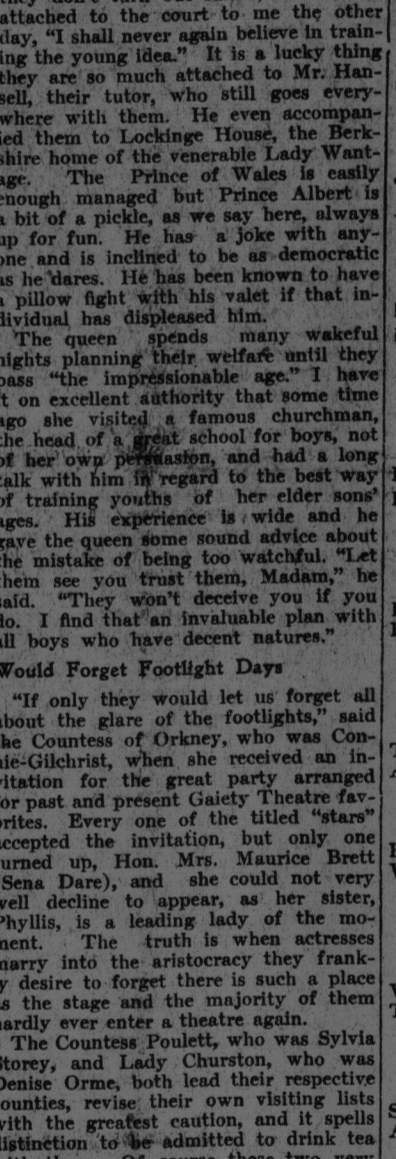

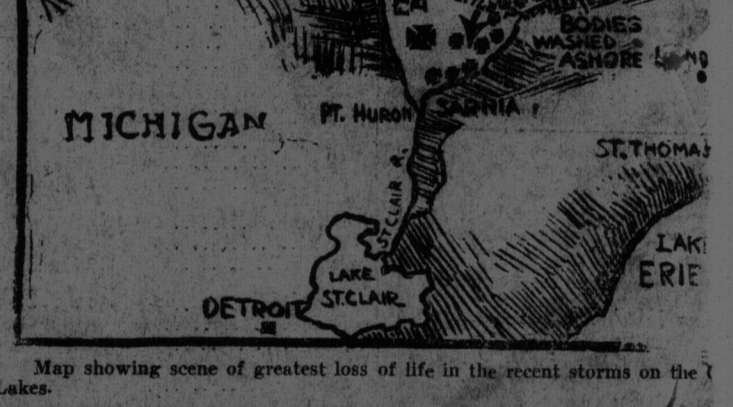

FATHER HOGAN IS TO STAY SOME TIME AT ST. PETER'S Solemn Closing of Men's Mission Renewal Took Place Last Evening. Although during the services of the last week, it was hardly thought possible that a greater number of men could have crowded into St. Peter's church, yet last evening, when the solemn closing of the renewal of the mission took place, it really seemed as though the attendance was larger than of any night. It was even necessary to find seats in the sanctuary. The mission renewal has been a remarkable success. It was an edifying sight yesterday morning at the 7:30 o'clock mass to see the general communion of the men who had made the renewal. The church was filled almost entirely with men, and practically every one of them received Holy Communion. At last evening's service, Rev. Father Hogan, C. S. S. R., delivered an able sermon, and at the close conducted the renewal of the baptismal vows. He also gave the missionary and papal blessing, and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. The rector of the parish, Rev. Father McCormick, C. S. S. R., also spoke, expressing his pleasure at the success of the renewal, and the hope that it would be most effective and lasting in its results. Solemn benediction was conducted by Rev. Father Hogan, assisted by Rev. Fathers Walsh and Borgmann. An announcement which has been received with great pleasure is that Rev. Father Hogan will be stationed for some time in St. Peter's rectory, for he has made many friends here during his mission work. CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATIONS In the civil service examinations which were held by the Centennial school last week, twenty-eight candidates presented themselves for the preliminary examination and ten for the qualifying, while in the more advanced subjects for the inside service only two wrote the papers. With regard to the latter examination these who pass the papers successfully are eligible, according to their standing for positions as stenographers, etc., in the departments of the government service at Ottawa and it is thought rather extraordinary that there should be so few candidates for these positions from St. John in comparison to those from the other large cities of the Dominion. The minimum salary for such positions in the inside service is \$800 and the average salary is much higher. Rev. Dr. W. O. Raymond conducted the examination and the results will probably be announced about the middle of next month.
